
Fort Bend Education Foundation funds grant for Kempner High School's Go Center

The Kempner High School Go Center was established in the fall of 2009. The primary goal of the Go Center is to develop a college-going culture in our school. It was designed to be a resource for our students and staff. The Go Center provides a centralized location for the dissemination of college and career information.

Our students' journey to higher education begins in the Kempner High School Counseling Office. There, students learn more about the steps they need to take in order to

enroll in college. Students are then referred to the Go Center for specific information.

Using concepts from the AVID Program and Achieve Texas, the Go Center provides several services to our students. Students



can acquire information about their future in a variety of ways such as viewing presentations and reading literature. Students have access to computers so that they may research information and complete applications online. Students and families can find a variety of free brochures and financial planning tools in the Go Center.

The Kempner High School Go Center would not exist without the generosity of the Fort Bend

Education Foundation. The Foundation awarded a *school site grant* for the Go Center. The money was used to purchase AV equipment, books, and other materials to support the vision of the Go Center. Thanks to the **Fort Bend Education Foundation**, a visit to the Go Center is a dynamic event.

Who decides how the money is spent?

The Foundation's Allocation Committee is responsible for the solicitation, review, and acceptance of proposals for projects and programs that will improve and enrich classroom education.

Since its inception, the Education Foundation had awarded over **\$3 million** to Fort Bend ISD teachers and schools.

Where does the money go?

Every school in Fort Bend ISD benefits from the Fort Bend Education Foundation grant programs that train teachers, provide equipment, and offer new instructional experiences to students of all ages. Each year, hundreds of grant proposals are submitted to the Education Foundation. Each proposal undergoes an extensive review process. The number of grants awarded depends upon the amount of money raised through the Education Foundation's annual fundraising events.

2010-2011 Results

- Over \$250,372 was awarded in grants to teachers and schools for the 2010-2011 school year.
- 131 teachers beginning their teaching career received an Angel Gift from the Foundation for a total of \$19,650.
- 143 grants were awarded through our Grants for Teachers and Schools Program.
- Every school in Fort Bend ISD was impacted by the Foundation's programs.
- Continue to grow our endowment, ensuring we can fund future innovative education opportunities.
