Deuteronomy 30:10-14: Moses encourages Israel to take God's commandments to heart and observe them faithfully. But keeping the law involve more than simply adhering to a set of rules. It enables the people to turn to God "with all your heart and all your soul." Faithfulness is a matter of constant conversion, continually approaching God in sincerity of heart.

Colossians 1:15-20: This entire hymn proclaims boldly the preexistence of Christ. Although he came into the world at a particular time and place, he has always been with the Father. Indeed, God dwells so fully in Jesus that Jesus is the very manifestation of God in the world., the one through whom God can draw all people into a loving embrace. Yet the author stresses that it is through the painful reality of the cross that reconciliation of the world with God is possible.

Luke 10:25-37: The neighbor was not someone with formal ties to the injured person, but the one who saw to his needs. Neighborliness has nothing to do with kinship or being from the same town. It involves doing what is best for another, regardless of social responsibility or position. The Samaritan, the outsider, was neighborly enough to have compassion and to recognize the need of the injured man.

FEAST OF ST MARY of MAGDALA - PRAYER SERVICE: The woman clearly identified in the New Testament as Mary Magdalene was a constant companion of Jesus during his ministry in Galilee and was one of his earliest followers. She was also likely affluent enough to be a self-supporting unmarried woman while aiding in the support of Jesus and his small ministry. Loyal to the last, Mary Magdalene witnessed the crucifixion and the interment of Jesus' body in the tomb; she was also the first recorded witness of the Resurrection. According to John, the resurrected Jesus singles Mary Magdalene out from all the others, charging her alone to bring news of his transcendence over death to his disciples. She went on to counsel others in Jesus' teachings and inspired many to join her in the Christian faith. **There will a special Morning Prayer service for the 'Feast of St Mary of Magdala' at 10:00 AM, Saturday, July 23rd, in the vestibule of the chapel.
