## Game 21: No. 3 Mississippi State 90, Florida 53

January 25, 2018 * Humphrey Coliseum * Starkville, MS
Junior Funda Nakkasoglu scored 19 and Florida held the rebounding edge against the taller
Mississippi State squad, however, the No. 2-ranked Bulldogs took advantage of several missed opportunities and an impressive third quarter to earn the 90-53 decision at Humphrey Coliseum.

Sophomore Delicia Washington notched her fifth double-double of the season and sixth of her career with 10 points and 10 rebounds, as Florida shot 39.7 percent overall from the floor compared to MSU's 54.4 percent effort, the highest by a Gator opponent this season.

Mississippi State improved to 21-0 overall - 7-0 in the Southeastern Conference - and set the program record for best start to a season.

## How It Happened

The teams traded scores for the first three minutes of the second half before MSU scored five straight points for a 46-28 advantage. Jalaysha Thomas converted a layup that prevented a larger run, however, MSU came right back with a score.

Nakkasoglu drilled a three-pointer that had Florida within 15 points with 4:36 left in the third, but the Bulldogs countered with 11 straight points that started a devastating 16-2 run over a 2:50 span for a 29-point difference with 1:26 remaining in the third quarter and the Gators wouldn't recover

Florida shot a respectable 46.2 percent during that third quarter, however, MSU hit 64.7 percent as it outscored the Gators 31-14 to carry a comfortable 66-37 lead into the final period.

Gators Kept It Close Early
Mississippi State scored seven consecutive points to build an early 13-4 lead and the teams traded buckets for the next three minutes before Victoria Vivans' shot with 44 seconds left in the first quarter gave the hosts a 10 -point advantage.

Sydney Searcy answered with a three-pointer from the corner to end the first frame's scoring and ignited a 10-2 run that cut Florida's deficit down to $22-20$ with $5: 41$ remaining in the second quarter.

The Gators had chance to tie the game on their next possession but couldn't inbound the ball and the Bulldogs made them pay with a quick Vivans' bucket that sparked an 13-0 MSU swing.

Dyandria Anderson set up on the wing and Haley Lorenzen found her for a three-pointer that halted the Bulldog spree with 31 seconds left in the first half. Florida had missed nine consecutive field goals prior to Anderson's trey, as the Bulldogs took a 35-23 halftime lead.

Nakkasoglu scored 13 of UF's 23 first-half points, as she hit 5-of-8 from the field that include a three-pointer and a pair of free throws.

Lorenzen collected nine rebounds during the first 20 minutes and helped the Gators hold a 21-18 edge on the boards

- Seiler's first interaction with the team was during its Jan. 4 shootaround. She sat on the bench for that game against Alabama and participated in official practice on Jan. 9.
- A 5 -foot-5 point guard from Peachtree City, Ga., Seiler scored 17 goals during her collegiate soccer career, including seven game-winning goals. The Gator's 2017 team captain also recorded 21 assists and was named in 2017 the SEC Offensive and Top Drawer Soccer National Player of Week after scoring the tying goal versus then No. T-1 Stanford and the first goal in 2-1 win versus Syracuse.
- While Seiler has focused her attention on the sport of soccer for the last five years, she was a force on the hardwood during her prep career at McIntosh High School, where she broke the school's all-time scoring record - boys and girls - eventually topping the 2,000-point plateau for her four-year career. The 20 -year-old record she broke of 1918 points was held by Jeff Sheppard, who starred at Kentucky where he won two NCAA titles.

Florida's three seniors helped make Cameron Newbauer's Gator coaching debut a success, as the trio combined for 51 points in an 82-66 season-opening victory against Georgia State on Saturday.

Dyandria Anderson scored 18 points with seven rebounds and eight assists - with just two turnovers.

Haley Lorenzen tallied the fifth double-double of her career with 18 points and a career-high-tying 12 rebounds.

Fifth-year senior transfer Paulina Hersler opened her Gator career with a career-best 15 points with the aid of a trio of threes.

Junior newcomer Funda Nakkasoglu and sophomore Delicia Washington both added nine points, along with six and five rebounds, respectively.

And all 11 Gators scored, with the final bucket coming from freshman Mikayla Hayes, who converted a layup with one second remaining for her first collegiate points.

It was a great time for all the Gators, however, it didn't start out quite as jubilant.
The Panthers scored the first eight points of the game and led for the entire first half until the final 2:35, when Anderson knocked down one of UF's 10 three-pointers in the game and gave the Gators a 32-31 advantage.

A three-point-play by Lorenzen extended the lead and Hersler tacked on two more points for a 37 31 lead with 50 seconds until halftime

Freshman Tameria Johnson and sophomore Sydney Searcy entered the game for the first time with 17 seconds remaining and their presence was immediately felt. Johnson collected a steal and found Searcy, who was fouled attempting a shot. She made one free throw before ended the hal with another steal that ended the Panther's final offensive possession.

The teams went back and forth in the scoring column for the first few minutes of the third quarter before an 8-0 spurt extended the Gator lead to 14 points, 50-36.

Georgia State used the long ball to keep it close and Florida held a 58-49 advantage entering the final quarter

Florida outscored the Panthers 12-3 to start the fourth and never looked back.

Florida shot 51 percent from the floor but committed 23 turnovers in a 70-69 loss to Arkansas State at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Tuesday evening.

The loss snapped the Gator's 10-game home, non-conference win streak and was the first setback of the young season for first-year head coach Cameron Newbauer.
Newbauer has been adamant that his inaugural Gator squad would build a culture and he stood by that Tuesday, as all 11 players saw action by the midpoint of the second quarter. At time, it resembled an ice hockey game from the waves of substitutes the Gators ushered on and off the court.
"We don't play hard, we start slow out of the gate. We told our team we don't care about winning and losing, we care about the culture and learning how to play," Newbauer said. "We are going to win and lose the right way. Our players did not play hard, so if you do not play hard, you will not play. We subbed left and right to try and find the people that were going to play hard and get their hands up on defense, sprint back on defense and rebound.

That said, the Gators held a one-point halftime lead despite leading for just over three minutes in the and even had the final possession with 5.6 seconds remaining in the game.

Florida took a quick three-point attempt that didn't fall and the Red Wolves collected the miss and the win.

The loss overshadowed a number of individual performances, as graduate transfer Paulina Her sler posted the first double-double of her career with 12 points and a career-best 11 rebounds

Junior transfer Funda Nakkasoglu led the Gators with 16 points in her first double-figure scoring game wearing the orange and blue.

Sophomore Delicia Washington added 11 points and eight rebounds, but was tagged for nine miscues.
Down the Stretch
There were four lead changes and three tied scores in the fourth quarter, with Florida's final advantage coming after Haley Lorenzen's jumper gave the Gators a $63-61$ spot with $5: 30$ remaining.
A-State answered with a 7-0 run thanks to five points from Jada Ford, who finished with a game-high 17 points, and the visitors led 68-63 with 3:08 on the clock.
Washington dropped in a layup and Lorenzen added one free throw with 47 seconds left hat had the Gators within two, 68-66. Ford, however, followed with a jumper and 25 ticks remaining for a four-point Red Wolves advantage
Five seconds later, Nakkasoglu drilled a three-pointer from the top of the key and the Gators were within one.
Florida's defense forced a five-second, inbound violation and got the ball back with 5.6 seconds and a chance to win the game.
A-State scored seven points off of six Gator turnovers in the final 10 minutes.

Funda Nakkasoglu scored 18 points and Florida committed just six turnovers but it wasn't enough to slow down No. 17/14 Florida State, as the Seminoles took the 84-54 decision in the Sunshine Showdown presented by Fresh From Florida Friday evening.

## How it Happened

Nakkasoglu's layup at the 4:42 mark of the second quarter had the Gators within two, 28-26. That's when Florida State ripped off a devastating 19-0 run that lasted until there was $7: 39$ remaining in the third quarter and the Seminoles took a commanding 47-26 lead and never looked back as it handed UF its third worst loss in the 74-game series.

During that seven-minute span, Florida missed 11 consecutive shots but committed just one turnover

Nakkasoglu ended the FSU spree with one of UF's seven three-pointers during the game.
FSU outscored Florida 20-8 in the second quarter and 28-13 in the third, however, the first quarter ended in a tie and the Noles had just a three-point advantage in the fourth

It was during the deciding second quarter when the Gators hit just 17.6 percent (3-17) from the floor and had three total miscues that resulted in seven Noles points.

## Close Early

Florida battled strong in the first quarter, even when FSU took a quick 12-4 lead just 4:10 into the game. After the teams traded scores, seniors Paulina Hersler, who finished with 11 points, and Haley Lorenzen canned jumpers and the Gators were within four.

Funda Nakkasoglu went 7 -for-9 from the three-point arc and led a record-setting team effort from ong range in Florida's 87-80 win against Richmond in the first game of the Savannah Invitational played at the Savannah Civic Center Tuesday evening.
Nakkasoglu finished with a game-high 25 points, as she converted 8 -of-11 overall from the field, as well as both free throw attempts to log the 31st 20-point game of her career and her first this season.

The Florida junior had a lot of help in setting the program record for threes in a game, as six different Gators combined to hit 15-of-30 from the arc, passing the previous standard of 13 UF hit at Arkansas on Feb. 1, 2009.

In spite of Florida's prowess from deep, the Gators still needed to secure the win at the free throw line, where Dyandria Anderson (4-6), Haley Lorenzen (2-2), Delicia Washington (3-4) and Paulina Hersler (1-2) combined to coolly convert 10-of-12 in the final three minutes.

The Gators needed those points, as Richmond tallied nine three-pointers overall and actually totaled 29 field goals compared to UF's 28 in the game.

The win, which snapped Florida's two-game slide, begins a run of three games in three days at the Savannah Invite.

How it Happened
Florida jumped out early behind four three-pointers and took a 24-18 lead by the end of the first quarter
Richmond held a 21-18 scoring edge in the second quarter and was able to whittle an 11-point deficit with 8:23 remaining down to three points, as Florida took the 42-39 halftime ead
During that first half, Florida dished nine assists on their 16 field goals and committed just four turnovers
The Gators extended their first-half lead to nine points, 50-41, thanks to an 8-2 run to begin he third quarter. Richmond, however, staged a 20-9 spree over the next five minutes and 30 seconds and took a 61-59 lead with 33 seconds left in the third.

Tuesday's hard-fought win against Richmond contributed in part to Wednesday's 85-71 Gator loss o Stetson in the second game of the Savannah Invitational played at the Savannah Civic Center.

Florida's leading scorer Funda Nakkasoglu, who had scored a season-high 25 points against the Spiders, left that game after an ankle sprain with 1:56 remaining and was unable to play versus the Hatters. With the Gator's primary ball handler on the bench, the roster down to nine and the team playing its second game in as many days all proved too much to overcome.

Senior Dyandria Anderson did her best to compensate for Nakkasoglu's absence by scoring a career-best 21 points and converting 5-of-11 from the three-point arc.

## How it Happened

Stetson carried the momentum it established during the final two minutes of the first half into the second half by scoring the initial seven points that ignited a 16-5 run for a 60-41 lead and the Hatters never looked back.

Anderson tried to the keep the Gators close, as she scored the next five points of the game and Florida closed to within 14 points with $4: 25$ left in the quarter.

Stetson, however, kept firing and the nation's third-most accurate team for shooting percentage entering the tournament with a 56.1 percent mark - maintained its keen shot throughout to keep the Gators at bay.

Florida did manage a late 11-0 spurt that cut the deficit to eight points, $79-71$, with 40 seconds left in the game, but it was too late to recover from the 23-point hole it dug with 9:36 remaining

## First Half in Review

There were four lead changes and three tied scores in a very tight first half, when Stetson hit 53.6 percent (15-28) of its shots, including a 7 -of-13 effort from three

The Gators missed their first five shots from the floor, as Stetson took a quick 5-0 lead and that was a sign of things to come

Stetson built a five-point advantage with 4:56 remaining in the first half when Anderson hit back-to-back three-pointers and gave the Gators a 32-31 edge. Sydney Wagner came right back with her third three for the Hatters and tied the score before Tameria Johnson found Haley Lorenzen inside for the short bucket and the game was tied with two minutes remaining

The Hatters finished the half on a 10-2 run, capped by a bucket at the buzzer and took a 44-36 halftime lead.

Quotes from the Court - UF head coach Cameron Newbauer
"Stetson deserved to win the game. I told the team this was going to be a big deal for them being a couple hours down the street from us and it was something they didn't quite understand. We gave p 28 points in the second quarter, 25 points in the third quarter. They shot 54 percent overall and 58 percent from three. We stressed offensive glass and we didn't do that until the second half. I'm really disappointed in the effort right now but that's kind of where we are so we just have to get better and keep working."

With 6:57 remaining in the game, Washington found senior Haley Lorenzen under the basket where she finished the play and helped complete just the third triple-double in program history. Washington finished the game with 12 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists, joining Gator All-Americans and WNBA first-round draft picks DeLisha Milton and Vanessa Hayden as the only others to accomplish the feat.

There were a number of individual milestones and accomplishments during the game and the majority of those contributed toward Florida sinking 17 three-pointers, passing the old standard of 15 the team recorded against Richmond two days ago.

Fresh off a big 40-point win on Thanksgiving, the Gators (4-3) wasted no time getting to the basket and opening an early 7-0 lead over the Dolphins (4-3). Jacksonville was able to trim the Gators lead to three, before a triple from Dyandria Anderson extended the lead back to six. The Gators remained in control the rest of the quarter, going into the second with a 14-10 advantage.

In the second quarter, Florida got into a rhythm offensively and slowly began to extend its four-poin advantage. After taking a seven-point lead, 21-14, the Gators got it done both offensively and defensively as they went on a 13-7 run over the final eight minutes of the half, taking a 33-21 lead into the locker room.

Senior Dyandria Anderson scored a career-high 29 points, Delicia Washington posted a dou-ble-double and presented first-year Florida head coach Cameron Newbauer with his first signature victory after a resounding 80-61 win at Oklahoma at Lloyd Noble Center Sunday afternoon.

The Gators, who did their part in representing the league at the week-long Big12-SEC Challenge handed the Sooners their largest non-conference home loss since 2004.

Funda Nakkasoglu posted 24 points, as she and Anderson took turns from beyond the arc with the Gator junior converting 4-of-9 from deep and 6-of-7 from the line. It was her 32nd career game scoring in the 20s

Haley Lorenzen was guided tightly inside all evening but came up with 11 rebounds along with seven points, as five of her board were on the offensive end that helped UF score 14 of its points

## How it Happened

The lead changed hands five times and the score was tied three additional times during the first quarter, when Florida (5-3) held a 16-13 edge when the horn sounded.

Oklahoma (3-4) began the second quarter with a 4-1 spurt and tied the game for a fourth time now at 17 with 8:44 remaining. Anderson responded with back-to-back three-pointers. Ana Llanusa came off the bench for a three that brought the Sooners back within three, 25-21, but that's the closest they would get for the rest of the game, as Nakkasoglu's driving layup sparked a 10-2 run and the Gators jumped out to a 35-23 lead just 52 seconds into the third quarter.

The teams traded buckets for the next seven minutes before Shaina Pellington, who finished with a eam-high 22 points, scored four straight and cut UF's lead to seven, 47-40, with second seconds remaining in the third

Paulina Hersler, who scored nine points for the Gators, was fouled attempting a three-pointer and knocked down a pair from the line to start the fourth quarter's scoring.

Nakkasoglu followed with a three and the lead was back to double-figures
The teams again exchanged scores before LaNesia Williams hit a three for OU. Washington came right back for the Gators and nailed one in front of their bench

The Gators had erased a 55-48 deficit with 8:04 remaining and tied the game at 55 with 4:37 on the clock thanks to Dyandria Anderson's three-point-play. Nakkasoglu then sank a reverse layup for a two-point Gator lead with $3: 10$ on the clock.

Trailing by two with 1:47 remaining, Washington stepped up with confidence despite having hit just 3-of-12 from the field to that point before nailing a three-pointer that gave Florida a 60-59 lead with 56 seconds left.

Those were the Gators' final points, as UTC closed the game scoring the final six points, four of those from the free throw line, as the Mocs notched their fifth win over a Power 5 conference this season.

Senior Paulina Hersler tied her career with 19 points to lead the Gators offensively in another tough Southeastern Conference tangle. Florida, however, came up just short in a 56-53 setback to Kentucky on Thursday at Exactech Arena at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center

There were eight lead changes and three tied scores in the thriller that marked Florida's eighth game this season decided by 10 points or less, with three of those coming in league play.

Dyandria Anderson scored 10 points with five assists, while Haley Lorenzen added nine points with a game-high 10 rebounds.

## How It Happened

The Gators overcame an early nine-point deficit and rallied for a seven-point lead with 6:37 remain ing in the third quarter, as Florida drilled its first five three-point attempts of the second half to take the 33-26 edge.

The teams went back and forth for the remainder of the third and Florida held a 39-36 lead entering the fourth quarter. During the deciding final period, Kentucky's Amanda Paschal scored 10 points, hitting 2-of-2 three-pointers, while Taylor Murray tallied eight points that included a dagger three with 54 seconds remaining that gave the Wildcats a 54-49 lead.

Kentucky used a 6-2 spurt late when Florida missed five of six field goals tries to take the five-point edge with under a minute to play

The Gators continued to fight and collected a pair of offensive rebounds during their next posses sion before Anderson put in a short shot with 26 seconds remaining and UF was within three.

Delicia Washington came up with a steal three seconds later, however, Florida missed it attempt. The loose rebound was tipped off UK and Florida again had another chance with 14 seconds left.

The Gators missed two shots, but a third offensive board, this one by Hersler who put it back in with 6.5 seconds left and drew Florida within one point, 54-53. Florida immediately fouled Maci Morris, who missed her first free throw but made the second for a two-point UK edge.

The Gators setup for their final possession but Funda Nakkasoglu's three-point attempt to win it was off the mark and the Wildcats collected the defensive board and made one additional free throw for the final score.

## Coming Back

Florida's shot was off the mark to begin the game, as Kentucky scored the first seven points of the contest.
The Gators missed their first eight shots before Hersler put back one of her three offensive rebounds for a score.
UF was 1-of-12 from the field before Searcy connected on a three-pointer that began to chip away at UK's 11-2 lead.

Diggin' the Long Ball
Florida knocked down 10-of-36 three-pointers, as six different Gators contributed from deep, with Hersler (3 three-pointers), Nakkasoglu (2), Anderson (2), Lorenzen, Washington and Sydney Searcy each hitting
It was the ninth game this year UF has recorded double-digit threes.

## Florida Coach Cameron Newbauer - Opening Statement:

Obviously it frustrating and you don't want to focus on results, but we had a chance. Defensively we held them to 56 , which is really good, but their third and fourth quarter shooting percentages were just too good - hats off to them for the way they shot the ball. We had some untimely turnovers in the first half, the same-old ones that we have been having. We have to keep fighting We fought tonight and the effort was there, we just have to tighten up on some miscues. We have to get better, we have a lot of basketball left and we are going to learn and grow - that is all we can ask for."

Haley Lorenzen and Delicia Washington both recorded double-doubles and Florida was involved in its fourth consecutive game decided by single digits, however, the Gators were unable to overcome a rough third quarter in a 66-59 loss to LSU at Exactech Arena at the O'Connell Center.

Lorenzen tied her career-high of 20 points and added 10 rebounds - seven offensive - for her ninth double-double this season and 13th of her career. Washington scored 11 points with 13 boards for her third double-double this year and fourth of career.

Funda Nakkasoglu added 11 points with three assists, while Paulina Hersler tallied 10 points for Florida (8-10, 0-5 SEC).

Florida outscored LSU in three of the four quarters. It was that third quarter that became the Gator's undoing, as the Tigers (11-5, 3-2 SEC) posted a 21-9 scoring advantage that proved to be the difference in the game.

Florida overcame an early 10-4 deficit and closed with the first quarter with a 12-9 edge to hold a 19-16 lead after the first 10 minutes. Unselfish team play produced a layup by Jalaysha Thomas who collected an offensive rebound on the next series that resulted in a three-pointer from Nakkasoglu, who followed with a layup on the next series. Lorenzen capped the 9-0 run and flipped a six-point deficit into a three-point lead.
The second quarter was a tighter offensive display, with Florida managing one more point that LSU to take a 33-29 halftime lead.

Lorenzen compiled 12 of her team-high 20 during the first half, when the Gators hit 48.1 percent (13-27) of their shots from the floor, dished six assists on their 13 buckets and held a 19-15 rebounding advantage.

In the decisive third quarter, LSU ripped out of the locker room and scored the first seven points for a one-point lead.

Washington finally got the Gators on the board, but LSU followed with a 16-4 march en route to taking the lead and a 50-42 advantage at the end of the third after outscoring Florida, 21-9.

During that third quarter, LSU outrebounded Florida 15-6, grabbing four on the offensive end. The Gators committed four turnovers that resulted in seven Tiger points, as the Gators hit just 23.1 percent (3-13) from floor, including a 1-7 effort from the three-point arc, while LSU shot 50 percent overall and 3-6 from deep.

LSU continued its scoring advantage early in the fourth quarter with the first seven points for a 5742 lead with 7:58 remaining
Florida refused to fold and staged a $10-0$ run and was within five, 57-52, with 2:44 remaining in the game. Chloe Jackson, who scored a game-high 23 points, stopped the Gator run with a jumper at the 1:38 mark. The Tigers closed out the game at the free throw line by converting 7 -of- 8 in the fina 51 seconds, with Jackson responsible for 5-of-6 during that span.

During that final minute, Florida answered the LSU free throws with buckets and great defensive plays from Tameria Johnson, but wasn't able to climb all the way back despite the 17-16 scoring edge in the fourth quarter

Paulina Hersler tied her career-high of 19 points, Haley Lorenzen tallied a double-double and Florida defeated Arkansas, 65-51, at Bud Walton Arena to earn its first SEC win of the season.

Hersler and Lorenzen, who comprise the Gator's frontcourt, combined for 31 points and 17 rebounds and led Florida's effort in the paint, where it outscored Arkansas, 36-18.

The Gators (9-10, 1-5 SEC), who never trailed during the game, use an impressive third quarter to build an 18-point lead and stood up to the Razorback's fourth-quarter rally to become just the second team in 10 games to defeat Arkansas (11-8, 2-4 SEC) in Fayetteville this year.
Delicia Washington also added a double-figure scoring night with 14 points and nine rebounds, while Lorenzen capped the game with 12 points, 10 rebounds and tied her career-high of five assists.

## Big Third Quarter by the Gators

The Gators controlled the third quarter and held an 18-7 scoring advantage over the Razorbacks who managed to hit just 11.1 percent $(2-18)$ during the quarter when Florida shot a steady 36.8 percent (7-19).

Combined with Hersler's three-pointer that ended the second quarter, Florida scored 13 straigh points after Arkansas had cut the Gator lead to four with 26 seconds remaining in the first half.

Hersler had eight points during that spurt, with Dyandria Anderson adding a three-pointer and Washington knocking down a pair from the line.

Arkansas scored the next four points, but Florida responded with 10 consecutive points for a 53-35 ead and 26 seconds left in the third quarter.

## Standing their Ground in the Fourth Quarter

Arkansas jumped out with the first seven points as part of a 11-2 run to start the fourth quarter and cut Florida's lead to 10 points, $55-45$, with 6:58 remaining.
During the first $3: 14$ of the period, Florida had three turnovers - two of them unforced - that resulted in four points. The Razorbacks also collect a pair of offensive rebounds during the early spurt that helped in the host's $8-2$ spurt.

Washington and Lorenzen added buckets before Arkansas came right back with six consecutive points and Florida's lead was down to single digits with 3:51 to play.

Hersler stepped up with a tough inside basket and Nakkasoglu followed with a pair of free throws with 39 seconds remaining before Washington closed the game's scoring with a layup.

## First Half at a Glance

Florida jumped out to a quick 9-0 lead with scoring from Washington, Hersler (five points) and Lorenzen that forced an early Arkansas timeout just 2:24 into the game.

The Razorbacks responded out of the break with the next four points and the team traded buckets over next four minutes before Arkansas cut UF's lead to two on a three-pointer from Malica Monk with $1: 47$ left in the opening quarter.

Sydney Searcy answered with a trey for the Gators who ended the quarter with an 18-13 lead.
Funda Nakkasoglu started the second with a three-pointer and with Searcy's bucket ignited a 13-2 run that gave Florida a $28-15$ lead with 6:23 remaining in the second. Searcy capped the spree with her second trey, just one game after missing all six of her long-range attempts.

Hersler had the other two buckets during the march, as she ended the first half with 12 points, capping the period's scoring with her second three that answered the Razorback's pair of treys and Florida marched into the locker room with a $35-28$ lead.

## Game 20: Florida 61, Ole Miss 60

January 21, 2018 * Exactech Arena * Gainesville, FL
Florida overcame a 13-point deficit to start the fourth quarter by outscoring Ole Miss, 18-4, in the final period to post a 61-60 victory at Exactech Arena on Sunday afternoon.
The Gators scored the first 14 points of the fourth quarter and took a $59-56$ lead with 2:50 remaining. The Rebels came back with the next two buckets for a one-point edge, before Haley Lorenzen grabbed an offensive rebound and put it in with 27 seconds remaining that proved to be the game-winner.

Ole Miss had a chance to win it with 9.1 seconds to play, but Lorenzen blocked Alissa Alston's layup and Dyandria Anderson grabbed the rebound with one second remaining. The Gators inbounded the ball and secured their second consecutive SEC victory after dropping their first five.

Lorenzen finished with a game-high 18 points and a career-high 13 rebounds for her 11th dou ble-double this season and 15th of her career. The Gator senior scored seven of her points during the fourth quarter on 3 -of- 4 shooting, that included a deep three-pointer she launched as the shot clock expired with 5:20 remaining that cut Florida's deficit to three points, 56-53, and sent the Gators' fans into a frenzy
Delicia Washington also recorded 15 points and 10 rebound with four assists

## How It Happened

Florida took the early lead and held the 18-14 edge by the end of the first quarter. The Gators continued with the first six points of the second and took a 24-14 lead with less than two minutes in.

Florida, however, made just one of its final nine shots of the first half and committed five turnovers during the final 8:33, as Ole Miss went on a 15-2 run in the final 8:09 and reversed a 24-14 Gators lead into a 29-26 Rebels advantage entering the locker room. The Gators scored a season-low eight points in the second quarter, while Ole Miss tacked on 15 to its total.

The Rebels continued to outscore Florida in the third and finished the period with Bree Glover hitting a three as the horn sounded to end the quarter that gave Ole Miss a 56-43 lead.

Both teams shot well in that third quarter, with Ole Miss hitting 68.8 percent (11-16) and Florida 58.3 percent (7-12).

Then came the deciding fourth, when every possession became magnified.
Funda Nakkasoglu got the scoring started with a layup after an Ole Miss miss. Paulina Hersler then added a jumper and Florida was within single digits that prompted an early Rebels timeout.

Madinah Muhammad, who finished with 17 points, missed her shot and the Rebels got the offen sive board, before Washington came up with a steal.

Nakkasoglu found the bottom of the net from beyond the arc and Ole Miss wouldn't connect on its next possession, as Lorenzen came up with the defensive board. With the shot clock winding down Lorenzen had the ball well outside the arc but launched it as the shot clock expired and dropped in and Florida was within three points, 56-53, with 5:20 remaining

The Rebels missed and Washington's layup at the 4:27 mark had Florida within one point, 56-55
Muhammad's three attempt was off the mark, as was Anderson's at the other end, but she followed her miss and found Washington for the jumper with 3:22 left and Florida had its first lead since the second quarter.

After another one-and-done for Ole Miss, Nakkasoglu's trey attempt was off but Lorenzen grabbed one of her four fourth-quarter offensive rebounds and put it in for the three-point lead and 2:50 remaining. Ole Miss called a timeout and responded with the next four points on layups from Promise Taylor and Alston for the 60-59 lead with 1:57 on the clock.
Florida missed its next three shots, but Alston wouldn't connect either. With 31 seconds remaining, Washington fired up a three that hit the back board and dropped into Lorenzen's hands and she put it in for the 61-60 lead that held up for the finish

Junior Funda Nakkasoglu scored 19 and Florida held the rebounding edge against the taller Mississippi State squad, however, the No. 2-ranked Bulldogs took advantage of several missed opportunities and an impressive third quarter to earn the 90-53 decision at Humphrey Coliseum.

Sophomore Delicia Washington notched her fifth double-double of the season and sixth of her career with 10 points and 10 rebounds, as Florida shot 39.7 percent overall from the floor compared to MSU's 54.4 percent effort, the highest by a Gator opponent this season

Mississippi State improved to 21-0 overall - 7-0 in the Southeastern Conference - and set the program record for best start to a season.

## How It Happened

The teams traded scores for the first three minutes of the second half before MSU scored five straight points for a 46-28 advantage. Jalaysha Thomas converted a layup that prevented a larger run, however, MSU came right back with a score.

Nakkasoglu drilled a three-pointer that had Florida within 15 points with $4: 36$ left in the third, but the Bulldogs countered with 11 straight points that started a devastating 16-2 run over a 2:50 span for a 29-point difference with 1:26 remaining in the third quarter and the Gators wouldn't recover.

Florida shot a respectable 46.2 percent during that third quarter, however, MSU hit 64.7 percent as it outscored the Gators 31-14 to carry a comfortable 66-37 lead into the final period.

## Gators Kept It Close Early

Mississippi State scored seven consecutive points to build an early 13-4 lead and the teams traded buckets for the next three minutes before Victoria Vivans' shot with 44 seconds left in the first quarter gave the hosts a 10-point advantage.

Sydney Searcy answered with a three-pointer from the corner to end the first frame's scoring and ignited a 10-2 run that cut Florida's deficit down to $22-20$ with $5: 41$ remaining in the second quarter.

The Gators had chance to tie the game on their next possession but couldn't inbound the ball and the Bulldogs made them pay with a quick Vivans' bucket that sparked an 13-0 MSU swing

Dyandria Anderson set up on the wing and Haley Lorenzen found her for a three-pointer that halted he Bulldog spree with 31 seconds left in the first half. Florida had missed nine consecutive field goals prior to Anderson's trey, as the Bulldogs took a 35-23 halftime lead.

Nakkasoglu scored 13 of UF's 23 first-half points, as she hit 5 -of-8 from the field that include a three-pointer and a pair of free throws

Lorenzen collected nine rebounds during the first 20 minutes and helped the Gators hold a 21-18 edge on the boards

## Game 22: No. 21/20 Georgia 66, Florida 57

It has become a frustrating trend for Florida this season - the Gators hold a late lead and can't seem to close out for the win. On Sunday, they battled through their 11th game decided by 10 points or less and came up on the short end of a 66-57 decision to No. 21 Georgia.

Florida dropped to 4-7 in those tight games, including a 1-5 record in Southeastern Conference action. The Gators have held at least a two-point lead in eight of their nine league games this season and jumped out to a double-digit lead in three games, only to drop all three of those, including Sunday's contest against the Lady Bulldogs that snapped Florida's two-game win streak in the series.

Paulina Hersler finished with a career-high-tying 19 points for Florida, while Funda Nakkasoglu recorded 18 points and Haley Lorenzen 12. Delicia Washington collected a game-high 13 rebounds and managed to score her lone points of the game with 8.4 seconds remaining and extended her game scoring streak to 41

How It Happened
Florida held a 42-35 lead entering the fourth quarter where Georgia outscored the Gators 31-15 to win its seventh consecutive game while handing the Gators their second straight setback.
The Lady Bulldogs scored the first eight points of the deciding final quarter that featured five lead changes and one tied score. Florida called a timeout after losing the lead for the first time since there was 5:32 remaining in the second quarter.

Hersler banked in a 15 -footer to stop the run and swung the lead back to the Gators.
The lead went back and forth for the next two minutes before Maya Caldwell hit a three-pointer for a 49-46 Georgia edge. Florida countered Georgia's field goals over the next minute before Simone Costa's three was followed by a transition layup by Cailya Robinson for a six-point Dawg advantage with 2:25 on the clock.

Neither team would score for the next minute until Dyandria Anderson dropped in a baseline floater with 65 seconds left.

Georgia missed on its ensuing offensive possession but hustled for the loose offensive rebound with 43 seconds remaining and Florida was forced to foul. The Dawgs next four points, as well as their final 10 points of the game came from the free throw line in the last 33.6 seconds to seal the win, as the Gators were able to counter each Georgia possession with two points but weren't able to make up any ground

The Gators used a run of 13-2 to take a 13-6 lead with 3:33 left in the first quarter before Georgia immediately countered with a 9-0 run and took a 15-14 lead at the end of the initial frame.
Florida started the second quarter with a 16-5 run that bled into the first 70 second of the third for a 30-20 advantage with 8:50 on the clock
Florida outscored Georgia, 12-5, in the second quarter and assumed a 42-35 halftime lead

In a game that featured 10 lead changes and six tied scores, Florida matched No. 15 Missouri possession-for-possession and even had the ball with a chance to win it but a three-pointer at the buzzer fell short in a 66-64 loss at Mizzou Arena Monday evening.

The Gators defense held the Tigers without a score in the final minute and got the ball back with 12.1 seconds remaining. Florida set up for the final shot, but Mizzou's defense gave the Gators fits and forced Haley Lorenzen to launch a deep three as the final horn sounded.

Florida held a lead in all four quarters with its last a 55-54 edge with 7:07 remaining. Six consecutive points by Jordan Frericks, who finished with 18 for the game, pushed MU's lead to five, 60-55, with 5:23 on the clock.

Funda Nakkasoglu followed with a pair of free throws with 4:34 on the clock and the teams traded scores for the remainder of the game. Nakkasoglu did halt the trend of exchanging exact points when she drained a three-pointer with 61 seconds left that put Florida within two.

That's when MU held possession but wasn't able to score and the ball went to the Gators with 12.1 on the clock and a chance to tie or win the game. Instead, Florida dropped to 4-8 in games decided by 10 points or less, including a tough 1-6 mark in Southeastern Conference games.

Delicia Washington scored a season-high 23 points on an efficient 7-of-15 night overall that included 3 -of- 8 from three and 6 -of- 6 from the line.

Paulilna Hersler scored 12 of her 14 points in the first half that ended in a 32-all tie.
Dyandria Anderson scored all of her 12 points during the second half, when she connected on a trio of threes that included successful four-point-play. Lorenzen contributed 10 rebounds, eight points with three assists.

## What Led the Final Minutes

Washington came out of halftime with a quick steal and an uncontested layup that gave Florida a 34-32 lead. The teams traded scored for the next 1:27 before Anderson completed a four-point-play and the Gators took the 38-34 edge.

After yet another bucket from Cierra Porter, who finished with a game-high 27 points, Anderson drilled her second three within 67 seconds and Florida's lead was five, 41-36, with 7:41 remaining in the third quarter.

Back-to-back scores by Mizzou had the Tigers within two and teams traded scores for the next minute before the hosts ripped off the next six points, all from Frericks, that resulted in a 47-45 UM advantage with $1: 19$ remaining in the third.

Early On
Missouri jumped out behind the three-ball for a quick six-point edge and Florida wouldn't it let grow any larger than that, countering each bucket with one of their own. The Gators cut their deficit to one point after five straight points from Hersler, but the Tigers responded with a 7-2 march and regained the six-point advantage with 7:38 left in the second.

Florida then rallied with a 9-2 run and took a 27-24 lead with 4:03 remaining in the period. Washing ton scored six points during that spurt, while Hersler added the other five.
MU scored the next three points and evened the score before Washington's three kept the Gators in the lead with 1:25 remaining in the half.

The teams went back and forth the rest of the half with Porter completing a three-point-play with 18 seconds remaining to tie the score heading into the locker room.

UF Coach Cameron Newbauer - "I'm tremendous proud of our fight and team effort. I couldn't ask for anything more from our team right now. They played their guts out. We wanted to play that out there at the end. We believe we have a play we can run and get something out of. In hindsight,
there at the end, we probably should have called a timeout with maybe four seconds to go but I wanted to let them make the play and I'll take that one."
