# FROM FATHER MARQUARD

As we enter into this season of Advent, we do so with a threefold recognition of the Lord's coming into our lives. We have many opportunities to prepare our hearts for these three comings of Christ.

First, we recognize that **Christ has already come to us**. We recognize that he was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. God, in the person of Jesus Christ, broke into human history to save us. One of the ways that we can prepare our hearts to celebrate his historic coming is to ponder the reality that we need a Savior. The more we recognize our need for salvation, the more our hearts can be enflamed with gratitude that salvation is ours in Jesus Christ. This, in turn, can enflame our love for him.

Second, we recognize that *Christ comes* to us in the present. He comes to us in our prayer, in one another, in Sacred Scripture, in the sacraments, and, most profoundly, in the Eucharist. Daily, he makes good on his promise to be with us always, until the end of the age. He comes to us in our everyday lives. Our task is to welcome him. One of the ways that we can prepare our hearts for this present coming is to open our hearts and seek his presence in prayerful pursuits – Eucharistic adoration, daily Mass, spiritual reading, acts of charity, and the like.

Third, we recognize that **Christ will come** to us again. *He will come in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end*. When we keep his future coming in mind, we are able to view our lives under the aspect of eternity – recognizing that our earthly lives are but a blip on the timeline of eternity. Our preparation here can take the form of focusing on how our actions will have repercussions for all eternity. Christ will judge us based on our actions. This, in turn, can help us make choices according to what will bring the best eternal consequences. Another important part of preparation is participating in the Sacrament of Confession with a firm commitment to amend our lives and live with our eyes focused on the future coming of Christ.

Two upcoming events aim to help us prepare well for the coming of Christ: the Advent Penance Service on Tuesday, December 15, and the Advent Morning of Reflection on Saturday, December 19. Please see the bulletin flap for more information.




