Even now this year, with the Delta variant spreading like wildfire, that virus is still affecting so many aspects of our lives once again. However, I want to be positive that we can still have our chapter socials and be able to interact with our own social connections but also simultaneously practice safety amongst each other.

As most of you know, you can find the scoring system for those entries in the VSC Standing Rules, when it comes time to judge for the Lisa Files Social Award. I will go ahead and list it here.

- 1) Social events reported during the year 36 possible points (Maximum points for 9 events, 4 points deducted for each failure to report. In the event more than 9 events are reported, the best 9 shall be considered for judging.)
- 2) Social Event 40 points
- 3) Theme 10 points

- 4) Originality 10 points
- 5) Method of execution (this should include everything used to carry out the theme and make the event a success—invitations, decorations, entertainment, refreshments, etc. Pictures and any outing publications should also be included.) Reports may be electronically transmitted by the deadline specified. In the event pictures, invitations and other outing publications are transmitted, it will not be necessary for the chairman to individually print each document. However, notation must be made on original report as to what was transmitted in order that points may be awarded accordingly. 20 points
- 6) Percentage of members attending 24 points


We presently have 9 members, and would love anyone to join in on our monthly meetings.



Bring your lounge chair, coolers, extra snacks and drinks. Wear comfy shoes for walking the trails, volleyball, basketball or miniature golf (basic).

Group Reservations at OLD OAK CAFÉ –6 PM\* on Friday night. Good food! I love their catfish and baked potatoes. Steak, chicken, hamburgers and salads will be offered. \*Serving dinner just for us so please plan on eating with us.

Beds will be made prior to arrival with fresh comforters and pillows—not used by campers. Directions vary so use GPS and follow 4-H camp signs when in the Moneta-Scruggs area. NOTE THE BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY HAS MANY DETOURS DUE TO SPRING STORMS AND BRIDGES OUT. Contact Blue Ridge Parkway for information.

Saturday Buffet Breakfast will be in dining hall 7:30-8:30 AM. Group Leadership meeting prior to going to D-Day Memorial in Bedford, VA. We will car pool to that area; No buses available due to COVID. For those not wanting to do tour, Bedford has many lovely downtown attractions—antiques, coffee houses, art galleries, New BEDFORD BOYS MUSEUM downtown, and Beale's Beer. Nearby one can visit Popular Forest-Jefferson's summer home, Emerson Pottery or wineries in the area. Those of you who collect VIRGINIA LOVE Signs, find Bedford's version designed by local students.
