THE SCHOLARSHIP:

The Hawaii State Chapter of the American Public Works Association is offering *six (6) one-thousand dollar (\$1,000) scholarships*. These scholarships are directed to students majoring in a subject that will benefit the field of Public Works. The application process is open to undergraduates currently enrolled in four-year degree programs and full-time students in community colleges, as well as post-graduate Masters and Doctoral candidates. Applicant must be enrolled in a college or university in the State of Hawaii. Students enrolled in an out-of-state school will not be eligible. Scholarships will be paid directly to the college or university in the awardee's name for tuition costs.

ENTRY CRITERIA

- To be eligible for consideration the applicant shall be majoring in a course of study that will lead to a career in public works. This can include the engineering field directly related to Public Works, i.e. Civil, Structural, Environmental, Construction Management or Transportation. It can also include environmental sciences, public administration, or any other relevant field.
- 2. The applicant shall be an <u>entering</u> Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior Undergraduate student, Masters or Doctoral candidate as of the fall 2017 school year.
- 3. The applicant shall meet the respective school's definition of full time standing for the 2017 / 2018 school year.
- 4. Evaluation criteria will include, in addition to scholastic considerations:
 - Beyond the classroom activities and interests
 - Community service efforts
 - Responses to essays and situational questions
- 5. Entry form can be computer inputted, however, format shall not be modified. Additional pages are allowed for response to questions.

- 4. The Public Works profession is filled with a diverse and talented cadre of professionals. What innovations or ideas do you bring to the table? How will you make a difference?
- 5. Why is it important to engage the public in the delivery of public works programs and services?
- 6. The local Public Works Department needs to design a new section of roadway improvements that are necessary for the safety of the community. The project is incompatible with the landscape due to wetlands and other critical areas. A number of homeowners and local residents feel the level of impact is too high. How would you deal with these issues as you manage this project? How would you respond to the public?
