

Graduates have been exposed to the MAINSTREAM (MS) Program and have developed some skills in reacting to these calls. To become more comfortable in the MS Program it is suggested that graduates come dance at any and all of the following MAINSTREAM CLUBS: Belles & Beaux; Circle Eights; Hix & Chix on 2/4 Thursdays; Lakeland Squares;

Ocean Waves; Rutgers Promenaders; Solitaires; Tenafly Squares; Tenakill Twirlers; Warren Wheelers; Western Wheelers on 2nd Wednesdays; & Y Squares. Hill City Squares will have alternate Plus Program and MAINSTREAM tips. Country Promenaders will also revamp its program to encourage new dancers.

Graduates: To discover for yourselves the fun & fellowship of the S/D activity, get out and mingle & mix at as many clubs as you can. There's a whole new world of friendships out there just waiting to be discovered. Enjoy! We look forward to meeting you in a square. Happy dancing!



To enhance your reading pleasure: In the 1st section of G/S are articles dealing with NNJSDA & its programs. Next comes club news. While every club is encouraged to submit news, some overlook deadlines. Club headings include hall addresses & the S/D Program in (). Newer dancers will be most comfortable at (MS). Club reporter & phone #, page of ad concludes every article. This year, clubs are listed in reverse alphabetical order. Teen Club news is preceded by Sewing Page. News of other organizations, covering the many facets within our activity, follows beginning with CALLERLAB, ROUNDALAB, LEGACY, etc. A section devoted to R/D news & the Rom is next. The remaining pages, necessary to bring it to a # \* by 4 are devoted to non-member clubs. The back cover features a universal monthly calendar of club dance nites & club cancellations. # CATLITERILATE

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

Why LISTS and PROGRAMS?

CALLERLAB lists were developed to promote guidance to those who teach S/D classes, to callers for programming appropriate programs

for the dances they call & to dancers for scheduling dances they enjoy the most. The programs are NOT intended to segregate dancers into exclusive groups - nor to indicate that one who chooses to dance at any one program is any better or any worse than any other dancer. Dancing skills can be achieved at many programs, & the quantity of calls is not necessarily an indication of dancer proficiency. The lists are to be used to aid in a logical teaching progression and thorough coverage of basics in classes and to provide an enjoyable modern S/D for dancers of all inclinations.

CALLERLAB"S intent is also that approved styling & timing of movements will be an integral part of ALL classes which will result in smooth flowing dancing to the music.

CALLERLAB recommends 41 sessions of 2 to 2½ hours each be used to teach the full MAINSTREAM (MS) Program. Responsible leaders recommend that dancers dance regularly at the program at which they graduate for at least 1 year before they enter into workshops for additional programs.

This means that if you graduate at the MS Program, it is suggested you dance at this program for a year before going into the PLUS Program. If you graduate at the Plus (+) Program, stay there dancing a year before going into Advanced....or as long as you are enjoying it and having fun. Some dancers NEVER move into a different program, they enjoy where they are dancing and the friendships formed.

There should be NO pressure for movement from one program to another once a dancer has graduated. Dancers should be encouraged to take their time, and smell the daisies along the way and learn to dance well at their chosen program. Your NNJSDA has a summer full of Wednesday MS dancing. Graduates - come out and enjoy your newly learned skills. Happy dancing!

Let's talk about figure faults. Of course none of us have any, as we are either tall, leggy and willowy, or short, tiny and adoreable. For the rest of us, a few tips might help.

When choosing a square dance dress the first fact considered should be color. The color should flatter your skin and hair coloring. Just because everyone is wearing purple doesn't mean purple is for you.

The second factor should be the style of the garment. If you are heavy on top avoid ruffling at the neckline, leave this for the gal who is not so well endowed. If you have more than one chin avoid high collared necklines. A soft V line or a bateau neckline will be best.



The third problem area is the waistline. If you'are fully packed here do not wear a gathered waistline, try a circular skirt. This style affords a trimmer line. Crinolines generally hide the hips.



Sleeves play an important part. Heavy arms should avoid short puffy sleeves, they emphasize fullness. Sleeveless dresses are for thin arms. A simple cape collar is nice over the bare arm if the arm is heavy.



The last important point is length. Do not wear your dresses too long or too short for your figure. Fat legs, short legs, knobby knees, what can be done, there is a flattering length for everyone, experiment and find yours.

The Language of Square

There seems to be a great deal of variety & confusion regarding the designation of dance programs...such as MS+, MSQS, Soft Plus

etc. In reality there are no such CALLERLAB approved designations. correct program designations are shown below:

BASIC Program (B) - Numbers '1 thru 49 on CALLERLAB approved list (4/18/84) MAINSTREAM Program (MS) - # 1 thru 68 on "

PLUS (+) - The MS Program & the 28 calls on CALLERLAB Plus Program " ADVANCED ONE (A1) - MS,+ Programs & 38 calls on " A - 1 Program"

ADVANCED TWO (A2) - MS,+ Programs plus 78 calls " A - 2 " BASIC CHALLENGE (C1) - MS,+, Advanced & the 64 calls on C - 1 11 11

EXTENDED CHALLENGE (C2) - MS,+, Advanced, C1 & 76 calls C - 2

Quarterly Selections are movements put out by CALLERLAB for callers to use only if the dancers want just a little more out of the program they are dancing but do not want to go on to the next program. There are now Quarterly Selections for the MS,+, and ADVANCED Programs. Each program has a different movement out every three months unless the CALLERLAB Committee says there is no movement for that period. The Quarterly Selections tions are staggered - MS is the first month of the quarter; + is the 2nd month, and ADVANCED is the third month.

There is NO program called Quarterly Selection. These experimentals are intended for use in that program's workshops. No dancer is required to know the Quarterly Selection in order to attend that program's open dances. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Each of these movements remains as Quarterly Selections until the next CALLERLAB Meeting. Then the membership votes to keep or drop the moves as Quarterly Selections. If kept on the list for 4 years, it may be put on

the program if the committee will accept it, or dropped.






