NOTES FROM FR. TOM

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM

When we started Lent, there was a goal in mind. Here we are. The goal of our Lenten Season is Holy Week, especially the celebration of the Triduum. The word "Triduum" is Latin, meaning "Three Days." We celebrate over the course of three days, one liturgy. The Triduum starts on Holy Thursday night with the "Mass of the Lord's Supper." There is no end to this Mass, no final blessing, no conclusion. We take up where we left off, at the Good Friday liturgy, "Friday of the Passion of the Lord." There is no sign of the cross to begin this liturgy and no formal conclusion either. On this day we are in the heart of the heart of our Triduum experience. The following day is Holy Saturday and "The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night." There is no formal beginning to this liturgy because we take up where we left off the previous evening. We conclude the Easter Vigil having passed over (or Passover) into Easter Day. The Triduum concludes with the Liturgy of the Hours: Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Which leads us to celebrate the Easter Octave (meaning, "eight"), in which we celebrate Easter Day over the next eight days which leads us into the fifty day Easter Season. The Triduum – one liturgy, that begins Holy Thursday night and ends on Easter Sunday night, a total of three days.

HOLY THURSDAY, MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

This Mass is not just about us entering into history. This is not just about us reenacting Jesus' Last Supper. Primarily, this Mass is about a mystery entering into us and enlivening us even more so, with Jesus' self-gift of his whole being – body, blood, soul, and divinity – in the Eucharist. This self-gift of life and love transforms us tonight and every Sunday. This night the mystery of Discipleship as a life of service – not power or self-importance – is shown through the washing of the feet and the ministerial Priesthood being established.

GOOD FRIDAY. THE PASSION OF THE LORD

This day is not Jesus' funeral. We call today "good." We do so for a reason. Today is not an end or a loss. Today is a victory and a gain. The Son of God is freely rejected, accused, sentenced, and is executed on the cross. To the foolish this is foolishness. However, to the Christian this is life. In the midst of it all, Jesus does not think of himself. Over and over again he is always thinking of and loving the ones around him. He is making sure their needs are met. Two crossed beams of wood make the cross: the vertical beam represents the "I," and the horizontal beam cancels the "I" out. The cross is a triumph of humanity getting over itself. The cross stands as a triumph that we no longer have to live in a lie of egotistical self-sufficiency. The cross cancels the "I" out so that a savior can reach into our lives and truly set us free. In being free, we come to know God's will. Good Friday is God's victory over ourselves and a victory to help us defeat our disordered choice for sin and sins deadly effects.

HOLY SATURDAY, THE EASTER VIGIL IN THE HOLY NIGHT

This Holy Night is a play between light and darkness, silence and speaking, reflection and action. This is not about history, but it is about allowing the Mystery to enter our lives. We must start at night, in order to bless fire as a rebellion against the darkness of our times. We sing to the Easter Candle, the Christ Candle – work of bees and made of human hands – to allow the fire of Christ to burn as He greets the Morning Star. We read the ongoing story of our salvation. Time and time again, when we humans got it wrong, God comes to lift up, push through, carry over, and save us from ourselves and the powers of the Enemy. Then we empty out the tombs of our unbelief, we empty out the graves of our deadly living and recommit ourselves to the one who is Life itself.

This is what Catholics throughout the world do to be joined together in a world-wide, faith community during this holy time.

As these young people act out each Station, you will witness and experience the emotions felt by those who walked with Christ as he was led to his death on the Cross. This will truly be an inspiring experience for all ages and will be a wonderful entrance to Holy Week.



NAVIGATOR NEWS FROM THE SCHOOL

More Science Fair Success – Congratulations 8th grader Elijah Molseed and 7th grader Owen Pry, both of whom received Superior ratings at the District Science Day. Their projects will now advance to the state competition!

Junior High Retreat Day – Last month, the 6 – 8th grades enjoyed a retreat day led by members of the St. Edward High School Student Ministry team. The day was filled with prayer, reflections, an inner look at what it means to be a friend, and team building exercises. Roles were even reversed when the St. Ed's students join our students for the junior high-led Stations of the Cross.

7th Grade Cross Curricular Medieval Projects – Mr. Noah Patera's 7th grade Social Studies class has been learning about the Middle Ages (i.e., Medieval Times). In a cross curricular assignment with their Technology class, the students designed medieval villages, buildings, structures or the like using TinkerCAD, a 3-D modeling and design website. The class then transferred the TinkerCAD files to an OBJ file and printed them on the 3D printers. In the process, they learned how to scale the projects down to minimize the actual print time.

120th Day of First Grade – On March 22nd Mrs. Olivia Kostecke's class celebrated the 120th Day of First Grade! In preparation for the day, the students all made posters at home of a "120 Day Collection" and brought them in to share. In class, they drew themselves on the 120th day of 1st grade and as they would look at 120 years old. The class then compared the two pictures. The students also counted, sorted, and recorded fruit loops by making a 120 Gumball Machine.
