## SEC Gymnast of the Week

**Rheagan Courville • LSU**  
**Senior • Baton Rouge, La.**

Courville delivered the best performance of her career as she swept all five individual titles, including a career-high 39.825 all-around total, to help the Tigers beat Georgia, 198.075-196.850. LSU's 198.075 is the second-highest score in the nation, the highest in the SEC, and the third-highest score in LSU history. Courville's 39.825 ranks as the highest all-around total in the nation this season and the second-highest in program history. Courville won the vault and bars titles with 9.95s in each event, won the floor title with a career-high tying 9.975 and won a share of the beam title with a 9.95. She now has 26 career vault titles, second-most in LSU history, and she has 24 all-around titles which is one shy of tying April Burkholder for most in school history.

## SEC Specialist of the Week

**Erin Macadaeg • LSU**  
**Freshman • Redwood City, Calif.**

Macadaeg competed on beam against Georgia, and she came up with a career-high 9.95 to tie for the event title. It marked the first individual title of her young career, and her score helped propel LSU to a 49.625 that ranks as the highest beam total in the nation this season and the second-best beam score in program history. Macadaeg's 9.95 is the highest beam score in the nation, tying her with 12 other gymnasts across the country (including two LSU teammates). It also marked her second beam score of 9.9 or higher this season. She became the first freshman in LSU history to score a 9.90 in the first beam routine of her career, which she accomplished in the season opener against Iowa.

## SEC Freshman of the Week

**Ericha Fassbender • Florida**  
**Freshman • Katy, Texas**

Fassbender became the ninth Gator to win in her all-around debut, claiming the dual meet title at then No. 8 Arkansas with a 39.375. She stepped into Florida's uneven bars lineup for the first time this season to replace injured teammate Kennedy Baker. Fassbender shared the bars meet title at 9.85 with teammates Claire Boyce and Bridgette Caquatto and Arkansas' Paige Zaziski. She also registered collegiate-best marks for vault (9.875) and balance beam (9.85) at Arkansas.

**SEC Gymnastics Fast Facts**

- Southeastern Conference teams have won nine of the last 10 NCAA Championships, including four consecutive, and 18 NCAA titles all-time. Three different SEC teams - Alabama, Florida and Georgia - have won NCAA Gymnastics Championships.
- Florida won its second consecutive NCAA Championship in 2014. Four SEC teams advanced to the Super Six at last season's NCAA Championship.
- In 1998, the SEC entered the record books as the only conference ever to sweep the top-three spots at the NCAA meet (Georgia, Florida and Alabama).
- The SEC has placed at least two teams among the top six in 31 of the possible 33 NCAA Championship events. A record five SEC teams advanced to the NCAA Super Six team final in 2009.
- The SEC leads all conferences in NCAA individual titles (97).
- Georgia leads all NCAA schools in individual titles (40).
- SEC student-athletes earned 30 All-America honors in 2014.
- The addition of Missouri to the SEC in July 2012 brought the number of league institutions sponsoring gymnastics to eight. The 2013 SEC Gymnastics Championship featured, for the first time, a two-session final.

**Team Notes**

The No. 6 ranked Alabama gymnastics team beat No. 11 Auburn, 197.325-196.825 Friday night in front of a Coleman Coliseum crowd of 13,028. Going into the second half of the meet, the Crimson Tide powered to a season-best tying 49.325 on the balance beam after sophomore Keely McNeer and junior Lauren Beers both scored 9.9s. After Auburn scored a 49.025 on the floor exercise, Alabama led by .450 going into the last rotation. Alabama closed out the meet and the Tigers by tying its season-best score with a 49.450 on the floor exercise behind 9.9s from sophomore Aja Sims, senior Kaitlyn Clark and Beers. The Tigers battled to the end with a season-best 49.400 on the balance beam. With the victory, the Crimson Tide extended its wins streak over the Tigers to 111 in a row. Beers won the all-around, the second of her collegiate career, with 39.475. She and Katie Bailey and Katie Bailey shared top honors on the uneven bars, Beers also shared wins on the balance beam with McNeer and the floor exercise with Aja Sims and Clark. Alabama opened the meet with a 49.200 on the vault led by a 9.9 from Williams. On the uneven bars, the Tide posted a season-best 49.350 paced by 9.900s from Beers and Bailey. It was Beers' fifth consecutive win on the apparatus this season. The Crimson Tide remains at home next Friday, facing Boise State. It will also be Alabama gymnastics' 11th annual Power of Pink meet, which supports the fight against breast cancer. The Tide will also be celebrating legendary coaches Sarah and David Patterson's career as well as Alumni Night.

**Team Notes**

Freshman Paige Zaziski set a personal-best in two events and won a pair of event titles to lead the No. 8-ranked University of Arkansas women's gymnastics team to a 195.375 score against co-defending champion and second-ranked Florida in Barnhill Arena. Zaziski set two more personal bests on Friday on the vault and balance beam in front of a home crowd that was the eighth-highest largest in program history. The freshman also captured the first two event titles of her career, as she won the uneven bars and balance beam. She posted a career-best 9.925 on the vault, marking the third time this season she posted a 9.9-plus score this season. Her performance on the vault sparked a season-high 49.425 in the event for the Razorbacks, as five gymnasts scored a 9.800 or higher, including a 9.900 from junior Heather Elswick and a 9.925 from sophomore Amanda Wellick. Zaziski followed her vault performance with a 9.850 on the uneven bars, marking the fifth-straight meet that she has posted a 9.8-plus score on the event en route to capturing her first career event title. She would later pick up her second career title as she turned in the best performance on the balance beam this season for an Arkansas gymnast with a 9.875. Junior Sydney Dillard would later match Zaziski's score from the anchor position on the beam to claim a share of the title. Arkansas ended its night with a 49.125 in the floor exercise to give them a 49-plus score in two events for the evening. The Razorbacks collected four 9.8-plus scores in the event, as Elswick and Wellick posted back-to-back 9.875's from the fifth and sixth spot in the rotation to lead the team. Arkansas will conclude a two-meet home stand next Friday, Feb. 13, as they step out of SEC action to host both Illinois State and Southeast Missouri State in a tri-meet at Barnhill Arena. Events begin at 6:45 p.m. CST.

Season-high scores on vault and beam from No. 11 Auburn gymnastics wasn't enough as the Tigers fell to No. 6 Alabama 197.325-196.825 in Coleman Coliseum on Friday. Auburn's 196.825 was the highest team score in program history at Alabama and the second-highest away score ever for the Tigers. For the second week in a row, Lexus Demers led Auburn on vault with a personal best 9.925, earning her the event title. Caitlin Atkinson and MJ Rott each scored 9.900 on the event to help the Tigers to a team total of 49.325, a season-high. On beam, the Tigers scored a season-high 49.400 led by three scores of 9.900 by Atkinson, Demers and Megan Walker. The scores were part of a five-way tie for the event title. Auburn began the meet on bars and scored a team total 49.075. Atkinson led the Tigers with a 9.875 on the event, followed by Kait Kluz's 9.850. Freshman Abby Millet had a strong performance in the first away meet of her career. She scored 9.850 on beam and 9.825 on bars. A floor score of 49.075 gave Auburn a total of 147.425 heading into the final rotation. Rott led the Tigers with a 9.825 on the event. Auburn will face No. 3 LSU next Friday at 7 p.m. in Auburn Arena live on the SEC Network.

Georgia recorded its second-highest road score of the season on Friday night, a 196.850 against No. 3 LSU. Although the Tigers came out on top with a 198.075, Georgia turned in its best scores through two rotations and three rotations in any meet this season. Highlighting the night for Georgia was its vault lineup which tallied a season-best mark of 49.425. In the last three meets, Georgia has recorded its highest three over-all scores in addition to its top three scores on vault, bars and beam. Friday's meet with LSU also marks the first time since 2013 that Georgia has scored a 49.0 or higher on every event in three straight meets. ... The Gymdogs moved up to a No. 8 ranking in this week's top-25 which is Georgia's highest national ranking since the second week of the season. In the team event rankings, Georgia is ranked sixth on bars, 12th on vault, 13th on floor and 19th on beam. ... Georgia will travel to Chapel Hill, North Carolina, for the first time since 1977 on Saturday to face UNC at 1 p.m.

The No. 21 Kentucky gymnastics team used season-high floor and balance beam scores to erase an early deficit and score a season-best 195.825 to beat Missouri on Friday. Three Wildcats won event titles in the 195.825-195.150 road victory. The Wildcats (3-3, 1-3 Southeastern Conference) improved to 3-0 in dual meets vs. Mizzou as UK notched a road win in Columbia for the second consecutive year, again using the strengths of a third-rotation floor routine. Kentucky trailed 97.850-97.675 after two events, but outscored Mizzou 98.150-97.300 in the final two rotations to secure the road victory. Junior Montana Whittle and senior Shannon Mitchell each recorded a 9.875 to win beam, while sophomore Taylor Puryear tied for a win on floor with a 9.850. Whittle earned her first career event title, and Puryear her first of the season and second of her career. Mitchell's win was the second of the season and seventh of her career. UK opened with a meet-high 48.975 on bars before a 48.700 on vault. The comeback began with a 49.150 on floor, followed by a 49.000 on beam, both season highs and meet-best scores. Along with Mitchell, Puryear and Whittle, junior Marissa Beucler led the Wildcats with a 9.825 on bars and freshman Sydney Waltz posted a team-high 9.875. The Wildcats are back on the road on Feb. 13 at 8 p.m. ET at the Perfect 10 Challenge in Oklahoma City. The Wildcats face No. 1 Oklahoma, the defending co-national champions in a neutral site matchup in OU's backyard.

Third-ranked LSU not only set a season high for the third straight meet, but the Tigers also earned the second-highest score in the nation this season in a 198.075-196.850 victory over Georgia on Friday in the Maravich Center. LSU (7-1, 4-0 SEC) posted the highest beam and floor scores in the country with a 49.625 in each event. LSU senior all-arounder Jessie Jordan, ranked fourth nationally in the all-around, was forced to sit out of the competition after suffering a minor injury during vault warmups, but the rest of her teammates had her back. Fellow senior all-arounder Rheagan Courville delivered the best performance of her career as she swept all five titles, including a career-high 39.825 that ranks as the highest all-around total in the nation this season. Courville won the vault and bars titles with 9.95s in each event, won the floor title with a career-high tying 9.975 and won a share of the beam title with a 9.95. Ashleigh Gnat and Erin Macadaeg shared the beam title with Courville as they tallied 9.95s. It marked the first individual title of Macadaeg's career. It was the third time in program history that LSU eclipsed a 198 team score – the other two coming in 2014 – and the 198.075 ranks as the second-best score in LSU history. Overall, the Tigers tied or set eight career highs against the Gym dogs, and LSU earned 12 scores of 9.90 or better. With Jordan out of the meet, freshman Myia Hambrick stepped into the all-around and recorded career highs on vault and beam with 9.90s on each, and she also added a 9.825 on bars. After the big score, LSU moved back up to No. 2 in the national rankings as the Tigers prep for another Top 10 matchup. LSU travels to face No. 9 Auburn at 7 p.m. CT Friday in a meet that will be nationally televised live on SEC Network. The Tigers went 1-1 last weekend with a pair of home meets at the Hearn Center. On Feb. 6, Missouri suffered a 195.825-195.150 loss to No. 23 Kentucky. Freshman Shauna Miller claimed the all-around, vault, bars and floor titles to lead the Tigers, while freshman Kennedy Harris tied Miller on floor to earn the first event crown of her career. Miller tied career bests on two events and the all-around during the meet after scoring 9.850s on both bars and floor and winning all-around with a 39.325. Harris also tallied a 9.850 on floor to set a personal high for the second consecutive week.

In a 194.550-193.675 win over Lindenwood on Feb. 8, Mizzou set nine individual career highs. Freshman Becca Schugel took home her first career all-around title (39.175) and tied for the beam crown. Additionally, redshirt senior Katelyn Trevino, Miller, sophomore Alyson Heimsath and Harris also claimed event wins on the day. Trevino notched a career high 9.900 on vault for that win, Miller won bars with a personal best 9.900 and tied Heimsath and Schugel for the beam win after a score of 9.775. Overall, seven different Mizzou gymnasts combined to set nine new career bests and the Tigers also received a season best floor score (49.150) to close out the meet.
