

Brothers and sisters in Christ, Each month of the liturgical year is dedicated to a different devotion. May is Mary's month, November is for the souls of the faithful departed, etc., yet July is dedicated to devotion to the Precious Blood of Our Lord, which might strike some folks

as a little bit "too Catholic". I mean, really, a month dedicated to blood?!?! Yet if we look a bit deeper, we will soon find that what appears to be a marginal devotion belongs to the very heart of the Christian mystery.

Christ's Blood, "poured out for you and for many", as the Mass says, restores our fallen relationship with God, who was gravely offended by the slaughter of Abel by his brother Cain (Gen. 4) and who hates every slaughter of the innocent at the hands of the ruthless. The blood of Abel cried out for justice, for someone to make right a broken situation. Later, in the midst of their slavery, the Israelites spread the blood of an innocent lamb over the doorposts of their houses in Egypt to signal their belonging to God (Ex. 12). The blood of this innocent animal served to rescue them from bondage to their overlords. Among other moments in salvation history, these two are revisited and fulfilled in Christ.

So while Christ's Death on the Cross was a bitter shock to His followers, once He rose from the dead the Holy Spirit began to uncover for them the many ways that this had been foreshadowed long before. Christ is the innocent victim, who was like us in all things but sin (Heb. 4), who lays down His life out of love for His sheep, that they "may have life and have it abundantly" (In. 10). His word on the Cross, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do," (Lk. 23:34) asks pardon for every offense against God. His Blood, not spread over the doorposts of houses but consumed through the appearance of wine, makes us 'white as snow' (justifies us) before God, strengthens us in virtue, and gives us a taste of the heavenly wedding banquet to come. Christ promises us His followers today, "he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day" (Jn. 6:54).

Though sacramentally we have different understandings of the Eucharist, the Protestants share our deep intuition regarding our salvation through the Blood of Christ. As one song states, "Oh! precious is the flow/That makes me white as snow;/No other fount I know,/Nothing but the blood of Jesus." This intuition should be deep within our Catholic bones because we encounter this reality every time we come to Mass. We see, represented and realized, the sacrifice of Christ's Body and Blood upon the Cross of Calvary at each Mass that is celebrated. This gritty realism is not visible to the naked eye, however, and belongs to the order of faith. The bread and wine that we see, the ordinariness of the experience, do not strike us as supernatural at first glance, but we believe by faith that something truly extraordinary is happening. Lord, help us to believe more deeply



in the mysteries we encounter at each Mass!
