Legislative Goals:

- Support measures that improve the rural health landscape
- Support the elimination of health care workforce shortages and the creation of a rural workforce pipeline
- Advocate for \$6M to the Rural Maryland Prosperity Investment Fund
- Support MAERDAF as budget request priority to enhance resources to rural nonprofits and increase capacity building
- Support full funding of the Maryland Community Health Resources Commission
- Support rural Maryland investments and economic stability
- Support efforts of both expansion and reimbursement for telehealth
- Advocate for reinstatement and preservation of appropriate federal rural designations across the state
- Advocate to maintain and increase funding to ensure access to health care services in rural Maryland

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MRHA's 1st Annual Legislative Forum




- MRHA held its 1st Annual Legislative Forum in partnership with the CHRC on January 26, 2017 at the Maryland House of Delegates in Annapolis.
