



# 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Saint Eulalia Parish - Winchester/Arlington



Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Eulalia Parish,

After mom's death, I had received quite a few phone calls from friends who tried to extend their condolences to me. One common thing I learned from the conversations is this: I do not know what to say to you because you are a priest. You have done many funerals and you know everything about death. Really? Do I know everything about death? Despite their presumptions, what really comforted me was not what they said to me but their understanding of a person who just lost a loved one, and their shared experiences of moving beyond those pains and agonies in dealing with death. Connecting our own experiences with the suffering Christ, we then are able to appreciate the importance of our faith in God. Understanding and knowledge in a person's life are two very different things. I am merely a finite person with faith in need of God's help.

This week's readings provide us an opportunity to understand the power of God through people's faith, instead of the knowledge of those people's life stories. At age of 75, Abraham heard God's calling and set out to an unknown land for future inheritance. Although he had some doubts about his future son promised by God because of his age and his wife's age, he never lacked faith in God. Through praying, working and welcoming three strangers (the Three persons of God) into his tent and offering them the best banquet, His son Isaac was born. The leper (Fri.) risked his life by coming through the crowd to Jesus and was healed. He said the most beautiful words *Lord, if you wish, you can make me clean* (Mt 8:2). The Centurion in the gospel of Saturday came to Jesus to ask for the healing of his servant who was paralyzed and suffering dreadfully. Knowing his own power and authority, he said to Jesus: *Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof* (Mt 8:8). The story of a synagogue official's daughter's death and coming back to life and the widow's cure of her hemorrhages reminds us of the power of God in Jesus who is Lord and healer.

Friends, we might have accumulated a lot in life: wealth, prestige, power, knowledge, and having a good family. If we do not understand that all these are not our own but the glory of God, then we cannot give thanks to God wholeheartedly. Neither can we come to church willingly and happily to worship God. Jesus indeed is the way, the truth and the life. The Psalm (139) has it, *the Lord gives and the Lord takes away*. Saint Anselm of Canterbury has a famous saying, *Faith seeks understanding*, which means the faith in God revealed in Jesus Christ prompts a questioning search for deeper understanding. This summer, with the lifting of the pandemic rule, we all can travel to places and meet people. Knowing the great losses and pains we have had last year during the pandemic, we understand the tremendous blessings God has bestowed upon each one of us. We are alive and well!

## THE UNBROKEN WORD.....BY MICHAEL CUNNINGHAM

During the Covid-19 crisis, it has been hard for us to keep in contact with family. One such situation for me is my relationship with my granddaughter, who lives in northern New Hampshire.

She calls me two or three times a week to play hide and seek, yes, hide and seek, on the phone, with a video call. Sofia is now four years old, and she calls me and hides from me just like we were together and playing the game in person. Depending on who is hiding, we will count down or up to 20 (she misses a few on the 20 counts) and then comes looking for me. At my end, my wife operates as if Sophia is seeking me, bringing the phone round to various parts of the house and the garden in Southern California, trying to find out my location. Sometimes, this can take as long as 5 minutes, adding to the excitement for Sophia. At the other end, when it's my turn, I count and then tell Sophia that I'm coming to find her. She always stays out of view on her phone mode for a few minutes until I start asking where on earth she could be. Eventually, she gives up and giggles to herself, moments later popping up on the screen with a giant smile.

She never tires at the game, and if I allowed, would play this for hours.

Thinking about this simple game makes me feel so warm and close to her. Each time she gets close to me, but never really leaves me. She is always full of joy as she rediscovers my presence and her presence close to me. Celebrating our togetherness and love for each other, for her it is a complete joy, for me, it can be a superficial game after the tenth time. But it is not.

How much could we learn from this simple game of discovery and rediscovery to each other? How much do we take each other's presence for granted? It is recognizing the missing of each other that is important here. If I take the fun out of the game, then there is nothing, for the love or desire to be together is not recognized as necessary. We do not celebrate each other in relationships.



Do we play hide and seek in our marriages and other relationships when one wants to play and celebrate our togetherness and the other holds back or does not recognize that behavior for what it is?

Something to consider. I am sure I have played hide and seek with people in my life, and not the same fun way I do now with my granddaughter. Do we ever play hide and seek with God?
