Central Kansas Free Fair July 30-August 4

It will be an adventure for the entire family at the Central Kansas Free Fair and Wild Bill Hickok Rodeo in Abilene. The rodeo and fair will be held

at the fairgrounds in Abilene July 30-August 4.

The fair gets under way on Wednesday, July 30 with a thrilling evening of PRCA bullriding in the arena.

Thursday starts off with the evaluation of exhibits at 8 a.m. It will begin with the judging of 4-H foods and nutrition, rabbits and

horticulture projects. The horse show will start at 8:30 a.m. The biggest event of the day will be the annual western parade getting under way at 5 p.m., followed by Country Showdown on the free stage and the first rodeo performance beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Friday morning the livestock shows kicks off with

the beef show including both youth and open classes at 8 a.m. The breeding sheep classes will take place at 3 p.m. followed by the Shepherd's Lead contest will be held at 5 p.m. The market lamb show will conclude the evening. Entertainment for the evening will be a Wild Bill Hickok professional rodeo performance. A rodeo dance is slated after the show at the Elks Lodge.

Saturday morning kicks off with the swine show at 8 a.m., followed by the meat and dairy goat shows at 10:30 a.m. The dairy cattle show will be at 1 p.m. The popular bucket calf classes will be at 5:30 p.m.

The open class baking competition will take place at 2 p.m. on Saturday. The recipe must be sub-

mitted. Cash awards provided by the Central Kansas Free Fair Association are 1st-\$25; 2nd-\$15; 3rd-\$10

The final rodeo performance is slated for Saturday evening. It will begin at 7:30 p.m. with a rodeo dance following at the Elks Club.

Sunday morning, a cowboy church service at the rose garden at 8:30 a.m. The open horse show classes will also be held. The top livestock showmen will go head-to-head in the round robin contest at 4 p.m. A youth pedal pull is planned for 6:30 p.m.

Evening entertainment will feature combine demo derby and compact figure eight races starting at 7:30 p.m. The first of two nights of demolition derby action

will be featured in the grandstand starting at 7:30 p.m.

On Monday, August 4, the final full day of the fair, livestock exhibitors will be rewarded for their year of hard work as the premium auction begins at 9 a.m..

Tuesday evening will close out the fair with a second demolition derby at 7:30 p.m.

A carnival will be on the grounds throughout the fair.

A full slate of fun activities is on tap for the 2008 Geary County Fair at the fairgrounds south of Junction City July 21-23.

Monday, July 21, will find many of the exhibits being brought to the fairgrounds west of Highway 77. Projects of all kinds from baked goods to clothing construction will be evaluated. Tuesday through Thursday an old-fashioned ice cream social will provide a sweet treat from 4-8 p.m.

Little fair-goers can compete in a pedal pull at 7:30 p.m. on Monday.

There are many project evaluations going on during Tuesday as 4-H members present their work. The dairy show, including cattle and goats begins at 3 p.m.

Bucket calf competition starts at 4 p.m. with the individual interviews, The beef show will wind up the evening starting at 7 p.m. with the bucket calf classes. Entertainment for the evening will be a showing of the movie "Open Season" outdoors, starting at 9 p.m.

Wednesday will feature more livestock shows with the Shepherd's Lead at 4 p.m. and the sheep show following. The evening will be capped off with the swine show at 7 p.m. Additional entertainment for the evening will a session of Barnyard Olympics at 9 p.m.

Thursday, the final day of the fair will include the round robin livestock showmanship contest at 9 a.m. The 4-H barbecue and watermelon feed will be held from 4:30-6:30 p.m. followed by the annual auction of 4-H livestock at 6:30 p.m.

Activities for the annual Morris County Fair kick off on Tuesday, July 22, and run through Monday, July 28, at the fairgrounds east of Council Grove, according to recently named fair secretary Nicky Tiffany.



Clothing construction judging will be July 22, at 8:30 a.m., with buymanship evaluation at 1 p.m. The public 4-H fashion revue and talent showcase are to begin at 7 p.m., in the Council Grove High School Auditorium. Judging of 4-H cat projects begins at 9 a.m., Wednesday, July 23, and the dog show will be at 1 p.m., followed by a dog agility demonstration. Fairgrounds cleanup and setup are in the evening, with inside building 4-H and open class entries also accepted.

Additional entries are to be accepted Friday morning, July 25, with judging of most inside building entries throughout the afternoon. Rabbit and poultry evaluations are also planned. Auc-

tion of foods exhibits is at 5 p.m., with the swine show to immediately follow.

Dairy cattle, dairy goat, sheep and meat goat shows begin at 8:30 a.m., Saturday, July 26. A pedal tractor pull is at 12:30 p.m. Bucket calves are to be evaluated at 5:30, and the beef show starts at 6:30 p.m.

Sunday, July 27, kicks off with the Morris County 4-H Council fundraiser breakfast at 8 a.m., and the community church service at the fairgrounds starts at 9 a.m. A 4-H and open horse show will begin at 10 a.m. There will be a swimming party in the evening.

Round robin showmanship is the Monday morning, July 28, highlight, with a livestock judging contest at

noon. Barnyard Olympics begin at 3 p.m. Buyer appreciation supper starts at 6 p.m., with awards presentations at 7 p.m., and the annual livestock auction begins at 7:30 p.m.

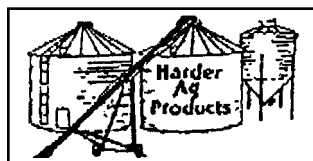
Entertainment for the night is a musical performance by "Jolly Rodgers" and the Hot Rod Tractor and

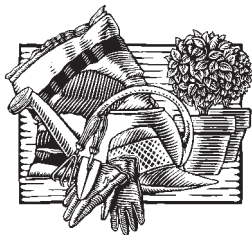

Yard & Garden Tips

Vegetable Gardening Again

In the heat of the summer it may be hard to get enthused about vegetable gardening. The higher cost of food has turned some to vegetable gardening. July is the time to prepare for our second chance to grow cool season crop vegetables.

Beans, cabbage, carrots, broccoli, cauliflower, potatoes, and beets are planted in July for later harvest. In late August, lettuce, radishes, spinach and turnips can be planted. With these choices along with harvest

of summer crops, a lot of good food can still be produced in the garden before the growing season comes to an end.

Some of these crops are directly planted. Beans, carrots, potatoes and beets are planted in the garden slightly deeper than spring planting. The soil is slightly cooler and more moisture for germination will be available deeper in the soil.

Potato seed is harder to locate at this time. I have some left from the spring

planting. The seed has been resting in the refrigerator. It is going to be nice to have that space back. The seed pieces need cut 3 to 4 days early so that they won't turn to mush in the warm soil.

Cabbage, broccoli, and

cauliflower are usually put in the garden as transplants. Local retail outlets will have some for planting. Or you can start your own indoors. The best plants are short and stocky. Lots of light and cool temperatures are needed to produce these plants.

Insects have been my biggest challenge to fall gardening. They enjoy eating the tender new growth. A good way to avoid this is to use the floating row cover to put a barrier between the young plants and the hungry pests.

Water is required for germination and growth.

Keep the soil moist for starters and when the young plants need it. A nitrogen fertilizer will also be helpful to speed up growth.

It may be hard to be motivated to garden when it is hot out. But when September and October come, you'll be glad you did.

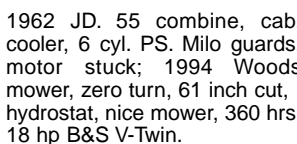

NetWork Kansas announces 2008 E-community partnership


