

Got an Hour? Want to make a difference?

There are many seniors in Weymouth who could use an hour of your time. According to a 2011 report from the U.S. Administration on Aging, there are roughly 11 million seniors living alone in their homes and nearly 1.5 million seniors in nursing homes at any given time. This number has certainly increased over the past four years. The results of a decade long study from the University College London on the impact of loneliness and isolation has shown that both loneliness and infrequent contact with friends and family can, independently, shorten a person's life. *Your time, just an hour of it, can make a difference*.

Weymouth Elder Services is committed to improving the lives of all residents over the age of sixty. Homebound elders are often invisible, an hour of your time visiting, helping with shopping or driving someone who can no longer drive to a doctor's appointment or to visit a spouse in a nursing home can make a world of difference.

FROM ANN IN THE OUTREACH OFFICE

I've decided to focus on the topic of how important it is to have certain legal documents in place as we grow older. It is very important for everyone to have a Health Care Proxy, Power of Attorney, and a Will in place in order to make sure your wishes are followed through, whether it is regarding your medical well being or your assets. This is why I would like to provide our clients with a beneficial resource so that more clients can have these documents in place.

The Elder Law Project of the Women's Bar Association assists low income seniors throughout the Commonwealth. The ELP makes presentations to elders at senior centers and low income elderly housing developments to explain the purpose and importance of these end-of-life documents such as simple wills, health care proxies, and powers of attorney. Low income seniors who are interested in having such documents prepared meet with the volunteer attorneys for free.

Eligibility Requirements:

Individual: Income must be under \$27,225 and Assets under \$40,000. Married Couple: Income of \$36,000 or less and assets combined under \$55,000. Homeowners: May have up to \$814,000 in home equity.

If you are not income eligible, two attorneys are available once a month at the Whipple Senior Center for a free 30 minute consultation, Attorney Gerald Murphy and Attorney Michael O'Neil. Please call the reception desk at 781-682-6140 to make an appointment.

Massachusetts power of attorney forms are used mainly because for many people, sickness, advanced age, or an accident can lead to a temporary or permanent state of mental instability. Therefore your finances will still need to be attended to, and the need to make forceful decisions about the course of your health care will now need guidance. This is why it's important to take a few simple steps and designate someone whom you trust to make these decisions on your behalf. Through a Massachusetts Financial Power of Attorney, you can name an Attorney-In-Fact to assume control of your financial affairs when and if it becomes necessary.

You can also make your wishes known for the conduct of our health care through two documents: the Health Care Proxy and the Document Directing Health Care.

All documents must be made in accordance with the Massachusetts Probate Code which calls for all documents to be signed with at least two (2) witnesses or a notary public (unless stated otherwise).

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
