

DR. JASON PAUL MOSES, PT, DPT, OCS, COMT, FAAOMPT

Dr. Moses owns and practices at Summit Peak Physical Therapy in Arlington, Texas. He graduated from Union College in 2003 with degrees in psychology and chemistry, then went on to earn his Doctorate of Physical Therapy degree from Loma Linda University in 2006. He is boardcertified as an Orthopedic Clinical Specialist and as a Certified Orthopedic Manipulative Therapist with emphasis on the spine. ACADEMIC REGALIA

The pageantry and costume of the college commencement is a part of the traditional setting of higher education extending back into the late Middle Ages. Beginning as everyday wear for students and faculty, today's academic regalia is symbolic of academic achievement and distinction. Academic life began in the church and then in the guilds. The teaching guild was the Guild of the Masters of Arts, where the Bachelor was the apprentice of the Master and the dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. Rather early colleges and universities set rules to preserve the dignity and meaning of academic dress. Most American universities have adopted a uniform code for the costumes, drafted and occasionally revised by the American Council on Education.

GOWN The usual color of the gown is black. The doctor's gown is trimmed with a wide velvet band on either side at the front and with three velvet bars across the upper portion of the sleeve. Gowns of the bachelor or master are untrimmed.

HOOD The hood, which passes around the neck and extends down the back, is the most distinctive item of the costume. It is lined with the official colors of the college conferring the degree; these colors appear where the hood turns outward at the center back. The bands of velvet on the center turnback indicate the branch of learning. The width of the band and the length of the hood are greater for master's degrees.

CAP The mortarboard or beret is worn with all degrees. The color of the tassel denotes the discipline. Gold tassels indicate the doctor's degree.

COLOR Colors associated with the branches of learning are exhibited either on the tassels of the graduates or on the hoods of the faculty as indicated above. Gold on the student hood indicates a Bachelor of Science; white indicates a Bachelor of Arts. Black and red are Union College's school colors.

CARY AND PAM DECAMP PRESIDENT'S AWARD 2019 HONOREES

Cary and Pam DeCamp's connection with Union began in 1982 when they both enrolled—and they valued their experience so much they continue to invest in Union's success for future generations.

An investment of time and expertise

In October, 2009 Cary joined the Union College Board of Trustees serving on the marketing and recruitment committee. In this role, Cary shares his passion for branding strategies and connecting with the customer in meaningful ways.

He challenged Union leadership to be aspirational and transformative as he guided them through the process of developing a vision narrative—a document that is the driving force for strategic decisions shaping Union's present and future.

Cary also spent months assisting Union's marketing and recruitment teams with research and strategy development to improve marketing and lead management. He then led an effort to raise funds for a partnership to improve the way Union engages prospective college students and their parents through the right channels, with the right messages, at pivotal moments.

Investing financial resources

Cary and Pam have inspired Union College to dream bigger on a number of projects, most recently the Learning and Living campaign, which will transform the administration building amphitheater and dorm rooms. The DeCamps valued the Krueger Center campaign and helped realize the new facility.

A life story that began at Union

Cary studied business administration and graduated in 1985. He appreciated the people willing to listen to his ideas as a student, which allowed him to shape an academic experience tailored to his interests. He credits Union College with setting him up for career success through people who effectively prepared him to find and pursue his life calling. As a student, he was the general manager of KUCV, the college radio station at the time, and continued in that role for two years following graduation.

Pam's academic career was shaped by caring faculty who went out of their way to help her succeed. She received her nursing degree in 1986 and started her nursing career at Porter Hospital in Denver.

After Cary embraced numerous career opportunities he took on a lead role at Perceptive Software, helping build an enterprise software startup from virtually nothing to 1,000 employees serving customers in 67 countries and over 1,000 employees. He eventually left to pursue other endeavors when the company was acquired by Lexmark International.

Today Cary continues his entrepreneurial ventures—including real estate development, equity financing and counsel for early stage technology companies. He enjoys performing music at his church and serves on the board of the Kansas City Symphony.

Pam has enjoyed an accomplished career as an operating room nurse and is highly respected for her professional skill and affable approach in dealing with people. She enjoys numerous hobbies, including quilting, and is an active volunteer through the New Haven Adventist Church with the Interfaith Hospitality Network, which provides housing for homeless families.
