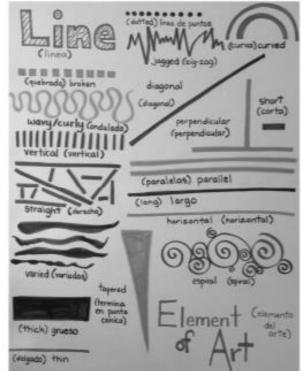


LINE TYPES

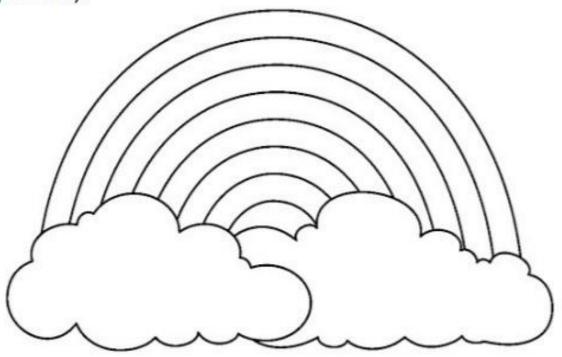

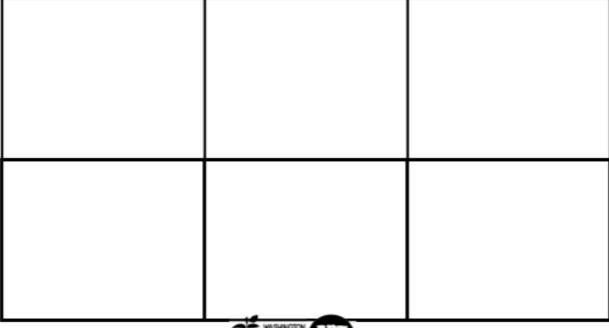

Week 4 Focus - Balance, Muscle Strength and Endurance

- Balance Balances on different bases of support, combining levels and shapes; maintains momentary stillness on base of support (stand on 1 foot with arms out)
- Strength/Endurance Use your own body resistance for developing muscle strength and muscle endurance.
 Examples include animal walks, planks, shoulder taps, hold a bridge.

Warm-Up: Jumping Jack ABC's / Math Jacks

- Complete 1 jumping jack for every letter of the alphabet. Now you've got your heart pumping blood to your muscles and you're ready to get active!
- Complete jumping jacks counting by 5's to 100. Congratulations you just completed 20 total jumping jacks.
