A Cup of Joe

It's been quite the week...I've learned a tremendous amount and am moving right along. I am grateful to be a part of two such loving, welcoming Parish Families.

I wanted to share with you a couple of thoughts for this week.

I've been a priest 20 years now and one of the most important things happened to me about 11 years ago. I was in a spot where I was really struggling with the demands: trying hard to keep up and get everything done that was asked of me and I found that, no matter how hard I pushed, I was perpetually behind.



I went to the Cathedral in Lansing to take some time to pray and saw that there were priests hearing confessions and I went in. Fr. Jeff Njus was there and, as I shared my sins, I also poured out my sorrow to him; my frustrations, my limitations, etc.

He spoke very gently, but very clearly to me and reminded me of a simple truth: as a priest, I have one job that supercedes all others and that job is to be holy. He reminded me of that beautiful, simple truth that Jesus gave us in Matthew: "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all other things will be added to you."

I've never forgotten that and try very hard to live it with all my sinfulness and struggles: Be holy. Grow closer to Jesus everyday. Listen to the Lord, follow Him and God will lead me in what I need to do and not do.

The gift that Fr. Njus gave me, I now give to you with a full heart: be holy and let God take care of the rest.

By holy, I mean to be close to Jesus and the joy that He offers. Pray every chance you get and see every irritation as an invitation to pray.

We've got so many wonderful things to experience together...I just can't wait.

As space allows, I try to remind people of upcoming saints, so I'll do that here.

This week, we celebrate St. Ignatius of Loyola on Tuesday and St. John Vianney on Saturday. These are two extraordinary saints and I recommend you get some info on them. I'll close with one of my favorite St. John Vianney quotes:

"If when I die, I find that God does not exist, I will have been well-fooled. But I would still not regret having spent my life believing in love."

God bless you all. Thank you for letting me be your priest.

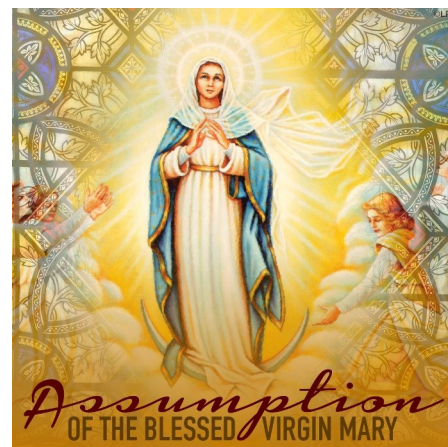
Rosary - Knights of Columbus

Bishop Baraga Pilgrimage

While on vacation in the Upper Peninsula last month, my husband and I stopped at a couple of the Bishop Baraga locations that were advertised earlier in our parish bulletin.

First stop was Sault Ste. Marie and St. Mary's Church. This parish was established in 1668 and is the third oldest Catholic Parish in the U.S. The current church building was built in 1881.

In 1857, when the Upper Peninsula was separated from the Diocese of Detroit, Reverend Frederic Baraga from L'anse was named Bishop of the Sault and St. Mary's became the Cathedral. Later as the mining industry grew in the western Upper Peninsula, Bishop Baraga obtained permission to move the diocese to Marquette.

This church has a little museum in the back with items from Bishop Baraga, including his Bishop's chair. There is a hall off the church that has a stained glass window of our Lady of Sorrows that was in the original cathedral and was ordered by Bishop Baraga from Belgium.

Across the street and a few doors down is the home of Bishop Baraga. We were a little too early in the season to be able to tour it.

Another location nearby is a church on Sugar Island. You have to take a short ride on a car ferry to cross over to the island. The church there is Holy Angels Catholic Church constructed by Bishop Baraga in 1856-57. The church closed in 1953, but is now a historic site and a Mass is held annually on Bishop Baraga's birthday.

Second day trip was to Manistique. We stopped at St. Francis de Sales parish. They have a stained glass window of Bishop Baraga among windows of other saints. This is the location to pick up the pilgrimage card. We also obtained directions to the church at Indian Lake which was a little hard to find.

At Indian Lake there is the site of the first church Baraga established in 1832 with the help of local Indians. The building is a replica. You cannot go inside, but we were able to take photos through the clear glass windows.

We hope to visit more of the pilgrimage locations later.

Over 70 Middle and High School students participated in our 7th annual week of service. Students started their day at 8 a.m. and ended at 8 p.m. During this time they departed for various work sites at 9 a.m. and returned by 3:30 p.m. We worked at Catholic Charities, North End Soup Kitchen, Catholic Charities Camp for children, American House, Brookdale Senior Center, Woodhaven Senior Community, Christ the King, St. John Vianney and various parishioner's homes. Some of the work they did is as follows:

- Repaired a retaining wall at Holy Family and installed a drainage system
- Spread 50 yards of mulch at Holy Family's playground and angel garden
- Served and prepared lunches at various soup kitchens
- Did clean up work at Christ the King Parish
- Spread 40 yards of mulch at St. John Vianney
- Visited American House, Brookdale Senior Center, Maple Place Senior Center and Woodhaven Senior Community
- Rebuilt a wheelchair ramp at a parishioner's home
- Worked at Catholic Charities Camp located at Our Lady of Guadalupe and even took the kids attending the camp to For-Mar Nature Preserve for a field trip

When students returned from their worksites, they enjoyed some free time followed by team-building games, reflections and small group work. They ate all their meals together and then had time for Adoration and Reconciliation - thanks to Deacon Larry, Fr. Dan and Fr. Joe.

On Tuesday the Rosarymakers came in and provided all the material and directions (with help) for all our students to make rosaries that were then blessed by Deacon Larry at Adoration.

On Wednesday Dana George came and led students in a splatter paint project which all enjoyed!

These young people represented our parish in the community and worked hard! They exemplified what it means to serve with a joyful heart and were truly the hands and feet of Christ.

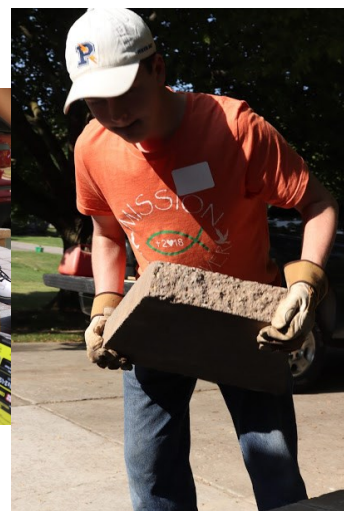

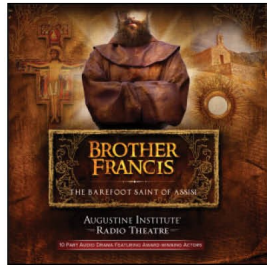

Trash Bags

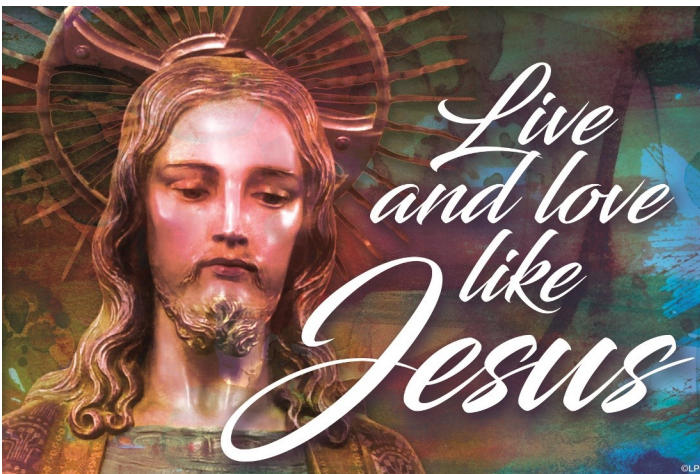
