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### SHOPPING ELECTRICITY?



The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission has published the fact that they expect electricity rates in Penelec to increase by as much as 22% beginning January 1, 2011. If you shop for an alternate provider for your electric service, you

will be able to eliminate a substantial portion of this expected increase.

If you have the resources and expertise, this is a task that you can take on yourself.

Alternatively, you may want to consider help from a licensed consultant or company experienced in this field. consultants work very similar to your insurance broker, collecting their fee/commission only if they find you a rate that you are happy with and you sign a contract.

When interviewing a consultant, you should: 1) check for experience in the industry, 2) ask what their commission will be, 3) choose a local company with local presence, and 4) verify that they are licensed with the PA PUC.

The industry is flooded with telemarketers and fly by-night companies that are looking to make a quick buck. We recommend that you find a company and individuals that you trust and know will be there in the future.

### SPOTLIGHT ON NEW MEMBERS: ALLY'S ART IN THE TRANSIT



It is indeed a treat to wander into the studio of Alice Walkowski, the owner of Ally's Art, located in the National Transit Building in downtown Oil City. You are immediately struck by the display of handcrafted metal clay jewelry, each piece unique. Stepping into the actual studio, you may find Alice busy at work on her next piece or the seats around her table filled with students learning how to craft their own special work of art. Either way, you are always encouraged to step up and take a closer look while hearing an explanation of how the precious metals are transformed.

Alice, an art teacher with the Oil City School District for 35 years, retired in 2006 and wasted little time moving on to her next career. She explains that her first love of art was always about the teaching, but

remarks that creating her own art was a close second. Always ready to explore the variety of art concentrations, Alice did not describe herself as being dedicated to any particular medium. One of the things that attracted her to metal clay was how new this process was, first developed in the early 1990s. Metal clay consists of very small particles of metals (such as silver, gold, or copper) mixed with an organic binder and water. Alloys such as bronze are also available. Metal clay can be shaped just like any soft clay, by using a variety of ceramic and sculptural techniques. After drying, it can be fired in a variety of ways including in a kiln or with a handheld gas torch. The binder burns away, leaving the pure metal.

While teaching herself about this new craft, Alice set up a studio in her home. It was by surprise that she discovered the studios at the Transit. This new larger space provided plenty of room for teaching, space for her kiln and many tools and a perfect display area. Additional benefits include the camaraderie of the other artists and the marketing of the Arts in the Transit, which provides good traffic through her business.

Classes are available per a set schedule or by request, to groups or individuals of all ages. Metal Clay is rather expensive, but the tools used are likely to be available right in your own home. For those who aren't so creative, Ally's Art has an extensive selection of finished jewelry, including pendants, rings, bracelets, earrings, tie tacks, etc. Alice is always happy to make custom pieces and can incorporate items like gemstones, beads and sea glass. Previously commissioned works include jewelry for Foxburg, PA and items for individuals. Chamber members may consider having Alice create a piece designed to represent their business or organization.

Alice is certified by PMC Connection and Rio Grande and has taken classes in NC, GA, FL, TN as well as Pennsylvania. She will be one of the artists participating in the Oil Heritage Festival Artisan and Fine Craft Fair on Friday and Saturday, July 23th and 24<sup>th</sup>. Ally's Art is open on the second Saturday of each month, from noon-5pm and most Thursdays from noon-8pm. While often in her studio at additional times, Alice encourages that you call if you would like to be sure to catch her in. Ally's Art, in Studio 26C is on the second floor of the National Transit Building, just before you cross into the annex. 


