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## 16 Free Crochet Hat Patterns, Scarves, and Gloves eBook

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## Scarves

### Crimson Ridge Cowl

By: Salihan Crafts

When the rest of the world slowly puts away their winter woolies, it's time for those down under to start crocheting for the upcoming chill. The Crimson Ridge Cowl is an easy project you can whip up quickly for those unpredictable autumn days.



#### Materials:

- Approximately 107 yards (98m) of Lion Brand Wool-ease Chunky or any bulky/12ply yarn
- US M/N (9mm) crochet hook
- Embroidery needle

**Difficulty Level:** Advanced Beginner

You will need to have basic crochet skills. This project uses a slightly advanced stitch, simple shaping and edging.



#### Finished Measurements:

22" (56cm) circumference around the widest part and narrows to 19" (49cm) 9.5" (24cm) tall

**Gauge:** 10 stitches = 4" (10cm) in single crochet through back loop



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### Stitch Explanation:

This pattern is written using American crochet abbreviations

**ch(s)** = chain(s)

**rnd(s)** = round(s)

**st(s)** = stitch(es)

**sc** = single crochet

**sc1bl** = single crochet through back loop only

**sc2tog 1bl** = single crochet 2 stitches together through back loops only

### Instructions:

Chain 53 sts. Slip st into the first chain to join in the round.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, 1 sc1bl into each st, slip st into the turning ch (52 sts)

Repeat round 1 until cowl measures 3" (7.5cm)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, \*1 sc1bl to next 11 sts, sc2tog 1bl\*, repeat \*\* to end of rnd, slip st into the turning ch (48 sts)

Repeat round 1 until cowl measures 6" (15cm)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, \*1 sc1bl to next 6 sts, sc2tog 1bl\*, repeat \*\* to end of rnd, slip st into the turning ch (42 sts)

Repeat round 1 until cowl measures 9" (23cm)

**Rope edging rnd:** Working from LEFT to RIGHT (opposite direction), ch 1, sc into each st, slip st into the turning ch.

Ch 1 and fasten off.

Weave in loose ends using the embroidering needle.

## Cute Bowtie Neckwarmer

This is such a cute pattern you will love wearing around. Who says bowties are just for men? This is an intermediate crochet pattern that uses a double-ended crochet hook.



### Materials:

- RED HEART® “Soft Yarn®: 1 ball each 9440 Lt Grey
- Heather A, 9520 Seafoam B.
- Crochet Hooks: 6.5mm [US K-10½] – 10” double-ended crochet hook; 6.5 mm [US K-10½] standard hook (used for edging only).
- Two stitch holders (at least 4” length), tapestry needle.

**Gauge:** 19 sts = 4”; 24 rows = 4” in double hook pattern.

**Check your Gauge:** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

### Notes:

The ends and center sections of the scarf are worked in the double-ended hook technique. The pick-up action and work-off action are listed as two separate rows.

The Keyhole sections are worked in Tunisian Crochet where the pick-up and work-off actions comprise one row. A row is complete when you have one stitch remaining on the hook.

When working in horizontal stitches, insert hook under top loop only.

### Special Abbreviations:

Horiz = horizontal

Vert = vertical

TKS = Tunisian Knit Stitch – Insert hook from front to back between vertical strands of same st, yo and draw through keeping loop on hook.

### Neck Warmer:

With A, ch 3.

Row 1: Working in bump on wrong side of ch, pick up loop in 2nd ch from hook and remaining ch; slide loops to opposite end of hook and turn – 3 loops on hook.

Row 2: Place slip knot of B on left end of hook; draw slip knot through first loop, [yo, draw through 2 loops] twice; 1 loop of B remains. DO NOT TURN.

Row 3: Pick up loop in first horiz st, pick up loop under next vert bar, pick up loop in next horiz st, pick up loop under final vert bar; slide loops to opposite end of hook and turn – 5 loops.

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Row 4: Pick up A, yo, draw through 1 loop; \* yo, draw through 2 loops; repeat from \* across until 1 loop of A remains. DO NOT TURN.

Row 5: Pick up loop in first horiz st, pick up loop under next vert bar, pick up loop in each horiz st until 2 vert bars remain, pick up loop under next vert bar, pick up loop under final horiz st, skip final vert bar; slide loops to opposite end of hook and turn – 7 loops.

Rows 6-19: Repeat Rows 4-5, alternating two rows of A and two rows of B – 21 sts at end of Row 19.

Row 20: Repeat Row 4.

Row 21: Pick up a loop in each horiz st; slide loops to opposite end of hook and turn – 21 loops.

Row 22: Repeat 4 with B.

Row 23-30: Repeat Rows 21-22, alternating two rows of A and two rows of B.

### Divide for Keyhole

Row 31: \* Pick up loop in next horiz st, transfer loop to stitch holder, pick up loop in next horiz st holding it on hook; repeat from \* keeping st holder to the back of work. DO NOT TURN – 11 B sts on hook, 10 B sts on holder

Row 32: Working only sts on hook, yo, draw through one loop, \* yo, draw through 2 loops; repeat from \* across; drop B, ch 1 with A.

Row 33: TKS in each st across – 11 sts.

Row 33 Return: Yo, draw through 1 loop; \*yo, draw through 2 loops; repeat from \* across until 1 loop remains; DO NOT TURN.

Rows 34-40 Return: Repeat Row 33 and Row 33 Return.

Row 41: TKS in each st across, transfer loops to 2nd stitch holder.

Work 2nd half of 1st keyhole: Turn work, place loops from 1st st holder on hook making sure B yarn is to the left.

Repeat Rows 32 – 41 on 10 sts with B.

Rejoin sts: Holding work so st holder with 11 sts is closest to you, replace loops on hook beginning with 1st st at right edge of front holder and alternating 1 st from each holder. 21 sts on hook, one strand of yarn at each edge of work.

Row 42: Repeat Row 4 with A, drop A, ch 1 with B.

Rows 43-146: Repeat Rows 21-22, alternating two rows of A and two rows of B.

### Divide for Keyhole:

Row 147: Repeat Row 31.

Rows 148-157: Repeat Rows 32-41.

Work 2nd half of 2nd keyhole as for first through Rejoining Sts.

Row 158: Repeat Row 42.

Rows 159-168: Repeat Rows 21-22 alternating two rows of A and two rows of B.

Row 169: Skip 1st horiz st, pick up loop in each horiz st until 2 remain; skip next horiz st, pick up loop in final horiz st; slide loops to opposite end of hook and turn – 19 loops.

Row 170: Repeat Row 4.

Rows 171-184: Repeat rows 169-170; noting two fewer loops on hook each pick-up row – 5 loops at end of Row 183.

Row 185: Skip first horiz st, slip st in next horiz st, skip next horiz st, slip st in final horiz st; transfer final loop of A to standard hook for edging. Fasten off B.

**Edging:** Ch 1, turn so predominantly A side is facing; working in ends of rows, sc evenly around working through top thickness only of keyhole section, join with slip st in beginning sc. Fasten off. Weave in yarn ends.

**Abbreviations:** A, B = color A, B; ch = chain; mm = millimeters; st(s) = stitch(es); yo = yarn over; \* or \*\* = repeat whatever follows the \* or \*\* as indicated; [ ] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified.



## Cupcake Scarf

Cupcakes are trendy right now, so embellish a crochet scarf with some yummy-looking cupcakes with this free crochet scarf pattern.



### Materials:

- Any worsted weight yarn (I used mostly “I Love This Yarn”, 100% acrylic)
- Small amount of brown for cupcake “cake”
- Small amount of pink and purple for “icing”
- Small amount of red for “cherry”
- Approximately 200 yards of main scarf color (I used baby blue)
- G-6 / 4 mm crochet

**Finished Size:** One size fits most

**Gauge:** Not important

### “Cake” Pattern – make 2

1. With brown, ch 16
2. Row 1: (RS) hdc in third ch from hook, hdc in next 3 chs, sc in remaining chs. Ch1, turn. (4hdc, 10sc)
3. Row 2: working in BLO, sc in each st across. Ch1, turn. (14sc)
4. Row 3-15: repeat row 2.
5. Row 16: working in BLO, sc in first 10 sts. Hdc in last 4 sts. Finish off and weave in ends. (10sc, 4hdc)

### “Icing” Pattern – make 2

1. Row 1: With icing color and RS facing, attach yarn with a sc to the widest edge – right corner. Evenly space 17 more sc along edge. Ch3, turn. (18sc)
2. Row 2: sc in each sc across, ch3, turn. (18sc)
3. Row 3: sc in each sc across and turning ch. Ch3, turn. (20sc)
4. Row 4: sk first 2sc, sc in next st and each st across until 2 sts remain. Ch2, sl st in turning ch. (16sc)
5. Row 5: sk ch sp. Sc in first sc and each sc across. Ch3, turn. (16sc)

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- Row 6: sk first 2 sts, sc in next sc and each st across. Ch3, turn. (14sc)
- Row 7-9: repeat row 6. (8sc)
- Row 10: sk first 2 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, ch2. sl st in turning ch. Finish off and weave in ends.

### “Cherry” Pattern – make 2

- Round 1: With red, 6sc in magic ring, do not join. (6sc)
- Round 2: 2sc in each sc around. (12sc)
- Round 3: ch1, 2hdc in each sc around. Finish off and weave in ends. (24hdc)

### Scarf Pattern

- With MC, ch 30
- Row 1: 2dc in 3rd ch from hook. \*sk 2 sts, (sc, 2dc) in next st. Repeat from \* across. Sc in last ch. Ch2, turn.
- Row 2: 2dc in first sc. \*sk 2 dc, (sc, 2dc) in next sc. Repeat from \* across, ending with sc in turning chain. Ch2, turn.
- Repeat row 2 until desired length is achieved.
- Final row: ch1, sc in each dc and sc across. Finish off and weave in ends.

### Assembly

Attach cherry to top of icing and attach completed cupcakes to the bottom of the [scarf](#) or wherever desired.



(Note: Hat pattern not available)

## Double the Fun Potato Chip Scarf

Get twice as much fun from your fashion scarf pattern in this Double the Fun Potato Chip Scarf from Red Heart Yarn. Easy crocheted scarf patterns can look quite impressive! Mix and match colors to create a scarf for every outfit.



### Materials:

- RED HEART® “Super Soft™” (1 skein each 9344 Chocolate A and 9518 Teal B)
- Crochet Hook: 6.0mm [US J-10]
- Yarn needle

### Instructions:

GAUGE: 12 sts = 4”; 8 rows = 4”. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge given.

1. With A, ch 146 (174) loosely.
2. Row 1: Dc in 4th ch from hook and each st across. Turn 144 (172) dc.
3. Row 2 (Right Side): Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), dc in each st across. Turn.
4. Row 3: Ch 3, dc in same st, 2 dc in each st across. Turn. 288 (344) dc.
5. Row 4: Repeat row 2.
6. Row 5: Ch 3, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, \* dc in next st, 2 dc in next st; Repeat from \* across. Turn. 432 (516) dc.
7. Row 6: Repeat row 2.
8. Row 7: Ch 3, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, \* dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st. Turn. 576 (688) dc.
9. Row 8: Repeat row 2. Fasten off.
10. With Right Side facing, join B to opposite side of foundation chain.
11. Row 1: Ch 3, dc in each ch across. Turn.
12. Rows 2-8: Repeat rows 2-8 from previous side. Fasten off.
13. Weave in all ends.

## Gloves and Mittens

### Easy Crochet Mittens

Every girl needs a pair of cozy mittens for the winter season. Before the temperature starts to plummet, make yourself a pair of these Easy Crochet Mittens. Made with bulky yarn, these simple mitts can be crocheted up in hardly any time at all!



#### Materials:

- Chunky worst weight yarn
- Size I crochet hook

#### Instructions:

Starting at cuff: chain 11

**Row 1:** sc in second chain from hook, sc in the remaining stitches, ch1 turn (10 sc)

**Row 2:** sc in back loops of each sc across, ch1, turn

Repeat row 2 until 20 rows are completed.

Turn work to the side and work in continuous rounds.

**Row 1:** work 20 sc along side of the cuff mark the first and the last stitch

**Row 2:** 2 sc in the first stitch, sc until the last stitch, 2 sc in the last stitch (22 sc) again, mark the first and the last stitch.

Repeat row 2 until you have 30 sc.

#### Setting up for the thumb:

sc in the next 4 sc, sc in the next sc and mark this stitch. sc in the next 21 sc, skip the next 8 sc, sc in the marked sc. (22 sc)

Marked stitch is first sc in each row.

**Row 1:** sc in each of the 22 sc around. repeat row 1 for 10 rows, or about 1 1/2 inches below desired length.

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Decrease for top of mitten:

**Row 1:** sc 2tog, sc in the next 4, sc 2tog, \*sc in the next 5, sc 2 tog\* repeat around

**Row 2:** sc around

**Row 3:** \*sc in next 4, sc 2 tog\* around

**Row 4:** sc around

**Row 5:** \*sc in the next 3, sc 2 tog\* around

**Row 6:** \*sc in the next 2, sc 2 tog\* around  
finish off.

### **Thumb:**

sc in the first unworked sc (mark this stitch) and in the remaining 7 sc, 2 sc in the side of the mitten (10 sc)

do two more rounds of sc

decrease for thumb:

**Row 1:** sc in the next 3 sc, sc 2tog, repeat one more time

**Row 2:** sc around

**Row 3:** sc in the next 2 sc, sc 2 tog, repeat one more time, finish off.

Sew in ends, and sew up side seam for cuff.

Of course, make the other mitten.

## Lacy Wrist Warmers

By: Nazanin S. Fard for Red Heart Yarn

Keep your hands toasty and your fingers free to work with this wrist warmers crochet pattern or fingerless mittens crochet pattern. These stylish wrist warmers would make a great gift or a quick crochet project.



### Materials:

- Yarn: RED HEART® “Eco-Ways™”: 1 Ball each 2316 Storm A and 1615 Lichen B.
- Crochet Hook: 6mm [US J-10].
- Yarn needle.

**Gauge:** 14 sts = 4” in dc.

Directions are for size Small/Medium; changes for size Medium/Large are in parentheses.

### Size:

Hand Circumference: 7½ (8½)”.

Length: 10”.

### Special Abbreviations:

**fpdc (front post double crochet):** yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front around the post of indicated stitch and draw yarn through, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

**bpdc (back post double crochet):** yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back around the post of indicated stitch and draw yarn through, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

**To Change Color:** Work the joining slip st with next color to be used.

**Note:** Do not cut yarn when changing color but drop to the wrong side of the work and pick up again as needed.

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### Instructions: (Make 2)

With A ch 26 (30) loosely; join with a slip st in first ch to form a ring making sure that the ch is not twisted.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next ch and in each ch around; join with a slip st in top of ch-3 – 26 (30) sts.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, fpdc around next st, \* bpdc around next st, fpdc around next st; repeat from \* around; join with a slip st in top of ch-3.

Rnd 3: With B repeat Rnd 2.

Rnds 4 and 5: With A repeat Rnd 2.

Rnds 6-11: Repeat Rnds 3-5.

Rnd 12: Repeat Rnd 3.

Rnds 13 and 14: With A ch 3, dc in next st and in each st around; join.

Rnd 15: With B ch 1, sc in each st around; join with a slip st in first sc.

Rnds 16 and 17: Repeat Rnds 13 and 14.

Rnd 18 (Thumb Opening): With B ch 1, sc in same st as joining, ch 4, skip next 4 dc, sc in each dc around; join.

Rnd 19: With A ch 3, 4 dc in ch-4-space, dc in each sc around; join.

Rnd 20: Repeat Rnd 13. Cut A.

Rnd 21: With B ch 1, sc in same st as joining, \* skip next dc, 5 dc in next dc, skip next dc \*\*, sc in next dc; repeat from \* around, end at \*\*; join. Fasten off.

## Striped Fingerless Gloves

By: Berta Gilholm

With this free crochet pattern, you can keep your hands warm while still being able to use your fingers. With instructions from Berta Gilholm, you can create two equally colorful versions of a classic pattern.



### Materials:

- Any Worsted Weight self patterning #4 yarn. I used Red Heart Super Saver, Multi Color Acrylic, ww medium, 5 oz., 141 g
- Crochet Hook size US I 9 /5.50mm
- Yarn Needle

**Stitches:** Ch – Chain, Slst – Slip Stitch, Sc – Single Crochet, Scdc – Single Crochet Decrease

**Note:** Do not count Ch1 at beginning of each round as a stitch on rows.  
This pattern is for a medium glove, If you require a smaller or larger glove do one of the following:

1. Change the hook 1 size down for small or 1 size up for large.
2. Subtract 2 sc's plus 2 rows for smaller size or Add 2 sc's plus 2 rows for larger size.

### Instructions:

#### Cuff Instructions:

With I hook, Ch 13,

**Row 1:** Sc in second Ch from hook and in each Ch across, ch 1, turn (12 sc)

**Row 2:** Working in back loops only Sc in each Sc across, ch 1, turn (12 sc)

**Row 3 – 18:** Repeat row 2, at end of last row line up row 18 against first chain row to sew seam for cuff as follows: Ch 1, slst through each sc/ch row across, Ch 1 (12 slst)



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### Glove Instructions:

**Rnd 1:** Working on ends of Cuff, Sc around cuff 22 times, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (22 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each sc around, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (22 sc)

**Rnd 3 – 7:** Repeat round 2, (22 sc)

**Row 8:** Sc in next 9 Sc, Sc 2 times in next Sc, Repeat \* one more time, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (24 sc)

**Rnd 9:** Sc in each sc around, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (24 sc)

**Row 10:** Sc in next 12 Sc, Sc 2 times in next Sc, Sc in next 11 sc, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (25 sc)

**Rnd 11:** Sc in each sc around, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (25 sc)

### Thumb Hole:

**Rnd 12:** Slst in first 2 sc, Ch 1, Sc in next 21 sc, ch 1, turn (21 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Sc in each sc around, ch 1, turn (21 sc)

**Rnd 14:** Sc in each sc around, ch 1, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (22 sc) (thumb hole made)

**Rnd 15:** Sc in each sc around and in ch 1 sp, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (22 sc)

**Rnd 16 - 20:** Sc in each sc around, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (22 sc) fasten off at end of last round. Weave in ends.

**Thumb Area:** Join yarn in any thumb hole stitch

**Rnd 1:** Sc 13 times around thumb hole area, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (13 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in next 4 sc, dcsc over next 2 sc, repeat one more time, sc in last sc, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (11 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in next 11 sc around, join with slst to first sc, ch 1 (11 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Slst in each sc around. fasten off at end of last round.

**Weave in ends.**

## Hats

### Blooming Spring Hat

Projects that have crochet and knitting together can blossom into beautiful things, like this Blooming Spring Hat. Who doesn't love colorful spring hats? With flowers and leaves topping this beanie, you'll be in the spirit of spring in no time!



#### Materials:

- 1 Skein Manos (or other worsted weight yarn) in color #70
- Assorted bits of pink, red and green yarn from previous projects
- 1 16" #9 Circular needle
- 1 Set of #9 double points (you could do the whole project on double points)
- 1 G crochet hook (or size to match assorted bits of pink and red)
- 1 Set of straight knitting needles in size to work the green leaves
- 1 Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers
- Scissors

#### Instructions:

##### Gauge:

- 4 stitches to the inch
- 6 rows to the inch
- On #9 needle using Manos

##### Directions for Hat:

1. Cast on 80 stitches and join circle.
2. Add a stitch marker to mark beginning and end of round.
3. Work in Garter Stitch for first inch. Remember that Garter in the round is - \*K a round, purl a round\* repeat from \* to \* for one inch.
4. Switch to Stockinette Stitch and continue for 4 more inches. In the round, this means you are just knitting.

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5. On final round of the body, place stitch markers every 10 sts.
6. Decrease round is worked as a K2tog after every stitch marker.
7. Knit the next round. You will continue working a decrease round and then knitting a round until you have only 8 stitches left. At some point, around 40 stitches, you will want to switch to double pointed needles as the crown of the hat is too small to continue working on a circular needle.
8. With 8 stitches left, cut a long tail and pull it through the remaining stitches. Pull firmly and weave in all tails.

### Directions for Flowers:

1. Chain 21 stitches. Leave a long tail.
2. Turn, skip 2 sts.
3. Double crochet 3 times in the next stitch.
4. Continue working a DC 3 times in each stitch. The piece will begin to form a corkscrew.
5. When only 5 stitches remain, work a DC in the next stitch and the rest in a half double crochet. Bind off.
6. Leave a long tail.

### Directions for Leaves (you will be working the leaves in Garter Stitch):

1. Cast on 1 stitch. Leave a long tail.
2. Work an increase – 2 stitches.
3. Work an increase in both stitches – 4 stitches.
4. Work an increase in the end stitches – 6 stitches.
5. Knit for 3 rows.
6. Work an SSK (slip, slip, knit) on the right side and a K2tog on the left – 4 stitches.
7. Work an SSK (slip, slip, knit) on the right side and a K2tog on the left – 2 stitches.
8. K2tog. Cut tail and pull through final stitch. Work in this tail, but leave the other.

### Finishing:

1. Open up the first corkscrew / flower. Use one of the tails and stitch the corkscrew into a spiral / rosette formation onto the crown of the hat. Bring tail to back of work (hat crown) and tie to first tail. Work in ends.
2. Continue until all “flowers” are attached.
3. Sew on leaves where needed visually. Work in tails.

## Easy to Crochet Petite Brimmed Cap

This Easy to Crochet Petite Brimmed Cap from Red Heart Yarn is a great addition to your trendy winter hats collection. A piece of stiffening helps the brim stay stiff and keep its shape. Best of all, it's so easy to crochet! Hats like this are great winter staples.



### Materials:

- Red Heart® Super Saver® (Art. E300) solid color 7 oz (198 g), 364 yd (333 m); multi color and print 5 oz (141 g), 244 yd (223 m), flecks 5oz (141g), 260 yds (238 m) skeins): 1 skein 313 Aran
- Crochet hook, 5mm [US H-8]
- Heavy-weight interfacing or plastic for brim
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle

### Instructions:

**Gauge:** 16 dc = 4"; 9 rows = 4". CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

**Special Abbreviation:** Fpdc = Front post double crochet

### Cap:

1. Ch 4, slip st in first st to form ring.
2. Round 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), work 7 dc in ring, slip st to top of beginning ch to join, place marker for beginning of round – 8 sts.
3. Round 2: Ch 3, 2 dc in same space, 3 dc in each st around, slip st in top of beginning ch – 24 sts.
4. Round 3: Ch 3, [(dc and Fpdc) in next st, dc in next 2 sts] 7 times, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, dc in last st, slip st in top of beginning ch – 32 sts; 8 Fpdc.

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5. Round 4: Ch 4 (counts as dc and ch 1 here and throughout), skip next st, [(dc and Fpdc) in next st, ch 1, skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1, skip next st] 7 times, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, ch 1, skip next st, slip st in top of beginning ch – 40 sts.
6. Round 5: Ch 3, dc in ch-1 space, dc in next st, \*(dc and Fpdc) in next st, [dc in ch-1 space, dc in next st] twice; repeat from \* 6 more times, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, dc in ch-1 space st, slip st in top of beginning ch – 48 sts.
7. Round 6: Ch 4, skip next st, dc in next st, \*ch 1, skip next st, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, [ch 1, skip next st, dc in next st] twice; repeat from \* 6 more times, ch 1, skip next st, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, ch 1, skip next st, slip st in top of beginning ch – 56 sts.
8. Round 7: Ch 3, \*[dc in ch-1 space, dc in next st] twice, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in next st; repeat from \* 6 more times, [dc in ch-1 space, dc in next st] twice, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, dc in next ch-1 space, slip st in top of beginning ch – 64 sts.
9. Round 8: Ch 4, skip next st, \*[dc in next st, ch 1, skip next st] twice, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, ch 1, skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1; repeat from \* 6 more times, [dc in next st, ch 1, skip next st]
10. twice, (dc and Fpdc) in next st, ch 1, skip next st, slip st in top of beginning ch – 72 sts.
11. Round 9: Ch 3, \*[dc in ch-1 space, dc in next st] 3 times, Fpdc in next Fpdc, dc in next ch-1 space, dc in next st; repeat from \* 6 more times, [dc in ch-1 space, dc in next st] twice, Fpdc in next Fpdc, dc in next ch-1 space, slip st in top of beginning ch – 72 sts.
12. Round 10: Ch 4, skip next st, \*[dc in next st, ch 1, skip next st] 3 times, Fpdc in next Fpdc, ch 1, skip next st, dc in next st, ch 1; repeat from \* 6 more times, [dc in next st, ch 1, skip next st] 3 times, Fpdc in next Fpdc, ch 1, skip next st, slip st in top of beginning ch – 72 sts.
13. Rounds 11-15: Repeat Rounds 9-10, end with Round 9.
14. Round 16: Slip st in each st around.
15. Fasten off.

### **Brim: Top Side**

1. Mark 22 sts on front of Cap on Round 16 for Brim.
2. Row 1: With right side facing, join yarn in first marked st, working in front loops only, sc in each next 22 sts.
3. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loops in next 4 sts on Cap – 26 sts.
4. Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loops in next 4 sts on Cap – 30 sts.
5. Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Cap – 31 sts.

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6. Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Cap – 32 sts.
7. Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Cap – 33 sts.
8. Row 7: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Cap – 34 sts.
9. Fasten off.

### Bottom Side:

1. Row 1: With wrong side facing, join yarn on wrong side of Row 1 of Brim, sc in back loops of first 22 sts.
2. Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loops in next 4 sts on Cap – 26 sts.
3. Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loops in next 4 sts on Cap – 30 sts.

4. Row 4: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Cap – 31 sts.
5. Row 5: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Cap – 32 sts.
6. Row 6: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in front loop in next st on Cap – 33 sts.
7. Row 7: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across, sc in back loop in next st on Cap – 34 sts.
8. Fasten off.

**Finishing:** Using Brim as a template, cut a piece of interfacing or plastic to same dimensions. Slip piece in between layers of Brim and sew Brim closed. Weave in ends.

## Beginner Crochet Cap

By: Edie Eckman for Red Heart Yarn

Use a free crochet pattern from Red Heart to make a beginner crochet cap. Worsted weight yarn is used for a nice soft touch. The camouflage colors are great.



**Finished Circumference** 21”.

**Materials** To fit 22-23” head

- RED HEART® “Super Saver™”: 1 skein 971 Camouflage
- Crochet Hook: 5.5 mm (US I-9)
- Yarn needle.
- GAUGE: 11 double crochet = 4”; 7 rows = 4” in double crochet. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the specified gauge.

### Hat:

Chain 4, join with slip stitch to form ring.

**Round 1:** Chain 3 (counts as double crochet throughout), work, 11 double crochet into ring, slip stitch to first double crochet to join – 12 double crochet.

**Round 2:** Chain 3, double crochet in same st, 2 double crochet in each double crochet around, slip stitch to first double crochet to join – 24 double crochet.

**Round 3:** Chain 3, 2 double crochet in next double crochet, \*double crochet in next double crochet, 2 double crochet in next double crochet; repeat from \*, slip stitch to first double crochet to join – 36 double crochet.

**Round 4:** Chain 3, double crochet in next dc, 2 double crochet in next double crochet, \*double crochet in next 2 double crochet, 2 double crochet in next double crochet; repeat from \*, slip stitch to first double crochet to join – 48 double crochet.

**Round 5:** Chain 3, double crochet in next 4 double crochet, 2 double crochet in next double crochet, \*double crochet in next 5 double crochet, 2 double crochet in next double crochet; repeat from \*, slip stitch to first double crochet to join – 56 double crochet.

**Rnds 6-14:** Chain 3, double crochet in each double crochet around, slip stitch to first double crochet to join.

Fasten off.

### Finishing:

Weave in ends.

## Grey Slouchie Beanie

By: Vickie Howell for Caron

A free crochet hat pattern like this Grey Slouchie Beanie is just what every woman needs for the winter. Caron International 'Simply Soft' is used in a Grey Heather color, but you can use any color you wish. The puff stitch is used to create a fun design.



### Sizes:

Women's  
S/M (L/XL)

### Finished Measurements:

Hat measures 21 (22)"/53.5 (56) cm circumference x 11 (12)"/28 (30.5 cm) deep

### Materials:

- Caron International 'Simply Soft' (100% acrylic; 6oz/170g, 315yd/288m skein) 6 oz Shown in: #9742 Grey Heather
- One size US H-8 (5mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain gauge.
- Yarn Needle

### Gauge:

In ribbed band pattern, 18 sts and 12 rows = 4"/10 cm.

### Stitches Used:

Chain (ch), single crochet (sc), slip stitch (sl st)

### Special Term:

**Puff:** Puff stitch—Yarn over, insert hook in indicated stitch and draw up a loop (3 loops on hook), [yarn over, insert hook in same stitch and draw up a loop] 3 times (9 loops on hook), yarn over and draw through first 8 loops on hook, yarn over and draw through remaining 2 loops on hook.

### Hat:

#### Ribbed Band

Ch 10.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across, turn—9 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, working in front loops only, sc in each st across, turn.

Repeat last row until piece measures 21 (22)"/53.5 (56)cm. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Use tail to sew short ends together to form band.



**Body**

Join yarn with sl st in edge of band at seam.

Round 1: Ch 1, work 72 (76) sc evenly spaced around edge of band; join with sl st in first sc—72 (76) sc.

Round 2: Ch 3, sk first sc, Puff in next sc, ch 1, \*sk next sc, Puff in next sc, ch 1; repeat from \* around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—36 (38) Puffs and 36 (38) ch-1 sps.

Round 3: Ch 3, Puff in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*sk next Puff, Puff in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; repeat from \* around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Repeat last round until hat measures 11 (12)"/28 (30.5)cm from beginning. DO NOT FASTEN OFF.

**Finishing:**

Close Top of Hat: Last round worked is top of hat. Hook is currently at top, back center of hat. Keeping loop on hook, insert hook into top, center front of hat, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (sc complete). Pinch side edges to the same center point and sc the edges together (by inserting hook through both thicknesses and completing an sc). The top of the hat will now be in a star formation. Continue to pinch opposite edges and sc them together until top of hat is completely closed. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

## Three Colored Cloche

By: Caron Yarn

Crochet this colorful cloche for any time of year, but you'll mostly want to wear it during the winter months. Caron Simply Soft yarn is used for this free crochet pattern. It's an easy pattern you can make over and over.



### Materials:

- Caron International's Simply Soft (100% acrylic; 6 oz/170 g, 315 yds/288 m): 1 skein each of Black (9727) (MC), Autumn
- Red (9730) (A) and Grey Heather (9742) (B).
- Size H/8 (5 mm) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.
- Yarn needle

### Gauge:

6 clusters and 6 1/2 rows = 4"/10cm in pat.  
TAKE TIME TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

### Special Abbreviation:

Cluster = (yo and draw up a loop, yo and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times in next sp, yo and draw through all loops on hook.

### Instructions:

Beg at crown, with MC, ch 4; join with sl st to first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 3, (yo and draw up a loop, yo and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice in ring, yo and draw through all loops on hook – beg cluster made, (ch 1, cluster in ring) 7 times, ch 1; join A with sl st to top of first cluster – 8 clusters.

Rnd 2: With A, sl st in next ch-1 sp, (beg cluster, ch 1, cluster) in same sp, ch 1, \*(cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp; rep from \* around; join MC with sl st to top of first cluster – 16 clusters.

Rnd 3: With MC, sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg cluster in same sp, ch 1, \*(cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from \* 6 times more, (cluster, ch 1) twice in last ch-1 sp; join A with sl st to top of first cluster – 24 clusters.

Rnd 4: With A, sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg cluster in same sp, ch 1, \*cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, (cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp, cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from \* 6 times more, cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, (cluster, ch 1) twice in last ch-1 sp; join MC with sl st to top of first cluster – 32 clusters.

Rnd 5: With MC, sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg cluster in same sp, ch 1, \*cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from \* around; join A with sl st to top of first cluster.

Rnd 6: With A, as Rnd 5; join MC with sl st to top of first cluster..

Rnds 7 and 8: As Rnds 5 and 6 once.

Rnd 9: As Rnd 5; join B with sl st to top of first cluster.

Rnd 10: With B, as Rnd 5; join MC with sl st to top of first cluster.

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Rnd 11: As Rnd 9.

Rnd 12: With B, sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg cluster in same sp, ch 1, \*(cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 6 times, (cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp\*\*, cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from \* twice more, then rep from \* to \*\* once; join MC with sl st to top of first cluster – 36 clusters.

Rnd 13: With MC, sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg cluster in same sp, ch 1, \*(cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) twice, (cluster, ch 1) twice in next ch-1 sp\*\*, (cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 6 times; rep from \* twice more, then rep from \* to \*\* once, (cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1) 5 times; join B with sl st to top of first cluster – 40 clusters.

Rnd 14: With B, sl st in next ch-1 sp, beg cluster in same sp, ch 1, \*cluster in next ch-1 sp, ch 1; rep from \* around; join with sl st to top of first cluster. Fasten off.

## Crochet Sets

### La Poetique Scarf and Beret Set

By: Denise Lavoie for Premier Yarns

Make a crochet scarf neck wrap and matching beret with this stylish pattern. If you're looking for free crochet hat patterns that are stylish and cozy, this fancy beret is just the thing for you!



#### Finished Measurements:

Beret: Approximately 22" in circumference  
Scarf: 90" in circumference and 12" wide

#### Materials:

- Yarn: Deborah Norville Fashion Jeweltones by Premier Yarns (57% Acrylic/40% Wool/3% Polyester [sequins]; 99 yards/90 meters; 1.75 oz/50 grams)
  - DNF22-16 Spinel – 11 balls
- Crochet Hook: H-8 (5mm) and I-9 (5.5 mm) or sizes to obtain gauge
- Extras: Split-ring stitch marker, yarn needle

#### Gauges:

Beret: 7 rnds = 4" in lace patt with smaller hook; Scarf: 18 sts and 8 rows = 4" with larger hook. Use any size hook to obtain specified gauge.

#### Abbreviations:

beg – beginning; ch – chain; dc – double crochet; dec – decrease; lp – loop; mm – millimeter; patt – pattern; rem – remaining; rep – repeat; rnd – round; RS – right side; sc – single crochet; sl st – slip st; sp – space; st(s) – stitch(es); WS – wrong side; yo – yarn over; [ ] – rep instructions in brackets the number of times specified; \* – rep instructions after asterisk as specified.

#### Special Terms:

Bpdc (back-post double crochet): Yo, insert hook around next st from back to front to back and draw up a lp, [yo and pull through 2 lps on hook] twice.

Puff: Yo, insert hook in next st and draw up a lp, yo and pull through 2 lps on hook, [yo, insert hook in same st and draw up a lp, yo and pull through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo and pull through all 4 lps on hook.

Sc2tog (single crochet 2 stitches together): Insert hook in specified st and draw up a lp, insert hook in next st and draw up a lp, yo and pull through 3 lps on hook (1 stitch decreased).

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### Instructions:

**Beret:** Ch 6, join with a sl st in first ch to form a ring.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, work 12 sc in ring; join with a sl st in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around; join with a sl st in first sc – 24 sc.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, \* sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc – 30 sc.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, \* Puff in next sc, ch 2, sk next 2 sc, (2 dc, ch 3, sl st) in next st, ch 1, sk next 2 sc; rep from \* 4 times; join with a sl st in third ch of beg ch-3 – 5 Puffs.

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, 2 sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp; sc in next ch-1 sp; \* sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp; rep from \* 3 times; join with a sl st in first sc – 42 sc.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 3, \* (2 dc, ch 3, sl st) in next sc, ch 1, sk next 2 sc, Puff in next sc, ch 2, sk next 2 sc; rep from \* 6 times, join with a sl st in third ch of beg ch-3 – 7 puffs.

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 dc, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp; \* sc in each of next 2 dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc – 54 sc.

**Rnd 8:** Rep Rnd 4, working 9 complete patt reps.

**Rnd 9:** Ch 1, \* sc in top of Puff; 2 sc in next ch-2 sp; sc in each of next 2 dc; 3 sc in next ch-3 sp; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc – 72 sc.

**Rnd 10:** Rep Rnd 6, working 12 complete patt reps.

**Rnd 11:** Ch 1, \* sc in each of next 2 dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc – 96 sc.

**Rnd 12:** Rep Rnd 8, working 16 complete patt reps.

**Rnd 13:** Ch 1, sc in top of Puff, sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, \* sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc – 126 sc.

**Rnd 14:** Rep Rnd 6, working 21 complete patt reps.

**Rnd 15:** Rep Rnd 11 – 168 sc.

**Rnd 16:** Rep Rnd 8, working 28 complete patt reps.

**Rnd 17:** Rep Rnd 9 – 224 sc.

Before working beret band, lightly block lace portion of top of beret.

### Band:

**Rnd 18:** Working in back lps only through Rnd 25, ch 1, sc2tog around rnd; join with a sl st in first sc – 112 sc.

**Rnd 19:** Ch 1, \* sc in each of next 2 sc, sc2tog; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc – 84 sc.

**Rnd 20:** Ch 1, \* sc in each of next 4 sc, sc2tog; rep from \* around, ending with sc in each of last 3 sc; join with a sl st in first sc – 76 sc.

**Rnds 21-25:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with a sl st in first sc. Fasten off at end of Rnd 25.

### Finishing:

Weave in ends.

**SCARF:** Ch 318, join with a sl st in first ch to form a ring, being careful not to twist ch; place a stitch marker in first ch for later use. Do not turn.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, sc in each ch around; join with a sl st in first sc – 318 sts.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, \* Puff in next sc, ch 2, skip next 2 sc, (2 dc, ch 3, sl st) in next st, ch 1, skip next 2 sc; rep from \* to last 2 sts, sl st in third ch of beg ch-3.

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**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, \* (2 dc, ch 3, sl st) in top of puff, ch 1, Puff in next ch 3-sp, ch 2; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in third ch of beg ch-3.

Rep Rnds 2 and 3 until scarf measures 8½” from beg, ending with Rnd 2.

**Next rnd:** Ch 1, \* sc in top of Puff, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next dc, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in first sc.

### Finishing:

**First Edge—Rnd 1:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with a sl st in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3 (counts as a dc), \* ch 2, sk next 2 sc, dc in next sc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in third ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 3:** Sl st into ch-2 sp, ch 3 (counts as a dc), work 2 more dc in ch-2 sp, bpdc around next dc, \* 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, bpdc around next dc; rep from \* around; join with a sl st in third ch of beg ch-3; fasten off.

**Second Edge—Rnd 1:** Working along opposite side of foundation ch, join yarn with a sl st in marked ch, ch 1, sc in same st as joining and in each st around; join with a sl st in first sc – 318 sc. Rep Rnds 2 and 3 of first edge; fasten off.

Weave in ends. Gently block scarf if desired.

## Crochet Scarf and Hat Roving Set

By: Bernat

The beautiful bold colors of Bernat roving make this hat and scarf set perfect for the chilly weather. Crochet this free scarf and hat pattern for yourself or a friend. The fringe adds to the design and it's great for a beginner.



### Measurements:

**Scarf:** Approx 7 x 60 ins [18 x 152.5 cm].

**Hat:** To fit average lady.

### Materials:

- Bernat® Roving
- (100 g/3.5 oz) (109 m/ 120 yds)
- Hat (Scarf): 1 (2) ball(s) each of:
  - #00067 (Cranberry) as A, #00013 (Lotus) as B and #00078 (Amber) as C.
- Size 6.5 mm (U.S. K or 10½) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

### Gauge:

8 sc and 10 rows = 4 ins [10 cm].

### Instructions:

**Note:** To change color, work to last 2 loops on hook. Draw loop of next color through 2 loops on hook, to complete st and proceed in next color.

**Stripe Pat:** Work 2 rows of each color in the following sequence: A, B, A, C.

**Scarf:** **Note:** When joining new color, leave an end 6 ins [15 cm] long for fringe. Break yarn after 2 rows worked in pat, leaving 6 ins [15 cm] end.

With A, ch 130.

1st row: (RS). 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

\*Miss next ch. Ch 1. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from \* to end of row. Turn.

2nd row: Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. \*1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Miss next sc. Rep from \*, ending with 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. 1 sc in last sc. Join B. Turn.

2 rows of Stripe Pat are complete.

3rd row: With B, ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. \*Ch 1. Miss next sc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from \* to last sc. 1 sc in last sc. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows for pat, keeping cont of Stripe Pat until Scarf measures approx 7 ins [18 cm], ending with color A. Fasten off.

Trim fringe evenly.

**Hat:** With A, ch 2.

1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Join.

2nd rnd: Ch 1. 2 sc in each sc around. Join. 12 sc.

2 rnds of Stripe Pat are completed.

Cont in Stripe Pat as follows:

3rd rnd: Ch 1. \*1 sc in next sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from \* around. Join. 18 sc.

4th rnd: Ch 1. \*1 sc in next 2 sc. 2 sc in next sc. Rep from \* around. Join. 24 sc.

Cont in same manner, inc 6 sc every rnd to 42 sc.

Next rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc around. Join.

Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep last rnd for 6 ins [15 cm]. Fasten off.

## Beginner Crochet Hat and Scarf Set

By: Bernat

This free crochet hat and scarf set is great for the beginner crocheter. This granny square technique is great for anyone to use. Softee chunky yarn will keep you warm.



### Sizes:

**Hat:** To fit Teen (Adult).

**Scarf:** Approx 8 ins [20.5 cm] wide x 75 ins [190.5 cm] long.

### Materials:

- Bernat® Softee Chunky (100 g / 3.5 oz; 164 m/180 yds)
- Both Sizes Hat (Scarf-Set)
- Contrast A (39012 True Taupe) 1 (1-1) ball
- Contrast B (39705 Berry Red) 1 (1-1) ball
- Contrast C (39008 Natural) 1 (1-1) ball
- Contrast D (39742 Hot Blue) 1 (1-1) ball
- Contrast E (39110 Dark Blue) 1 (1-1) ball
- Contrast F (39712 Hot Lime) 1 (1-1) ball

**Sizes** 5.5 mm (U.S. I or 9) and 6 mm (U.S. J or 10) crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge.

### Gauge:

**Hat:** 12½ dc and 6½ rows = 4 ins [10 cm] with smaller hook.

**Scarf:** 12 dc and 6 rows = 4 ins [10 cm] with larger hook.

### Instructions:

#### Stripe Pat

With A, work 1 row.

With B, work 1 row.

With C, work 1 row.

With D, work 1 row.

With E, work 1 row.

With F, work 1 row.

These 6 rows form Stripe Pat.

### Hat:

The instructions are written for smaller size. If changes are necessary for larger size the instructions will be written thus ( ). When only one number is given, it applies to both sizes. For ease in working, circle all numbers pertaining to your size.

With smaller (larger) hook and B, ch 6. Join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2). (3 dc in ring. Ch 2) 4 times. 2 dc in ring. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of ch 5.

2nd rnd: Sl st in next ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (1 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in same ch-2 sp. [Ch 1. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 4 times. Ch 1. Join with sl st in top of ch 3.

3rd rnd: Sl st in next dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (1 dc. Ch 1. 2 dc) in same ch-2 sp. [Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. (2 dc. Ch 1. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 4 times. Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. Join with sl st in top of ch 3. Fasten off.



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4th rnd: Join F with sl st in any ch-1 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in same ch-1 sp. (Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) 4 times. Ch 1. Miss next 2 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Join with sl st in top of ch 3. Fasten off. 15 3-dc groups.

5th rnd: Join A with sl st in any ch-1 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in same ch-1 sp. \*Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from \* around. Join with sl st in top of ch 3. Fasten off.

1st row of Stripe Pat is complete.

Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep last rnd 9 times more.

Edging: Join D with sl st in any ch-1 sp. Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from \* to last 3 dc. 1 sc in each of last 3 dc. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

### Scarf:

Notes: Join new color at end of each row. To change color, work to last 2 loops on hook. Draw a loop of new color through last 2 loops on hook to complete st and proceed in new color.

With A, ch 203. Place marker on every 50th ch for easier counting.

1st row: (WS). With A, 1 dc in 8th ch from hook (counts as dc, ch 2 and 1 dc). 1 dc in each of next 2 ch. \*Miss next 2 ch. 1 dc in each of next 3 ch. Rep from \* to last 3 ch. Miss next 2 ch. 1 dc in last ch. Join B. Turn. 39 3-dc groups.

2nd row: With B, ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in first ch-2 sp. \*Ch 2. 3 dc in next ch-2 sp. Rep from \* to last 3-dc group. Ch 2. 2 dc in turning ch. 1 dc in 3rd ch of turning ch. Join C. Turn.

3rd row: With C, ch 5 (counts as dc and ch 2). \*3 dc in next ch-2 sp. Ch 2. Rep from \* to last 3-dc group. Miss next 2 dc. 1 dc in top of turning ch. Join D. Turn.

First 3 rows of Stripe Pat are complete.

Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep last 2 rows until Stripe Pat had been completed twice. Fasten off.

Motif (make 4).

With B, ch 5. Join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

1st rnd: Ch 5. (3 dc in ring. Ch 2) 3 times. 2 dc in ring. Join with sl st to 3rd ch of ch 5.

2nd rnd: Sl st in next ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same ch-2 sp. [Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

3rd rnd: Sl st in each of next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same ch-2 sp. [Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

**Finishing:** Sew 2 Motifs tog. Sew Motifs to each end of Scarf.

## Shimmering Lacy Bobble Scarf and Wristlets

Make a statement this winter with this Shimmering Lacy Bobble Scarf and Wristlets from Red Heart Yarn. If you get started early enough, you can make these unique Christmas gifts for family, friends, and co-workers!



### Materials:

- Red Heart® Shimmer™ Art. E763 available in 3.5 oz (100 g), 280 yd (256 m) balls: Scarf: 2 balls Red 1929; Wristlets: 1 ball Red 1929
- Crochet hooks: Scarf: 6mm [US J-10]; Wristlets: 4mm [US G-6]
- Yarn needle
- Scarf: 3" x 7" piece of cardboard

### Instructions:

**Gauge:** Scarf: 13 sts = 4"; 14 rows = 4" in pattern with 6mm hook. Wristlets: 16 sts = 4"; 14 rows = 4" in pattern with 4mm hook. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge given.

### Special Abbreviation:

Cl (cluster) = [Yo and draw up a loop, yo and draw through 2 loops] 3 times all in same stitch indicated, yo and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

**Note:** When pattern indicates to work into the back loop of a stitch, work into the furthest loop of the stitch away from you as it faces you. If working the last stitch of a row produces an uneven edge, work the last stitch as you would normally.

### Scarf:

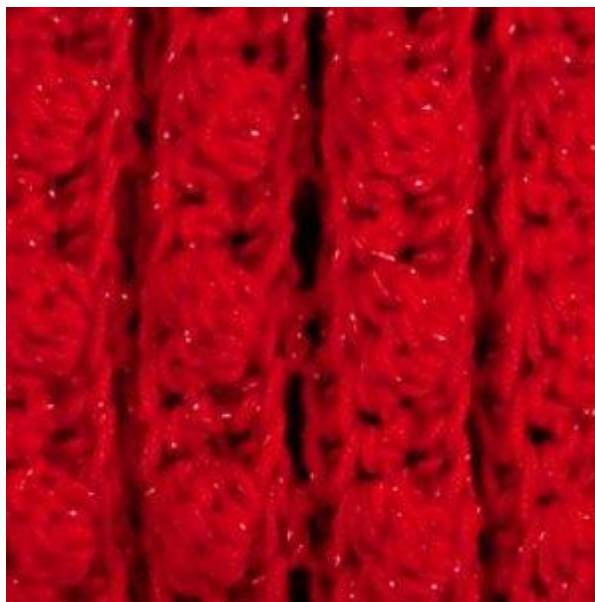
1. Row 1 (Right Side): Ch 241; sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; turn—240 sc.
2. Now work in back loops throughout, unless instructed otherwise.
3. Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, Cl in next sc, \* sc in next 2 sc, Cl in next sc; repeat from \* to last sc; sc in last sc; turn—80 Cl.
4. Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across; turn—240 sc.
5. Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, \* ch 2, skip 2 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from \* to last sc; sc in last sc; turn.

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6. Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first 2 sc, \* sc in back loops only of next 2 ch, sc in next sc; repeat from \* to last sc; sc in last sc; turn.
7. Repeat Rows 2-5 for pattern 4 times more, and then repeat Rows 2 and 3 once more. Fasten off. Weave in ends.
8. Tassel (make 10)
9. Cut a piece of yarn approximately 6" long to be used to tie tassel at the top. Place at top of cardboard. Wrap yarn lengthwise around cardboard 20 times, keeping 6" piece on top of cardboard. Tie the 6" piece around the wrapped yarn at the top edge of the cardboard to secure.
10. Cut wraps at bottom edge of the cardboard. Wrap another length of yarn around the tassel approximately one-inch down from the first tie. Trim bottom of tassel evenly. Using the original 6" piece at top of tassel, attach 5 tassels evenly spaced across each short edge of scarf.

### Wristlets (make 2):

1. Row 1 (Right Side): Ch 34; sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; turn—33 sc.
2. Now work in back loops throughout, unless instructed otherwise.
3. Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, Cl in next sc, \* sc in next 2 sc, Cl in next sc; repeat from \* to last sc; sc in last sc; turn—11 Cl.
4. Rows 3-5: Ch 1, sc in each st across; turn—33 sc.
5. Repeat Rows 2-5 for pattern 5 times more, and then repeat Rows 2-4 once more. Fasten off, leaving a 15" strand. With yarn needle and strand, sew top of last row to beginning ch, matching stitch for stitch. Weave in ends.
