

Knights of Columbus



2018 DIAPER DRIVE: Our annual Diaper Drive in support of The Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank starts this weekend! Diapers of any size, through adult, are needed! We are especially in need of newborn, size one, and size six at this time.

Because of the expense of disposable diapers, some babies are kept in the same diaper all day, and sometimes caretakers are even reusing diapers. Many families are simply unable to afford to purchase disposable diapers. Most daycares require a full day's supply of disposable diapers, or they will not accept the child. If parents don't have daycare, they can't go to work, and if they can't go to work, they can't buy diapers. For many, cloth diapers are not a solution because they either don't have a washer/dryer or don't have money for the water bill. Government-assisted programs like WIC and Food Stamps will not allow you to purchase items such as diapers.

The need is getting greater. We continue to get requests for over 100,000 diapers per month. Donations of diapers of any size, including adult, are gladly accepted. Also, monetary donations may be made. Donations allow us to purchase diapers at a discount to fill in the gaps of the diaper sizes we do not receive from the diaper drives. Checks should be made out to Greater Hampton Roads Diaper Bank.

Parishioners who are unable to walk in the communion line to receive the Eucharist during weekend Masses are asked to inform an Usher *before* Mass begins each week. This will ensure that the head usher directs the Deacon to your seat with the Host and that you do not miss the opportunity to receive Our Lord.

Couples who would like to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony at St. Celebrating John's must contact Carole Romanini, Wedding Coordinator, at the parish office (426-2180). A minimum of six to nine months is normative for the preparation process after completing Marr and submitting the parish wedding application and reviewing our policy booklet.



Infant baptisms (for children from birth to just before the 7th birthday) are scheduled throughout the year at various Masses. <u>Baptisms are not</u> performed during the solemn season of Lent (between Ash Wednesday and

Easter Sunday). Before scheduling their child's baptism, parents are required to participate in a baptism preparation class. 
