

## **2. Chief Executives' business trips – Number, cost and benefit**

The Chief Executive of the **Department of Infrastructure** has taken two off-Island business trips in the last five years. Both of these trips related to the proposed new Liverpool Landing Stage and the combined cost of the trips was £210.

The cost benefit to the Department and the economy is unmeasurable. The securing of a link to Liverpool has been identified by the Department and supported by Tynwald as a key mechanism in delivering the Strategic Sea Services policy aspiration to ensure that our strategic sea service meets both our social and economic needs. In addition ensuring a replacement landing stage in Liverpool is

also recognised within the programme for Government as a priority for delivery by December 2019. The business trips undertaken by the Chief Executive were an essential element in ensuring that this scheme is delivered within the prescribed timeframes.
