THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa is in its 118th season of football this year.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with 3,406 students, while New Mexico has an enrollment of 27,353 students.
- Tulsa averages 47.0 points per game, while New Mexico scores at a 26.7 clip.
- Tulsa ranks 3rd nationally for rushing at 363.7 yards per game, while the New Mexico defense ranks 7th against the run, only giving up 78.0 yards.
- The two teams are nearly identical in passing yardage, as Tulsa averages 185.3 yards per game and New Mexico 185 yards.

THE TULSA-NEW MEXICO SERIES . . .

- This is the 8th meeting between Tulsa and New Mexico, as the Golden Hurricane lead the series 5-2.
- Tulsa has won the last three games, including the last time the teams met in Albuquerque in 2015 with a 40-21 Tulsa win.
- Tulsa is 2-1 at home against New Mexico, winning the first game in 1989, 35-33, losing the next game in 1996, 34-23, and then defeating the Lobos in 2008 by a score of 56-14.
- Tulsa has a 20.8 margin of victory in the 5 wins, and has won the last three contests by a 31.7 margin.

QUICK HITS . . .

- D'Angelo Brewer is ranked 4th nationally for most rushing yards with 447 yards for a 149.0 game average, which ranks 6th in the nation.
- Brewer has the nation's top rushing performance this season with 262 yards coming against Louisiana.
- Tulsa's 66 points scored vs. Louisiana is tied for the 3rd most points in the NCAA this year, only behind Oregon's 77 and Missouri's 72.
- Tulsa has had back-to-back 400+ rushing games, including 424 yards vs. Louisiana and 423 yards at Toledo.
- Senior linebacker Craig Suits returned his second career INT for a touchdown at Toledo (37 yards) ... his first career INT return for a TD came in 2015.

PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN THIRD SEASON LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Philip Montgomery is in his third season with a 17-12 overall head coaching record with the Hurricane.
- Montgomery completed his second season in 2016 leading the Tulsa football program to a 10-3 record.
- He became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 Tulsa season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU.
- In his first year, Montgomery led Tulsa to six wins and to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl.
- Montgomery is the fourth coach in school history to take his first two teams to a Bowl game, and has coached 11 teams to bowl games in his 14 years as a coach.
- He became the fifth Tulsa head coach to lead his first team to a bowl game.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the final three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.
- Under his guidance, Baylor led the nation in total offense and scoring offense in each of his final two seasons.
- Before moving to Baylor, he spent five years at Houston, also under Art Briles.
- Before moving to the college ranks, he was the offensive coordinator for one year at Denton (Texas) HS ... before that spent six years at Stephenville HS, where he was a part of back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1998 and 1999.

FIRSTS . . .

- Eleven freshmen have seen their first collegiate playing time this season, including 5 true freshmen, including one walk-on, and 6 red-shirt freshmen.
- Four players made their first career start in the season opener – QB Chad President, WR Josh Stewart, DT Shemarr Robinson and DB Manny Bunch.
- In the third game at Toledo, true freshman defensive tackle Garrett Flanary made his first career start.
- It took true freshman Shamari Brooks only 3 games to have his first career 100-yard rushing game ... he had 141 yards and 3 TDs at Toledo in a reserve role.
- Reserve RB Corey Taylor II, who gained only 4 yards on 5 carries as a true freshman in 2016, had his first career 100+ rushing game with 111 yards for a 5.6 average in the opener at Oklahoma State.

OFFENSIVELY IN THE MONTGOMERY ERA . . .

- In 28 games under Philip Montgomery, Tulsa has scored over 40 points 19 times and has posted a 15-4 record when doing so.
- Tulsa came into the 2017 season averaging 39.8 points over the previous two years, including 37.2 points in 2015 and 42.5 points in 2016.
- Tulsa has gone over 500 yards of total offense in 19 games under Montgomery.
- The Golden Hurricane has gone over 600 yards 7 times under Montgomery.
- Tulsa has had 10 300+ yard rushing games in the Montgomery era, with eight coming in 2016 and two this season.
- Tulsa has had two 400+ rushing games under Montgomery, both coming in back-to-back games this year.
- In the Montgomery era, Tulsa has 99 offensive scoring drives out of 203 possessions in regulation under two minutes, including 35 under one minute ... that's 49-percent of the time that Tulsa's offensive scoring drives have taken under two minutes.
- Tulsa has seven 50+ scoring games in the last 17 games under Montgomery, dating back to the 2015 Camping World Independence Bowl when Tulsa scored 52 points.
- The Hurricane had four 50+ scoring games in 2016, the most since four 50+ scoring games in the 2010 season and before that 6 50+ games in 2008.

LOOK AT THESE NUMBERS . . .

- In the last two games, Tulsa has averaged 607.5 total yards (1,215), including 423.5 yards (847) on the ground, and 58.5 points (117).
- In that two-week span, Tulsa and the opposition combined for 2,490 total yards, including 1,263 in the Louisiana game and 1,227 yards in the Toledo contest.
- Tulsa and the opponent have combined for 213 points in the last two weeks, an average total of 106.5 points.

TULSA FACING ITS FOURTH 2016 BOWL PARTICIPANT . . .

- Tulsa faces New Mexico in the 4th straight week for the Hurricane of facing a 2016 Bowl team, following Oklahoma State, Louisiana and Toledo in the first 3 weeks.
- Tulsa is one of only five FBS programs to play all of its non-conference games in 2017 against teams that played in a bowl game last season.
- The others are Louisiana-Monroe, Oklahoma State, Rice and UCLA.
- Only three of the five teams (ULM, Rice, Tulsa) have four non-conference games, while Oklahoma State and UCLA will play just three non-conference games.
- A total of nine Tulsa opponents this year made bowl appearances last season.
- Tulsa's 2017 opponents that made bowl appearances last year include: Oklahoma State, Louisiana, Toledo, New Mexico and conference foes Navy, Houston, Memphis, USF and Temple.

BIG FIRST-HALF DEFENSIVE PLAYS BY SENIOR SUITS . . .

- Senior linebacker Craig Suits had his 4th career interception and his second return for a touchdown at the 3:17 mark of the first quarter against Toledo when he picked off a Logan Woodside pass and raced 37 yards to put Tulsa ahead 21-7.
- Then at the 6:25 mark of the 2nd quarter, on a 4th-and-inches from the 41-yard line, Suits stopped Terry Swanson shy of the first down . . . Tulsa's offense took possession at its own 42-yard line and five plays later scored for a 28-7 lead.
- Suits' first career interception return for a TD came in the 2015 regular season finale against Tulane with a 28-yard return that gave Tulsa the lead late in the game, a contest Tulsa needed to win to become bowl eligible.

100-YARD RUSHING FOR FRESHMAN BROOKS . . .

- True freshman Shamari Brooks became the 14th freshman (true or red-shirt) to gain 100 yards in a single game for the Golden Hurricane.
- Brooks gained 141 yards and 3 TDs on 18 carries against Toledo, which was the third game of his career.
- His 100+ game was the 22nd time in school history that a freshman had rushed for over 100 yards in a game, and the first time since 2015 when red-shirt freshman Ramadi Warren gained 139 yards against Cincinnati.
- Brooks' 141 rushing yards is the 9th best freshman rushing performance in school history.

3 FOR 100, FIRST TIME IN OVER 30 YEARS . . .

- Tulsa running backs D'Angelo Brewer and Shamari Brooks and quarterback Chad President did something against Toledo that hadn't happened in over 30 yards.
- Each player rushed for 100+ yards in that game – Brewer had 152 yards, Brooks 141 and President tallied 130 yards on the ground.
- The last time that feat was achieved came on Nov. 1, 1986 when running backs Derrick Ellison (177), Gill Johnson (177) and Kenneth Lee (106) each accomplished that feat against Wichita State.

PRESIDENT GETTING COMFORTABLE . . .

- Entering the season opener against Oklahoma State, the starting quarterback for the Hurricane was unknown until Tulsa's first possession when third-year sophomore Chad President took the field.
- In three games, President has completed 44-of-75 passes for 546 yards and has rushed for 214 yards, a 7.6 average and 4 TDs.
- In his first game as the starter, President completed 18-of-35 passes for 178 yards, and ran for another 69 yards on eight carries.
- In his second game, President completed 70-percent of his passes (14-of-20) for 243 yards, while throwing his first career TD pass and running for his first career TD.
- In game No. 3, President became the first Tulsa quarterback to rush for 100+ yards since Nov. 12, 2010 when G.J. Kinne had 190 yards rushing against Houston . . . President rushed for 130 yards and 2 TDs against Toledo.

AMONG THE TOP-10 IN THE AMERICAN . . .

- D'Angelo Brewer is ranked 2nd, Shamari Brooks 6th and Chad President 10th among the top American Athletic Conference rushers this week.
- Brewer averages 149 yards per game, Brooks 85 yards and President 71.3.
- Tulsa is one of two teams to have 3 players ranked among the top-10 in the league statistics for rushing . . . the other is USF, while Memphis has two players.

BREWER JUMPS UP CAREER LIST . . .

- D'Angelo Brewer jumped from 9th place to 4th place on the school's all-time rushing chart with his 262-yard rushing performance against Louisiana in the second game of the season.
- He came into that game with 2,433 career rushing yards and ended with 2,695 career yards.
- A week later, he had 152 rushing yards vs. Toledo, but did not make a move up the all-time list of rushers.
- Brewer now has 2,847 career yards and 18 touchdowns on 563 carries.
- Brewer is now 668 yards away from moving up any further on the career rushing list ... Trey Watts (2010-13) is in third place with 3,515 yards.

MORE ON BREWER'S 262-YARD PERFORMANCE, EARNS THE AMERICAN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS . . .

- D'Angelo Brewer became just the 5th Tulsa player to rush for over 200 yards twice in a career, and it was just the 23rd time overall that Tulsa has had a 200-yard rusher.
- He finished the Louisiana game with the 4th best rushing performance in school history with 262 yards on 38 attempts.
- Brewer's first 200+ rushing game came last year with 252 yards on 46 carries at Fresno State.
- The 200-yard game this year was his 10th career game of 100+ yards rushing.
- His three TDs against Louisiana was the most in his career.
- For his performance, Brewer was named the American Athletic Conference's co-Offensive Player of the Week for the week of Sept. 9.

BREWER'S LONG RUNS . . .

- Of all the yards and big plays that D'Angelo Brewer has made in his career, his first touchdown run this season was his longest run of his career when he raced 50 yards for his first touchdown of the season in the first quarter against Louisiana.
- Brewer bettered that run with a 60-yarder to the Louisiana 3-yard line in the final minute of the first half that led to Tulsa going ahead 38-23.
- His previous long run was 48 yards against Virginia Tech in the 2016 Camping World Independence Bowl.

SOPHOMORE DEFENDERS . . .

- Two 2-year sophomores, safety Manny Bunch and linebacker Cooper Edmiston, are in starting roles this year for the Hurricane after spending most of the 2016 season playing special teams.
- The duo is tied for the team-lead in tackles with 25 apiece, and each has one interception.
- They each turned in their career-highs for tackles and each had their first career interceptions against Louisiana ... Bunch had 13 stops to lead the Hurricane, while Edmiston was one back with 12 tackles.
- Edmiston followed up that game with a 10-tackle performance at Toledo.

600+ AND 400+ . . .

- Tulsa totaled 667 total yards on 92 plays against Louisiana for the most yards in the Philip Montgomery era.
- It marked the seventh time in the last three seasons that Tulsa has gone over 600 yards in total offense.
- It's also the 18th game in which Tulsa has gone over 500 yards in the Montgomery era.
- The Hurricane gained 424 yards rushing on 72 carries against Louisiana, which was the most rushing yards for Tulsa since gaining 439 yards against Ball State in the GMAC Bowl at the end of the 2008 season.
- Tulsa put together its second straight 400+ rushing game with 423 yards on 68 carries at Toledo.



MORE ON 400-YARD RUSHING GAMES . . .

- Tulsa rushed for 400+ yards in back-to-back games with 424 vs. Louisiana and 423 at Toledo.
- The last time Tulsa had a 400-yard rushing game was the same year that Tulsa had two 400 rushing games that season, which came in 2008 when the Hurricane had 489 yards vs. Tulane and 439 yards against Ball State in the GMAC Bowl.
- However, the last time Tulsa had two straight 400+ rushing games was in the 1986 season when the Hurricane had 503 yards vs. Wichita State (Nov. 1) and 429 yards at New Mexico (Nov. 8).

REDFORD IS MOVING ON UP . . .

- Senior placekicker Redford Jones came into the season with 239 points, needing 60 points to tie for the school's all-time scoring record.
- After scoring 27 points in the first three games (6 vs. Oklahoma State, 12 vs. Louisiana and 9 vs. Toledo), Jones is now only 33 points shy of the school record 299 points.
- Jones now has 266 career points for a 5th-place tie with Stu Crum (1978-82) on the school's all-time scoring list.
- His 41 career field goals ranks 7th on Tulsa's all-time chart for field goals made, as he trails the all-time leader, Jason Staurovsky (53 FGs, 1981, '83-85) by 12 field goals.

INTERCEPTIONS TURN THE TIDE . . .

- On back-to-back Louisiana possessions in the second half, Tulsa sophomore defenders intercepted passes that stopped Ragin' Cajun drives.
- Manny Bunch intercepted a pass at the Tulsa 5-yard line.
- On the Cajuns' next possession, Cooper Edmiston intercepted a pass at the Tulsa 27-yard line, which led to a Tulsa touchdown and a 45-35 lead .
- The INTs were the first for each of the two-year players.

SPECIAL TEAMS MAKES THE PLAY IN OPENER . . .

- True freshman deep snapper Adam Higuera, playing in his first career game, was in the right place at the right time against Oklahoma State.
- Higuera scored Tulsa's first touchdown of the 2017 season when he jumped on a fumble by OSU punt returner Jalen McCleskey in the end zone.
- Another newcomer, punter Thomas Bennett, forced the ball over McCleskey's head with a 60-yard punt.
- Senior CJ Gooden knocked the ball out of McCleskey's hands as Higuera pounced on it.
- The fumbled punt for a TD marked the second straight year that the Hurricane had a fumble punt return for a TD in the season opener, as the same happened in 2016 against San Jose State.

NICE DEBUT . . .

- Sophomore transfer Thomas Bennett punted for the first time in his collegiate career and turned in a performance where he averaged 44.6 yards on seven punts against Oklahoma State.
- His fourth punt of the game sailed 60 yards and over the head of the OSU punt returner, who eventually grabbed the ball but was forced into a fumble that Tulsa recovered in the end zone for its first points of the game.
- In three games, Bennett has averaged 42.7 yards per game on 12 punts.

YOUTH MOVEMENT . . .

- Among 55 players that have played in the first two games, Tulsa has had a total of 25 sophomores, red-shirt freshmen or true freshmen that saw playing time.
- Tulsa's total amount of freshmen, both true and red-shirt, and sophomores amounted to 45-percent. Tulsa had 14 sophomores, 6 red-shirt freshmen and 5 true freshmen included in that group.

MCKINLEY DOESN'T MISS A BEAT AFTER POSITION CHANGE . . .

- Junior McKinley Whitfield made the move from safety to STAR linebacker last spring.
- In his first game at STAR, Whitfield had a team-leading 10 tackles, including three stops for -9 yards ... all 10 of his tackles were solos.
- The 10 tackles was a career-high for Whitfield, surpassing his previous-high of 8 stops from a year ago.
- In three games, Whitfield has totaled 18 tackles, including 14 solos, 3 stops for -9 yards and one PBU.

FOUR ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS RETURN . . .

- Tulsa had 7 American Athletic Conference all-league selections as voted on by the conference coaches in 2016, and 4 of those returned to the Tulsa offense this year.
- Two running backs, one receiver and four offensive linemen earned all-conference accolades last year.
- Returning in 2017 is first-team offensive center Chandler Miller, as well as second-team selections — OG Tyler Bowling, OT Evan Plagg and RB D'Angelo Brewer.

ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP OFFENSES RETURNS SEVEN STARTERS . . .

- In 2016, Tulsa averaged 527.0 yards of total offense to rank fourth nationally and was seventh in the NCAA for scoring (42.5 ppg), eighth for rushing (261.7 ypg) and 30th for passing (265.3 ypg).
- Seven starters and 22 lettermen return from that offense.
- One of two Tulsa 1,000-yard rushers from last season return to the Tulsa roster in the likes of D'Angelo Brewer, who gained 1,435 yards for a 119.6 average per game.
- The offensive line returns four of five starters from a unit that paved the way for a school record eight 300+ yard rushing games.
- Tulsa returns 1,000-yard career receiver Justin Hobbs for his junior season.

WHAT RETURNED TO THE DEFENSE . . .

- The Tulsa defense returned 25 lettermen and six starters.
- In 2016, the Tulsa defense made great improvement, holding opponents to 10 points and 110 yards less than the previous season.
- The end spot returned as the strength of the front seven as Jesse Brubaker and Jeremy Smith were returning starters.
- Brubaker had a team-high 13.5 TFLs for - 60 yards, while Smith tallied eight stops for -52 yards in 10 games.
- The linebacker corps went through somewhat of an overhaul this year, but one mainstay, Craig Suits, returned for his senior season . . . Suits was Tulsa's lone defensive player with over 200 career tackles entering the season.
- A total of eight lettermen returned to the Tulsa defensive secondary, including four at safety and four at the cornerback slots.

WHAT??? TWO TULSA DEFENSIVE LINEMEN SCORING TOUCHDOWNS . . .

- Tulsa senior defensive linemen — Jesse Brubaker and Kolton Shindelar — have each scored two career TDs on interception returns.
- Brubaker had both his in 2016 ... he took back an INT for a 24-yard TD against San Jose State in the opener, and closed the season with a 66-yard TD return against Central Michigan in the Miami Beach Bowl.
- Shindelar, who began his collegiate career at tight end, had his second career INT return for a touchdown when he took an interception against North Carolina A&T 65 yards for the score in 2016.
- Shindelar's first INT return came in 2015 in the regular season finale against Tulane with Tulsa fighting for its sixth win and bowl eligibility.
- Shindelar intercepted a Tulane pass and went 89 yards for a touchdown to put Tulsa ahead 45-34 with 1:12 remaining in the game.

300-YARD RUSHING GAMES . . .

- It will take a lot to duplicate Tulsa's rushing game performance from the 2016 season when the Hurricane rushed for 300+ yards in eight games to establish a new school record.
- The eight 300+ rushing games surpassed the previous school record of six that was set in 1950, 1952 and 2008.
- Tulsa rushed for 305 yards vs. San Jose State, 336 at Fresno State, 315 vs. SMU, 330 vs. Tulane, 362 at Memphis, 342 vs. East Carolina, 348 at UCF and 306 yards against Cincinnati.
- The Hurricane has added two 400-yard rushing performances this season, and now has 10 300+ rushing games in the last 16 games.

REVIEWING THE 2016 SEASON . . .

- Tulsa made its 21st Bowl Game appearance in 2016 with a 55-10 win over Central Michigan in the Miami Beach Bowl,
- With a 10-3 record, Tulsa has now posted 10+ wins in 10 seasons (1916, 1920, 1942, 1982, 1991, 2007, 2010, 2016) and 11 wins twice (2008, 2011).
- Tulsa became the first school in NCAA DI/FBS history with a 3,000-yard passing (Dane Evans), two 1,000-yard rushers (James Flanders and D'Angelo Brewer) and two 1,000-yard receivers (Keevan Lucas and Josh Atkinson).
- Tulsa had the biggest comeback in school history when the Hurricane came back from a 31-point deficit at Fresno State for a 48-41 victory.
- Tulsa set a school record with eight 300+ yard rushing games in 2016.
- Tulsa scored 40+ points in 10 games last year, posting a 9-1 record.
- Tulsa running backs D'Angelo Brewer and James Flanders became the second tandem in school history to each rush for 1,000 yards in the same season.
- QB Dane Evans became the school's career passing leader with 11,071 yards, while James Flanders set the single-season rushing record with 1,629 yards.
- Keevan Lucas completed his career ranked third on the school's career receiving chart with 3,250 yards and tied for first for receiving TDs with 32.
- Tulsa scored 101 points from defensive takeaways.
- Tulsa's offense had eight 300+ rushing games, breaking the previous record of six 100+ rushing games that was established three times before.
- Tulsa had 37 scoring drives in regulation under two minutes in 2016, including 10 under one minute.
- Tulsa scored over 400 points last year for the ninth time in school history, and the 552 points was the 5th-most in school history.

MORE QBs ON TULSA ROSTER THIS YEAR . . .

- In addition to the five QBs on the Tulsa roster – Seth Boomer, Will Hefley III, Brandon Marquardt, Chad President, Luke Skipper – there are a number of other Tulsa players who played the position in high school.
- Eight additional Hurricane players quarterbacked their high school teams at least one season or more as the starter.
- Defensive starters – end Jesse Brubaker, linebacker McKinley Whitfield and safety Manny Bunch – started at quarterback at least one year of high school.
- In addition, other defenders to do the same include safety Sam Gottsch, linebacker Zaven Collins and cornerback Keidrien Wadley.
- Offensive starters – running back D'Angelo Brewer and Keenen Johnson – were both starting quarterbacks in high school.
- In addition, defensive end Jeremy Smith and receivers Bishop Louie and Jordan Brown had seen some time behind center in their careers.

WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).

- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.

- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.

- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.

- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.

- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.

- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers).

- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).

 - △ First team to have a QB rush and pass for over 200 yards in the same game (Steve Gage, 1986)
 - △ First team to have a 5,000-yard passer (Paul Smith), three 1,000-yard receivers (Brennan Marion, Trae Johnson, Charles Clay) and one 1,000-yard rusher (Tarrion Adams) in 2007.
 - △ First team to have a 3,000-yard passer (Dane Evans), two 1,000-yard rushers (James Flanders, D'Angelo Brewer) and two 1,000-yard receivers (Keevan Lucas, Josh Atkinson) in 2016.
