The Buffalo County 4-H Council will be rewarding \$75 to any Buffalo County 4-H Club that meets all criteria to receive the designation of Nebraska 4-H Club of Excellence. The certificates and checks will be presented at the 4-H Recognition Banquet on Sunday, November 6th.

4-H Club Year-End Treasurer's Reports

4-H Clubs are required to file year-end treasurer's report, reflecting club finances at the end of 2016 calendar year, with the Buffalo County Extension Office. The Extension Office then uses these treasurer's reports to file with the IRS, for clubs to maintain their non-profit and tax exempt status. A treasurer's report form was mailed to club leaders in September, please let the office know if you need another copy. If your club does not have a bank account, write \$0 and N/A (not applicable) in the corresponding spaces on the treasurer's report form. The treasurer's reports can be turned in now, if the club will have no financial transactions throughout the rest of the 2016 calendar year, or turning in shortly after December 31, 2016.

4-H Council Positions

The Buffalo County 4-H Council is a group of adults and youth volunteers who meet, on the fourth Tuesday of most months in the evening, to evaluate 4-H programs, set policies, plan programs and events, plan fundraisers, and decide upon other 4-H management issues.

The 4-H Council is essential to the 4-H program in Buffalo County, and all major decisions are brought through the 4-H Council. Every year various 4-H Council positions are up for reelection. Those interested in serving in a leadership role on the council should let the Buffalo County Extension Office know by calling at 308-236-1235. Likewise, people may be nominated to be considered for 4-H Council. To make a nomination, please call the Extension Office and let us know. Buffalo County 4-H needs individuals who are interested in making 4-H a growing and thriving program in Buffalo County.

The available positions include: Vice-President/President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer Elect, Activities Coordinator, Family and Consumer Sciences Representative, Agriculture Representative, and four youth-member spots. 4-H Council elections will be held at the 4-H Recognition Banquet on Sunday, November 6th. Parents and 4-H youth may vote for adult and youth members on the 4-H Council.

Note: the information printed here on the 4-H Council positions up for election is a correction from what was originally printed in the 2016 4-H September Newsletter.

Description of 4-H Council Positions:

Vice-President/President Elect:

Duties shall include presiding at Council meetings in the absence of the President and serving as Chair of the Nominating Committee. The Vice-President/President Elect shall be elected each year. Person elected serves one year as Vice-President/President Elect, one year as president, and one year as past president.

Secretary:

Duties shall include keeping the minutes of all regular and special council meetings and managing correspondences. The Secretary shall be elected to take office in odd numbered years.

Treasurer-Elect:

Duties shall include an active voting role in the 4-H Council and learning the business transactions of the Council. The Treasurer-Elect will work with the current Treasurer during their first year in office and then move to the position of Treasurer for the remaining year of their term. The Treasurer-Elect shall be elected to take office every year.

Activities Coordinator:

Duties shall include coordinating the annual 4-H Recognition Banquet, assisting with recruitment, and retention activities sponsored by the 4-H Council. Activities Coordinator shall be elected to take office in odd numbered years.

Family & Consumer Sciences Representative:

Duties shall include directing committees involving youth programs in the field of Family & Consumer Sciences and Science, Engineering and Technology. This person shall serve a two-year term on the FCS/SET P.A.T. during their time in office. The Family & Consumer Sciences Representative shall be elected to take office in odd numbered years.

Agriculture Representative:

Duties shall include directing committees involving youth programs in the field of agriculture and serving on at least one livestock PAT during their term in office. The Agriculture Representative shall be elected to take office in odd numbered years. Term is for two years.

Youth Representatives:

Duties shall include representing youth interests on the 4-H Council. Youth representatives shall be at least 12 years old (4-H age) to be considered. There shall be four (4) youth representatives, selected each year for a one-year term. At least eight nominees will be submitted by the previous year's youth representatives. They will be elected by ballot using the same rules as for other adult 4-H Council members. The four youth receiving the most votes will be the youth representatives.

Number of Terms:

Adult members of the Council may serve two consecutive terms but not in the same position. After two terms, an adult council member must remain absent from the council for at least one year before being reelected to a different position. Youth representatives may serve in the same office for two consecutive terms if reelected.

The 13th Annual Nebraska Youth Beef Leadership Symposium (NYBLS) will take place Friday through Sunday, December 2nd through the 4th at the Animal Science Complex at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. The symposium is designed to introduce youth to career opportunities and current issues in the beef industry, as well as offer education and practice in the use of leadership skills.

High school upperclassmen and lowerclassmen groups will be limited to 30 participants each. If an individual is selected to participate, a \$75 registration fee will be collected at that time. The registration fee covers all hotel, meals, and material costs. Buffalo County 4-H Council will cover this fee, and if multiple youth are selected, transportation may be provided by Buffalo County 4-H.

UNL-Lincoln College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources' scholarships will also be awarded at the symposium to a few high school junior and senior participants.

The Northeast Community College Livestock Judging Team will host the 32nd Annual Livestock Classic – Steer and Heifer Show on Friday and Saturday, November 25th through November 26th, at the NECC Agriculture Complex in Norfolk.

The breeding heifer show will take place on November 25th and the market animal show will be on November 26th. There will also be a showmanship contest at the beginning of each show day. Animals may be fitted for showmanship, and there will be separate judges each day. The show is pending sanction by the Junior Nebraska Cattlemen. National Western Stock Show Catch-a-Calf-Contest Applications Due Monday, December 5th

The National Western Stock Show Catch-A-Calf Program is designed to promote youth development and understanding of the cattle industry. Youth who have experience raising, feeding and showing beef cattle, are encouraged to apply.

Applicants must be between the ages of 12 and 18 as of December 31, 2016, and be enrolled in 4-H at the time of application. Successful calf-catchers must have adequate facilities available to house their steer, as they are responsible for the care, feeding, and handling of their animal from May 2017 until the 2018 NWSS in January.

The program is designed so successful participants catch a calf, feed it, and return with the animal one year later as a market steer. The market animals are judged on rate of gain, quality of fitting, and carcass quality. The exhibitor is judged on showmanship, their record book, and a personal interview.

Contest commitments include: attempting to catch a calf at the 2017 NWSS from January 13-15th; housing and raising the steer; NW CAC record book with story, pictures, and activities list; monthly letters (May to December 2017) to calf sponsor; exhibiting the animal at the 2018 NWSS in the specific Catch-a-Class class; and selling the animal at the 2018 NWSS.

Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports Leaders Certification Workshop

2017 4-H Youth in Action Award Applications Due Monday, October 24th

The 4-H Youth in Action Award is the highest honor National 4-H Council awards to 4-H youth. This award, recognizes outstanding 4-H members who epitomize 4-H youth empowerment and leadership, and will honor four confident, accomplished 4-H members who have gained critical life skills through their 4-H experience and have utilized those skills for personal impact (overcoming a challenge) and community impact (positively impacting their family, peers and/or community). The 2017 awards will recognize one remarkable 4-H Member within each pillar area: Agriculture, Citizenship, Healthy Living, and STEM.

Each of the four winners will receive: a \$5,000 scholarship for higher education; an all-expenses paid trip to Washington, D.C. to be recognized at the National 4-H Council's Legacy Awards on Tuesday, March 21, 2017; an opportunity to serve as the National Youth Spokesperson for their recognized pillar area; and additionally, one National 4-H Youth in Action Award winner will be selected from the four pillar winners and receive an additional \$5,000 scholarship for higher education.

2017 Prudential Spirit of Community Awards Online Applications Due Tuesday, November 8th

Applicants will be judged on depth of personal initiative, effort, and growth with the community service activity, and impact of the activity.

Local Honorees who qualify will receive a Certificate of Achievement and President's Volunteer Service Award. To qualify for the President's Award, applications must have 26 hours of service if age ten or younger; 50 hours of service if age 11 to 15; or 100 hours of service if age 16-plus. The top state honorees receive a \$1,000 award, engraved silver medallion, and an all-expense-paid trip with a guardian to Washington, D.C. The top ten state honoree, from across the United States, will receive a \$5,000 award, engraved gold medallion, crystal trophy for their school or organization, and \$5,000 grant for a nonprofit charitable organization of their choice.

2017 Martha and Don Romeo Scholarship Due to Extension Office by Thursday, December 1st

The Nebraska Association of Fair Managers will award two \$500 scholarships to 4-H members. The scholarships will be awarded to one male and one female, who will be 2017 high school graduating seniors in the state of Nebraska, and plan to continue with post high school education. Additional eligibility requirements include: exhibition of 4-H project(s) at the county or state fair within the last four years; minimum high school grade point average of 2.5 (4.0 scale); and maintenance of a minimum 2.5 grade point average, in first semester of post high school education, while carrying at least 12 credit hours. Financial need will not be considered in the selection process.

Applicants must complete a three-page application which includes personal information, 4-H and school accomplishments, community involvement, and a 250-word essay. Two letters of recommendation must also be submitted.

Winners will be notified in January 2017. The scholarship is awarded during the Nebraska Association of Fair Managers Convention Banquet, which is occurring Sunday, January 22, 2017, at 12 p.m., in Kearney, Neb.
