



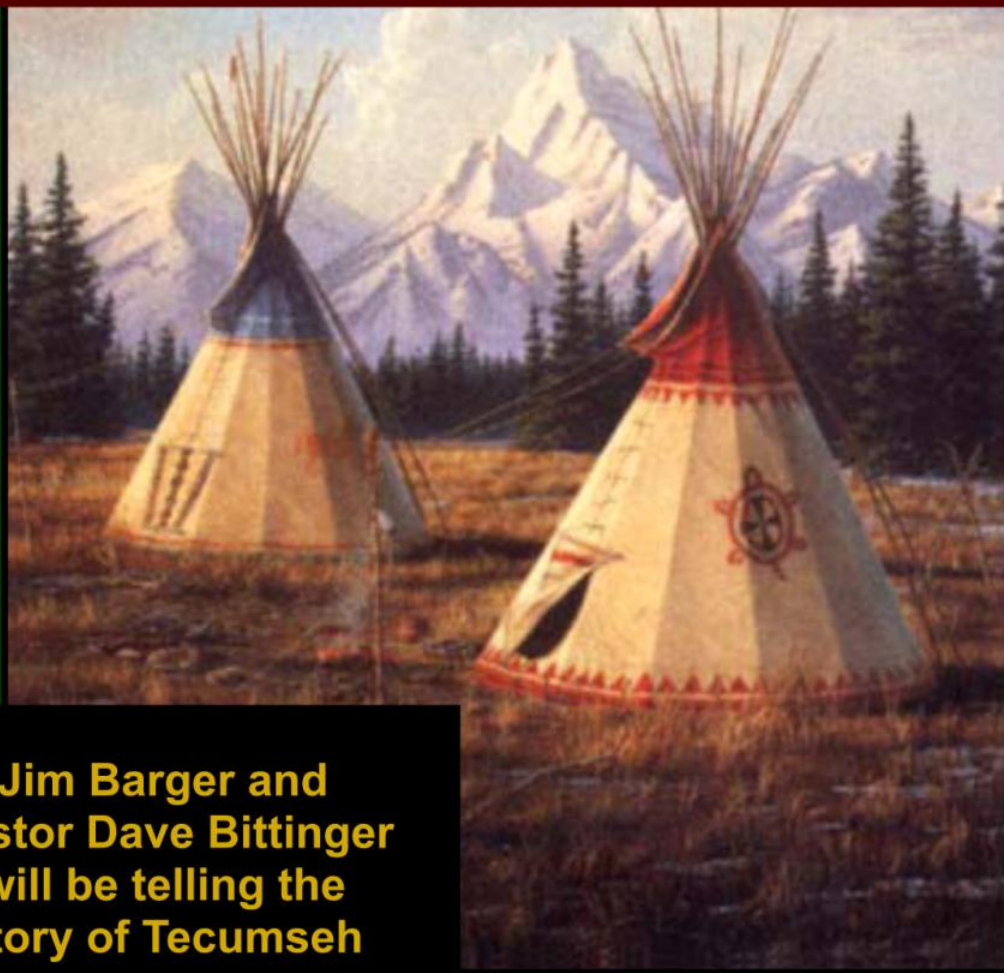

Grand Pow Wow Event Competitions

Camping

- Orienteering Adventure – find the hidden targets using compass and map. Mark your card with the appropriate stamps and return home.
- Lashing project – construct your project using ¼” rope and rustic poles. Incorporate all four lashing types if possible for the highest possible score (square, round, diagonal, and continuous). Will be judged on Saturday afternoon.
- Fire craft race – build a campfire, cook two scrambled eggs, and eat them. Choose one of the following fire starting methods:
 - Start the fire with the bow and drill method.
 - Start fire with flint and steel – (8 min. added to your time)
 - Start fire with matches or metal match (10 min. added to your time)

Fine Arts (sign up for time for time slots when you register)

- Stump preaching (3 min sermon). Topic should be related to Communion or the Last Supper. The winner of this event will deliver their sermon on Sunday am prior to the communion service.
- Vocal performance (1-4 boys) - 4:00 minutes max length. You may use a sound track. The winner will perform at Saturday night council fire service.
- Instrumental solo - 3:00 minutes max length. You may use a sound track. The winner will perform at Saturday night council fire service.

Trades - bring items to be judged (must be homemade)

- Wood or metal project (outpost sign, patrol sign, etc)
- Ranger Derby Car Race – 1 per outpost for racing (Friday after council fire)
- Leather project (vest, FCF clothing, craft items, etc)

Sports

- Ultimate Frisbee tournament (one team per outpost)
- 5 on 5 soccer tournament. (1 D/R team and 1 A/R + E/R team per outpost)
- Archery Competition – every one may participate. Top 3 scores from your outpost will be counted.

Hi-Tech

- Model rocket launch – event based on highest altitude. One rocket launch per outpost. (your group may launch additional rockets for fun)
- Geo Cache – find a hidden treasure using a GPS device
- Nintendo Wii competition – highest score will win the event. All boys may participate.

POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Heartland Conference Retreat Center

Thank you for keeping Heartland Conference Retreat Center a smoke and alcohol free environment across the entire grounds of 356 acres.

- 1. Modest swimwear is required by anyone using the pool and surrounding area. Ladies and girls must wear modest one-piece bathing suits. Men and boys must wear modest swimming trunks. At each swimming session at least one person from each group renting the pool needs to 'monitor' the bathing suits upon entrance to the pool area. Lifeguards should not be distracted by having to monitor the bathing suits.**
- 2. A cover-up (not a beach towel) is to be worn to and from the pool area. The cover-up needs to be worn over bathing suits and swimming trunks anywhere on Heartland property when not at the pool area.**
- 3. Swimming is allowed only when there are lifeguards on duty at the pool.**
- 4. Each hour the lifeguards are required by law to take a 15 minute break. All swimmers must exit the pool during the required breaks.**
- 5. Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times on Heartland property.**
- 6. No food or drinks are allowed inside the fenced area. Food and drinks are permitted outside the pool area.**
- 7. Diving Area: Only those who pass the swimming test and have a valid wristband are permitted in the diving area. Anyone in violation of this rule will lose all pool privileges, possibly for the remainder of the scheduled event. No backward dives or flips. No swimming in the diving area. Swim to the ladder, not under the ropes. Wait for the person in front of you to get to the ladder before diving. Jump off the diving board forward, not to the side.**
- 8. Swim Test Rules: You are required to swim the width of the pool on one side without stopping and swim the front crawl.**
- 9. General Rules: No Running, horseplay, pushing, shoving or pulling people into the pool. No jumping or diving off the sides of the pool at any time. No food or drink inside the pool area. Stay in area of pool where you can touch bottom. No flotation devices that have a hole in the middle, such as inner tubes.**
- 10. Above all – the lifeguard's decision in any matter is final and will not be disputed with the patrons.**

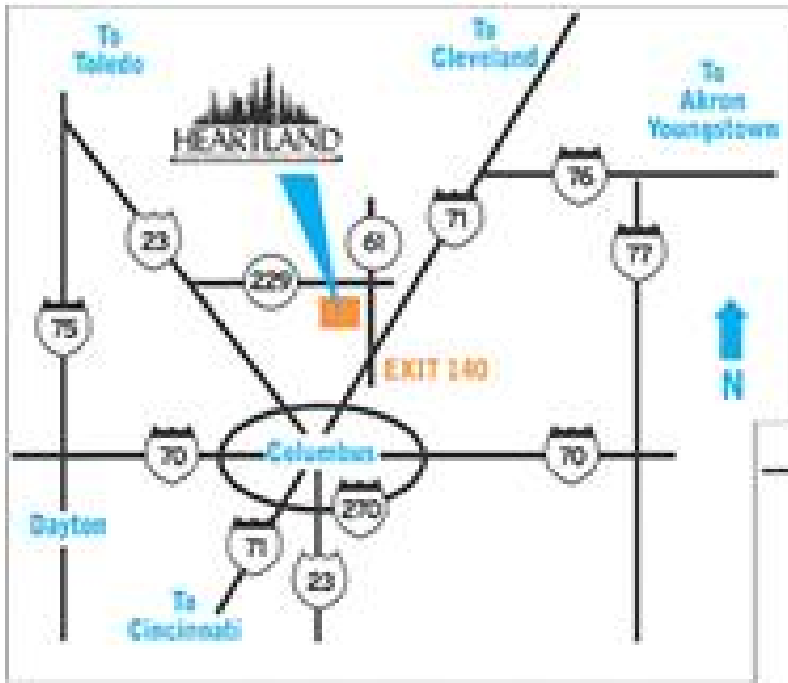

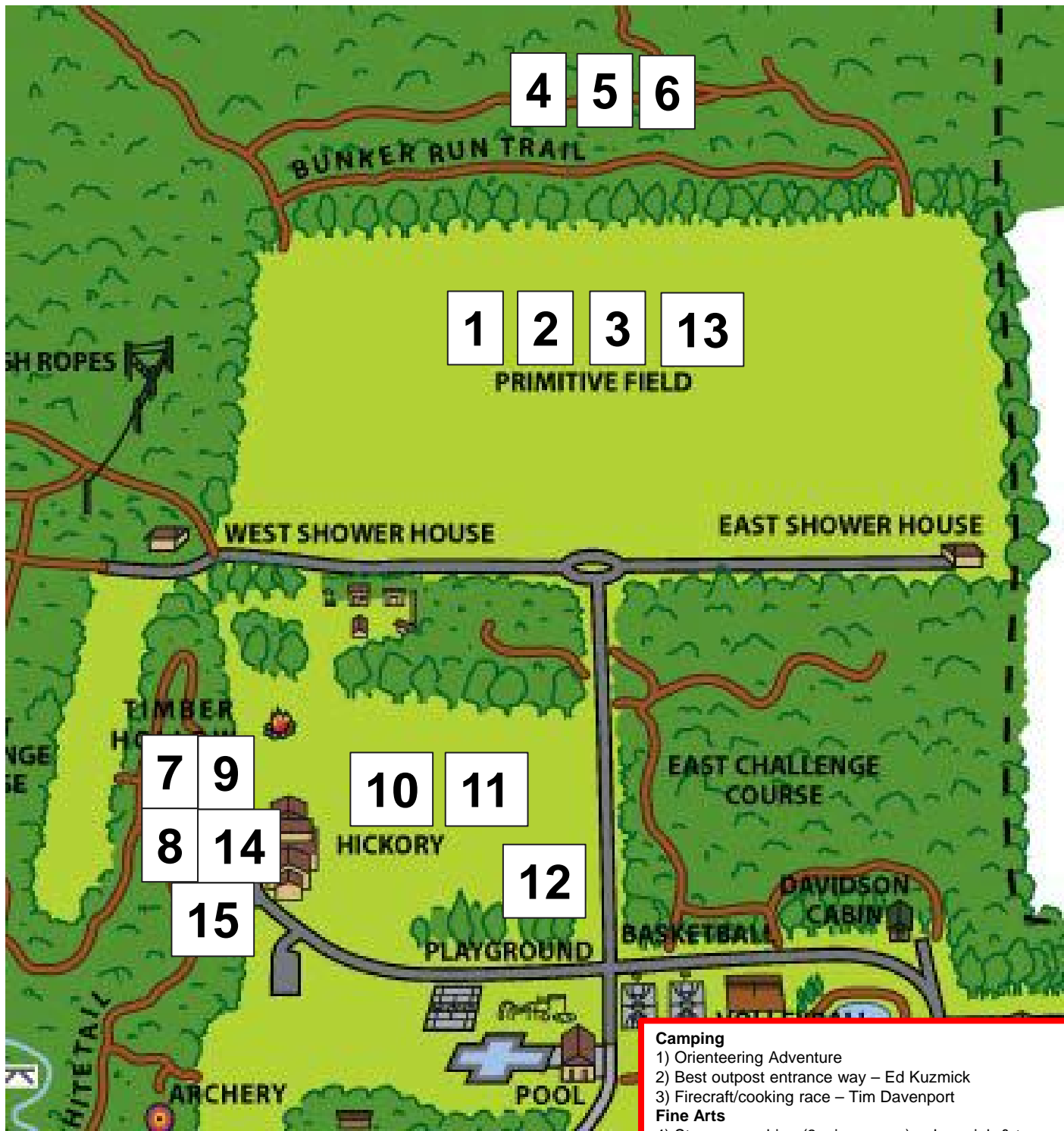

Royal Ranger Paintball Event



Outpost 50 (Batavia) will be hosting a paintball event the first day of Pow Wow Friday June 20th. This event is not affiliated with the Grand Pow Wow events and participation will not result in any awards. It is merely an extra event hosted by Outpost 50. However, participation in the paintball event can count towards earning the Paintball Silver Skill merit.

The event will be open to all Adventure and Expedition Rangers, as well as commanders and parents who want to participate.

Schedule of Events:

Friday June 19	Time	Ages Eligible
Game 1:	2:00-3:00pm	Adventure & Expedition
Game 2:	3:00-4:00pm	Adventure & Expedition
Game 3:	4:00-5:30pm	Expedition, Commanders, & Parents

Game Rules:

- Games 1 and 2 will last about an hour, game 3 will last an hour and a half.
- Games will be capture the flag style in the woods.
- Games will end at the allotted time whether a winner has been declared or not.
- If a game finishes before the allotted time, the game will restart if there is enough time to do so.
- A hit to the body or clothes means you are out. However, once you are out, you can run back to base and get back in the game. This way everyone can play the whole time.
- Each player will be responsible for refereeing themselves, if you are hit, you are out.
- Each player must keep their mask on at all times while on the playing field and when entering and exiting the field.
- Players do not have to participate in all games. They are free to play when they are available.
- Teams will be picked randomly with ages balanced between teams to ensure fairness.
- Each player must bring their own equipment, except paintballs. Those must be purchased from Outpost 50. Please see list of necessary equipment below and pre-registration order form for paintballs.
- Markers will be speed tested to ensure the speed is set consistently across all markers.
- Each player must pre-register by **May 20** in order to participate. No registrations the day of will be accepted.

Necessary Equipment

(each participant must bring these items):

- Paintball marker (gun)
- Air tank full of air
- Mask and goggles
- Hopper
- Barrel plug or cover
- Squeegee

Suggested Optional Equipment

(each participant should bring these items):

- Old clothes or camouflage
(the more layers the better)
- Old shoes or boots
- Gloves
- Hat (to protect the top of the head)
- Bulk loader
- Protective Cup
- Bandana or neck protection

Cost: \$20.00 to play which includes 1000 paintballs. All Registrations and money must be received by May 20 in order to participate.

Additional paintballs can be purchased in advance or the day of the event. However, a limited supply of additional paintballs will be available the day of the event.
