ost Sundays you will see Jessica Bentley-Sassaman standing at the front of the church during the 9:30 worship service interpreting the worship songs and morning message to the members of the Cornerstone family who are deaf or hard-of-hearing.

Finding the loves of her life


About a year after Jessica graduated from ManheimTownship High School and moved to Kentucky, she figured out what she wanted to do with her life. She came back to Pennsylvania and attended Bloomsburg University for a B.S. in Interpreting for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. And it was there she met a Perry County boy named Joe. "I was Joe's orientation leader and we hit it off as friends. A little while later we began dating and nearly 13 years later here we are!"

Jessica went on for higher education at Gallaudet University in Washington, D.C. (the only liberal arts college for the Deaf). where she earned a M.A.

in the Linguistics of American Sign Language. Jessica also earned her doctorate (Ed.D.) from Walden University. Her research is focused on the experiences of Deaf and hearing interpreter teams.

Joe grew up on his family's farm in Perry County. He graduated from Susquenita High School and then Bloomsburg University, where he obtained a degree in Geography-Environmental Planning. He then continued his education at Shippensburg University, earning an M.S. in Geo-Environmental Studies.

"Other than my college years and a summer in Bellingham, Washington as an outdoor adventure educator," Joe says, "I've lived on the family farm. Jessica and I now live on the



farm, and I am the sixth generation on my mom's side of the family to live on the property." Jessica spent the first two-and-a-half years of her life in Champagne-Urbana, Illinois before her family moved to Pennsylvania. "I grew up in Lancaster," Jessica says, "but I've also lived in Louisville, Kentucky; Cincinnati, Ohio; and Washington, D.C., as well as Enola and Bloomsburg."

Actively involved

Joe and Jessica have been attending Cornerstone for three years. "When we moved to the area, we visited a few different churches," Jessica says. "But I found out about Cornerstone while getting a manicure. A friend and I were

getting our nails done and we were talking about churches and visiting churches. The manicurist then mentioned her church—Cornerstone Christian Church in Duncannon. A little while later we visited Cornerstone and we liked it right away. We enjoy the fellowship and learning more about God and His will for His people. Cornerstone is a very welcoming place. I've had some bad experiences at churches where people seemed fake, so it was so nice to come to a place where people are truly happy to see you and make you feel 'at home.'"

Along with interpreting the first service for the Deaf, Jessica attends and hosts a Journey Group and is a co-leader for DivorceCare 4 Kids. "We participate in the Drive-Thru Nativity and are both involved in Building Blocks," says Jessica. "Joe leads a Journey Group and he is on a chair setup team. He also helped map the trails here at Cornerstone."

Joe says, "Being at Cornerstone has definitely enhanced our relationship with God. Through participating in Journey Groups doing the "Digging Deeper" and other studies we are learning more about God and Jesus. Not just more of the history, but also the application of the Word today and how it impacts our life."

Blessed? You bet!

"God has given me my husband, who has been a rock in my life," declares Jessica. "He supported me through my doctorate, as well as other endeavors. He makes me smile and laugh, and knows how to cheer me up. Just seeing him will bring a smile to my face. We have been blessed with a lovely house and a new dog, Maddie, a four-year-old white Lab. God has also blessed us with wonderful families and friends. We're down to earth. We have a very strong marriage and relationship. We've have been together for coming up on 13 years and married for almost six. God has blessed us with love for one another. We know his hand is on our marriage and that everything that we have comes from Him."

Joe's parents influenced his life by creating in him a love for nature. "That led me into my career. I work for the Department of Environmental Protection in the Bureau of Abandoned Mine Reclamation as an geologic specialist. I feel I can improve the environment while helping everyday citizens increase the productivity of their land." Joe has a great love of nature. "I'm a morning person. I love to get up early—breakfast is my favorite meal of the day! I'm most happy when I'm outside—I love to hunt, climb, bike, hike, ski, cut wood, paddle, shoot, fish—and repeat!" Jessica's proud of Joe's accomplishments. "Although Joe is humble and may not admit it, he is a very good rock climber. He has been climbing for more than half of his life and has won rock climbing competitions. Joe worked previously as an adventure educator. He's compassionate and a good motivator. Secretly, he's a superhero (just kidding)!" With her research and doctorate and her four national interpreter certifications, Jessica is an assistant professor for Bloomsburg University's ASL/English Interpreting Program and a nationally-certified interpreter. When she is not teaching, she interprets. "I'm inspired when I see my students becoming successful interpreters, and when I'm interpreting, I love seeing communication happen between people who otherwise could not have understood one another."

Following dreams

Jessica loves to travel and take vacations so that she can "get away" and just enjoy life without distractions. Maybe Germany for the history and scenery. Back in high school she went to Australia and New Zealand with People to People Student Ambassadors. Joe has gotten as far as Alaska when they went to visit Jessica's cousin. "We love Alaska," Joe says. "We have gone there twice and are looking forward to going again. It is so beautiful and you can see the magnitude of God's creation there. We just look out at the scenery and are reminded of God's creativity and how He has given us so much beauty to look at and enjoy. Someday I'd also like to rock climbing in the Tetons, another example of God's majestic creativity".

The Sassamans have great times canoeing and hiking together, and they plan on completing some outdoor house projects. When she gets the chance, Jessica likes to read, catch up with friends, or just be lazy. Joe has plans to get his Professional Geologist license next year. So it looks like they have plenty to keep them busy for a while. Jessica says, "We value our relationship with each other, our good friends, and all the blessing God has bestowed on us."

The search is over

t was a long process—about six months—but God has revealed the man to join Cornerstone in its journey. With the ballots received by mail and those dropped off at the church, plus the votes cast at the meeting, Cornerstone overwhelmingly affirmed David as our lead pastor.

Perry County Food Bank news

e all know people continue to struggle to simply survive in this nation's down economy. Right here in Perry County. the Perry County Food Bank served 1,084 households in June, and 31 of those were new families. These numbers reflect that the Food Bank served 2,803 individual people. While those numbers had declined in May (hopefully an indication that families were beginning to feel some relief), the Food Bank is seeing increases once again. Food stamps have been cut back and families are really struggling keeping groceries in the house. Please continue to keep these families in your prayers.

As food prices continue to rise, the Food Bank has been spending several thousand dollars more each month than it had in previous months. The Food Bank is truly blessed to have many people and organizations supporting it, and it is deeply appreciative of every contribution. But now more than ever, the Food Bank needs your donations to help with its rising costs. The next time you do your grocery shopping, pick up an extra item or two and help out your Perry County neighbors. Special needs for this month include any kind of cereal, soups, peanut butter, jelly, Jello and pudding boxes, pastas, pasta sauces, box mixes, ramen noodle packages, and any kind of canned vegetables or fruits.

But if you can't afford to help in this way, here are two ideas to think about:

Many of you have planted gardens. If you have anything extra you cannot use, please keep the Food Bank in mind. These families would enjoy the fresh produce very much.

Please consider giving some of your time and effort to the Perry County Food Bank by becoming a volunteer. Volunteers are always needed! They assist the families with their shopping needs, bag groceries, help take groceries to their cars, stock shelves, stock cooler and freezer items, etc. Volunteers are needed Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 9am to 12noon and Monday and Wednesday 1pm to 3pm. 

It felt good to be back on the farm. I never thought I'd miss the heat, the dirt, the sweat, the noise, the late nights and early mornings, the cold showers, the lack of toilet flushing, or the art of brushing your teeth without walking to the nearest running water ... but after taking a year off from one of the nation's largest Christian music festivals, it was good to be back.



Last year, we decided as leaders we needed a break from Creation and had an awesome adventure and retreat at Ohiopyle State Park. So this year, we wanted to head back to Agape Farm, and Creation didn't disappoint! In my 13 years of attending the festival, this year was one of the best. We had an awesome group of 44 leaders and teens (a small group by Cornerstone standards) that got to experience everything the festival had to offer.

The week was HOT (with temperatures reaching 100 degrees or more on some days) and there were some nasty storms (including one that forced leaders to wake everyone up at 3am and another that closed down the stage during an evening speaker), but that couldn't stop the Youth at Cornerstone! ext summer a group of adults and high school students will travel to Joplin, Missouri for a short-term mission trip. 
