#### CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

# First Sitting

The thirteenth annual conference of the Arizona-New Mexico District convened at Phoenix Calvary Church at 9:00 A.M., May 21, 1968.

The first session opened with words of greeting from our District Superintendent and host pastor, Rev. John Dunn.

Charlie Long led the congregation in singing, "Amazing Grace" and "Near The Cross".

We were led in prayer by Rev. Galen Anderson, pastor of the East Side Wesleyan Methodist Church of Phoenix.

Rev. W. N. Miller, Church Extension Secretary, was introduced to the Conference: He brought the morning message and was also Chairman for the business session.

His message was prefaced by an appeal concerning the importance of the local church, and that it is the pulse of the denomination. In these opening remarks, he urged the churches to cease making excuses. To move from defending the faith to extending it. To produce better reports instead of protecting bad ones.

Rev. Miller read Psalm 96 and based his message on excerpts from it and the 95th and 97th Psalm also.

In these Psalms we see:

THE FORM OF WORSHIP "let us sing unto the Lord" 95:1 "come before His presence" 95:2 "come let us worship and bow down", "let us kneel" 95:6 "bring an offering" 96:8 THE FOCUS OF WORSHIP excitement in the Revelation of God 97:1 variety where God is 97:2-7 rejoicing 97:8

These truths were applied in a practical way to our day.

The roll was called with 39 conference members present.

The conference bar was set at the first 5 rows of seats and the platform.

New ministers were introduced and seated. They were: Oscar Terry from Southern Indiana, Frederick Cromer from Faith Mission and James Willis from Rocky Mountain.

Wesleyan Methodist Ministers, Robert Girard, Galen Anderson and Carl Jackson were introduced and given an honorary seat within the bar as was retired Wesleyan Methodist Minister, W. D. Shelor.

The time for adjournment was set at 12:00 noon, reconvening at 1:30 P.M. and continuing until the close of business.

The following were appointed as ushers: Vernon Brown, Harold Slavens and Rick Patecel

The District Superintendent's report was given. This report was prefaced by introducing Mrs. Josephine Coffman to the conference and honoring her for sixty-five years of membership in the Pilgrim Holiness Church. She was given an honorary seat within the bar.

Rev. Dunn exhorted the conference fervently from the seven points listed in his prepared report. Rev. Dunn recommended that the conference adopt as it's motto: "Extend, Don't Defend". His report was adopted with a hearty "amen".

Assistant District Superintendent, Melvin Lockard, gave a verbal report of his labors in cooperation with Superintendent Dunn.

The Auditor's Report was read which approved the annual report and books of the District Treasurer.

The District Treasurer, Denzel Clouse, presented the annual financial report with a financial statement of the District Corporation. A motion was heartily approved to accept this fine report.

The District Sunday School Secretary read a summary report of Sunday School statistics

The Statistician's Report was read by Melvin Lockard in the absence of Statistician David Miller. This report was received by acclamation.

The Education and Examining Committee report was read by Melvin Lockard and received by motion.

The report of the Conference Action Committee was read, discussed and amended as follows: Be It Resolved to delete the statement under BUDGED #2, "Be it Resolved that the District Treasurer receipt the local church quarterly, giving credit on the amount of tithe paid by their pastor. The District Superintendent's tithe shall be receipted to the church of his choice."

The Conference Action Committee Report was then adopted as amended.

A motion carried to change the time of recess to 11:30 A.M. and to reconvene at 1:00 P.M. and that the first order of business be the reading of the Comity Committee Report.

The First Sitting was closed with prayer.

# Second Sitting

The afternoon session began with the singing of the lively gospel song, "Wonderful".

Prayer was offered by Willard Metz.

Rev. Miller gave a stirring account of God's workings, in answer to prayer, in another Church Extension District.

The Comity Committee presented it's report of action concerning district boundaries in the merged church. The resolution of the Arizona-New Mexico Committee was read and a motion was made and seconded to receive it. It read as follows:

"BE IT RESOLVED that the Arizona-New Mexico District continue with it's present district boundaries within the Department of Church Extension. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we welcome and invite the two Wesleyan Methodist Churches of Scottsdale and East Phoenix to be a part of the Arizona-New Mexico District. FURTHERMORE, it is our hope that the matter of district boundaries can be resolved so as not to impair but to enhance the united front of the New WESLEYAN CHURCH".

After much discussion by Ministers and laymen alike, a motion to cease discussion and vote on the resolution carried. By secret ballot, the recommendation of the Comity Committee was carried with 37 "yes" votes and one "no" vote.

Stetson hats were presented to two pastors, Rev. Underwood and Rev. Bailey, as awards for reaching prescribed goals in their local churches.

Rev. Robert Girard made a statement expressing interest toward merging the Wesleyan Methodist Churches in Arizona with our District after merger of the Denominations is completed.

The District Council presented a resolution as follows:

"BE IT RESOLVED that, should the Scottsdale and East Phoenix Wesleyan

Methodist Churches unite with our District, the two pastors, Robert

Girard and Galen Anderson, be seated as members of the District Council for the balance of the conference year." This recommendation was received with overwhelming favor.

The Memoirs Committee brought a report of the death of one member of our district this year. Prayer was offered by C. J. Meyers.

After a ten minute recess, Rev. Miller presented the three star certificates to four of our churches: Apache Junction, Glendale, Phoenix Calvary and Tucson Parkview.

The next order of business was the election of officers. Two nominations were brought from the General Board for the office of District Superintendent. They were: John Dunn

John Dunn was elected on the first ballot.

and Melvin Lockard.

Melvin Lockard was elected as Assistant Superintendent on the first ballot.

Nominations were brought to the Conference from the District Council for the election of the other officers.

M. E. Turner was elected District Secretary on the first ballot.

Denzel Clouse was elected District Treasurer on the first ballot.

The advisory member of the District Council was not elected on the first ballot. A second ballot elected Arthur Hunter.

For a three year term on the Board of Trustees, Charlie Long was elected on the first ballot.

G. C. Avery was elected to the Education and Examining Board.

The appointments by the District Council were read.

The Conference Action Committee brought in a final resolution:

"BE IT RESOLVED that this annual conference express it's disappointment that General Superintendent Abbott was detained by matters of Merger and was unable to chair our conference. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that with real thanksgiving and appreciation we thank Church Extension Secretary, W. N. Miller, for his able direction and leadership".

This resolution was received with expressions of thanks.

It was moved and carried to have the District Council approve the minutes of this Conference.

The delegates to the International and the Merging Conference were introduced.

The Conference was dismissed with prayer by Rev. W. N. Miller.

#### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

#### LOCAL CHURCH

- I. The local churches shall provide modern cooling, cooking and heating facilities for the parsonage, the type of facilities to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated, and all churches in the conference shall pay the utilities for the parsonages.
- 2. Each local church is urged to raise a subscription list to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate equal to its total family membership. (Revised 1965)
- 3. BE IT RESOLVED that all local indebtedness involving an expenditure of more than \$500, where financing is involved, be approved by the District Council. (1960) 4. BE IT RESOLVED that all non-Pilgrim Evangelists must first have the approval of the District Superintendent or the District Council before being called for evangelistic activity in our churches. (1960)
- 5. BE IT RESOLVED that no church may borrow from its pastor or District Superintendent, nor may any pastor underwrite loans for a church so as to make himself legally responsible as an individual, without the prior consent of the District Council. (1961- Revised 1967)
- 6. BE IT RESOLVED that a call pastor meeting be conducted between the first two Sundays of March. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the absence of the District Superintendent, the Church Secretary conduct said meeting. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the pastor present a letter of answer to the District Superintendent within 15 days of acceptance or rejection of call. It is understood that each pastor enters into a moral contract when accepting a call to a church and should do everything possible to honor the term of his call. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that retiring pastors terminate their services on the 2nd Sunday in June. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Church Secretary count the ballots and notify the pastor and District Superintendent at the close of the election. (1965)
- 7. In the interest of good business practice, BE IT RESOLVED that the offerings received in the local churches be counted cooperatively by both the Secretary and the Treasurer of the Congregation or designated parties appointed by the local church board and that the pastor consistently be informed of offering receipts each Sunday. (1965)
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED that budget monies be forwarded to the District Treasurer by the local church treasurers no later than the 10th of each month. (1965)
- 9. In order to present the privileges and responsibilities of Church Membership, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that each church conduct Church Membership Classes, with a minimum of four sessions for adult membership. The instruction is to be in the following areas: 1. Articles of Faith. 2. Church History. 3. Church Organization and Finance. 4. The Church Covenant. (1966)

#### CONFERENCE

- 1. The District Council and the following committees and boards shall meet at least 30 days prior to the Annual Conference to take care of such work as they have at hand: Conference Action Committee and the Educational and Examining Board.
- 2. In order that the relatives and friends may know the set time for the ordaining of ministers, BE IT RESOLVED that the Ordination Service take place at 4:00 P.M. the first day of Conference. (1957)
- 3. The Education and Examining Boards shall be combined and this Board shall consist of three members, one being elected for a period of three years, one for two years and one for one year.

# Standing Resolutions Conference (continued)

- 4. There shall be a Memoirs Committee which shall annually list departed members by name, date of decease and church for inclusion in the Conference Journal. In case of ministers, there shall be a picture and a brief resume of ministerial labors.
- 5. BE IT PESOLVED that the district furnish credential forms to each local church conference delegate and alternate to be filled out and signed by the pastor and the church secretary, and sent to the district secretary at least 30 days prior to Conference. (1959)
- 6. BE IT PESOLVED that the District Trustees and the Statistician be made permanent members of the District Conference. (1959)
- 7. INASMUCH AS there is such close correlation between the work of the Resolutions Committee and the Ways and Means Committee, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that there be an appointment of a Conference Action Committee of 5 members, which would combine the functions and capacities of the Resolutions and Ways and Means Committees. (1960)
- 8. BE IT PESOLVED that there be an appointment of a Building Appraisal Committee (competent in the field of Appraisal) the function of which shall be to set the value of all church property. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appointment of this committee be made bi-annually. BE IT FURTHER PESOLVED that all properties acquired between these appraisals shall be carried as tentatively appraised by the District Council until the next general appraisal. (Revised 1961)
- 9. BE IT RESOLVED that the conference year of the Arizona-New Mexico District shall begin April 1 and end March 31 the following year, and that all reports be sent to the District Superintendent and District Statistician by April 15. (Revised 1965)
- 10. WHEREAS the District Conference expenses for pastors and delegates is to be paid by the local churches, and WHEREAS this creates a disadvantage for the churches at greater distances from the place of conference, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the total expense for District Officers, pastors and delegates be pro-rated and paid on a basis similar to the General Conference system, for automobile travel. (1962)
- ll. BE IT RESOLVED that the District Conference of the Arizona-New Mexico District be held annually on the Tuesday following the third Sunday in May with the following schedule of sessions: 9:00 A.M. 11:30 A.M.; 1:30 P.M. 5:00 P.M.; 7:00 P.M. 9:00 P.M. or until business is completed. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the District Missionary Conference be held the day prior to the Annual District Conference and that the District Youth Conference be held the first Saturday of May. (1965 Revised 1967)
- 12. BE IT RESOLVED that the Ministerial Convention be held annually on Tuesday and Wednesday following the second Sunday in October. (1965 as amended)

#### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the District pay \$125.00 per month on the salary of the District Superintendent. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the District Superintendent be remunerated for meals and lodging incidental to travel. (Revised 1967)

#### MINISTERIAL

1. BE IT RESOLVED that we accept the Blue Cross, Blue Shield group hospitalization, surgical and medical plan. And BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the churches pay \$5.00 per month to be applied to the pastor's premium, and the district pay \$5.00 per month to be applied to the District Superintendent's premium. (1959 - Revised 1962 & 1966)

## Ministerial (continued)

- 2. BE IT RESOLVED that each pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with full salary. BE IT FUETHER RESOLVED that a pastor with 10 years of pastoral service, including two consecutive years on the Arizona-New Mexico District, shall be granted three weeks annual vacation with pay. (1967)
- 3. BE IT RESOLVED that when ministers come to this district from another denomination, that the Executive Officer of the transferring minister be contacted by the District Superintendent asking for a recommendation, to be in the hands of the District Council at least 30 days prior to moving date. Superintendent Dunn, members of the annual missionary conference of the Arizona-New Mexico District and friends.

Our hearts rejoice as we review the labors and achievements of the year behind us. True, there is disappointment over losses sustained. Only eight societies reported, where last year there were eleven, but of these eight, four - 50% - achieved the goal for which they labored diligently - the honor of being recognized as SILVER STAR SOCIETIES, by the International Office of the Missionary Society of World Missions. Their labors, as well as those of the societies who were unable to meet the high requirements for the Silver Star, are reflected in excellent increases in many areas of our missionary work.

Last year, fifteen were enrolled in our Reading Course - this year, fifty-two. Last year, twenty-eight participated in the Prayer and Fasting program - this year, sixty-nine. Our cash receipts show an increase of \$1,716.46 and in our total in all giving, there is an increase of \$1,380.42. The total in cash receipts of \$5,450.53 is the highest recorded since the organization of the missionary society in this District.

We are deeply grateful for the faithfulness of dedicated leaders and the cooperation of every society member who have made this good report possible. Most of all, we are grateful for the blessing of the Lord Jesus Christ, in whose name we serve and for the leadership of the Holy Spirit.
