Dear Parishioner,

Cardinal Joseph Bernardin Catholic School's four sponsoring parishes are joining together for our third "RAISE THE ROOF" fundraiser and party on June 15, 2018. Now for our third year we will gather for another great event - to have some fun and to raise some funds.

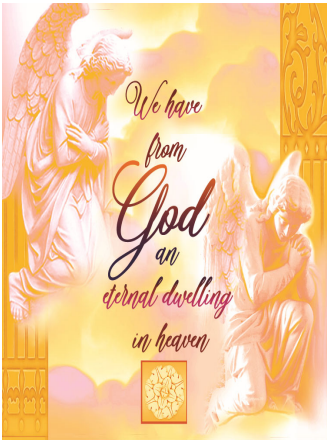

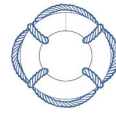

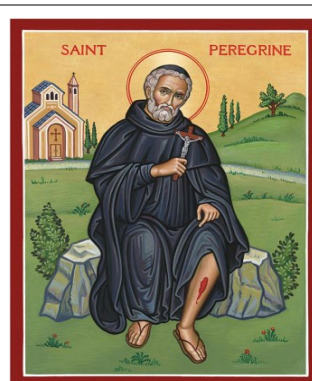

# Adult Faith Formation

## AROUND FOR AWHILE *By, Fr. Ed Upton*

For many years Religious Education classes were held in District 135 schools; each session began with the children gathered in the cafeteria.

This was done for two reasons. First, the children were not allowed to walk to a classroom unattended; so they gathered in the cafeteria with their catechist and then proceed to their individual rooms when all were present and prayer completed.

Secondly, this gathering provided the opportunity to begin each session with communal prayer. A reading from Scripture, a few words of reflection, and then shared prayer. This prayer time, brief as it was, was a challenge because we were in a cafeteria.

At times, the portable sound system did not work, the lunch benches where the children sat were awkward, and the environment was not conducive for prayer.

I remember before leading prayer, praying silently that someday we would have a more conducive place to pray.

So, when the Center was being planned, including a chapel was a goal. While we wanted this to be a “Children’s Chapel”, we also realized that it would be used by others; we wanted to maintain design elements that would be appropriate for multiple use and participants.

While an elevator is in the building, the ordinary entrance to the chapel is reached by using the stairs. The staircase was deliberately designed to be the focal point of the entrance; the stairs are beautifully designed; and clearly indicate they lead to an important place.

In the first floor entrance, under the staircase, there is a large

“planter”. This holds live plants, a real tree and a water feature. This tree is the “**tree of life**”, reminding all who enter that what takes place in this building brings life. As the development of the chapel was discussed and planned, “tree of life” became a theme for the chapel.

When you arrive at the landing on the second floor, and, if turn around, you will see a beautiful icon, painted just for our space, hanging on the wall. And, of course, most visible on the down walk.

The artist, Joe Melham, is a professional iconographer who has a studio at St. Gregory the Great Parish, Chicago. He visited the space to acquire an understanding of the space.

Since there is a skylight over the stairs, the icon of Jesus is clearly visible. This image of Jesus is one of a number of religious images placed



around the Center to create a religious atmosphere and to remind the children of the many dimensions of faith.

The entrance to the chapel is delineated by two flowing holy water fonts. These are placed at the door for an obvious reason: to teach and remind the children of their Baptism and to make the sign of the cross as they enter and leave the chapel.

The chapel itself is elliptical in shape; with chairs. The chapel has an altar

and ambo; a tabernacle and a room for private reconciliation. Stations of the Cross are on the walls. A statue of the Blessed

Virgin is also in the sanctuary. There is a small electronic organ and a set of hand bells.



## PROMISES

Today's liturgy is full of promises. The reading from Genesis promises a final triumph over the power of sin and a return to a new creation. The reading from Second Corinthians promises that all who follow Christ will have to struggle. It also promises, however, that we can persevere if we but recognize that Christ is within us, renewing us daily, and giving us the courage and the strength we need to endure. The Gospel promises that doing God's will makes us "family" with Jesus, who forgives all sin and triumphs over evil.

Today might be a good day for us to make some promises as well. We can promise to stop kidding ourselves about our own tendencies to selfishness and sin. We can promise ourselves to believe--really believe--that while we are not sinless, we are forgiven. We can promise ourselves to combat evil and sin by acting as sisters and brothers not only to the Lord, but to one another as well.

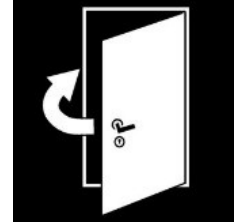

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a "big church," as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a cathedra (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop.

There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals

are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that "the seat is vacant," and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the cathedra. No one but the bishop

sits in the cathedra during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the cathedra in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when

a visitor tries the cathedra out for the bishop's point of view.
