

2018 Annual Report Division of Hospital Medicine

DIVISION DESCRIPTION

The Division of Pediatric Hospital Medicine provides exceptional coordinated, family-centered inpatient general pediatric care at American Family Children's Hospital and SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital. The division also houses the Pediatric Complex Care Program and participates in delivery of sedation services within American Family Children's Hospital.

Our scholarly work focuses on system improvements related to patient- and family-centered care, education in inpatient pediatric medicine, care of children with medical complexity and global health.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Ann Allen, MD, received the Department of Pediatrics' Lobeck Award for Outstanding Teaching in Pediatrics (Clerkship) at our residency graduation ceremony in June 2018.
- Ryan Coller, MD, MPH, received a 2018 UW Health Rising Star Clinical Excellence Award, which
 honors outstanding clinicians and educators who have, in a more limited tenure at UW Health and
 SMPH, demonstrated exceptional and measurable contributions to clinical practice.
- Ryan Coller, MD, MPH, and Mary Ehlenbach, MD, are co-principal investigators on a new four-year, \$226,521 grant from the Children's Hospital of Wisconsin and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Their project, "Healthcare Delivery System Innovations for Children with Medical Complexity," aims to improve the quality of life for children with medical complexity, the well-being of their families, and the cost-effectiveness of their care, by developing and implementing innovative care and payment models.

Drs. Coller and Ehlenbach also received a subaward for up to four years (\$75,000 in Year 1) from the University of Colorado-Denver and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). They will lead two initiatives for the new National Research Network for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCNet): an expert panel and stakeholder groups to develop a national research agenda for this population, and an evaluation of an innovative health information technology tool to collect repeated measures of caregiver confidence of the health of children with medical complexity over time.

In addition, Drs. Ehlenbach and Coller received a one-year, \$20,000 grant from the Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, on behalf of the Children's Health Alliance of Wisconsin's Medical Home Initiative. In their project, "Advancing Family-Centered Care Coordination for Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs," the Pediatric Complex Care Program will engage stakeholders and families to improve the shared care planning experience and documentation.

Finally, medical student Wenzhu Sun (mentors: **Ryan Coller, MD, MPH**, and **Mary Ehlenbach, MD**) received a Shapiro Summer Research Award for the project, "Diverting Children with Medical Complexity from the ED Through Complex Care."

- Mary Ehlenbach, MD, was selected as the inaugural recipient of the <u>Paster Family Foundation</u> <u>Innovation Award</u> for her work to design and implement the Pediatric Complex Care Program at American Family Children' Hospital, which has improved the health and touched the lives of over 300 children.
- **Jonathan Fliegel, MD**, received the Department of Pediatrics' Todd Varness Outstanding Clinical Teacher (Residency) at our residency graduation ceremony in June 2018.
 - Dr. Fliegel also served as lead editor for on-line publication of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) PREP Hospital Medicine (PREP HM), first released in 2018. PREP HM is the AAP's continuing medical education resource for self-study and preparation for the American Board of Pediatrics Pediatric Hospital Medicine certification examination, to be offered in Fall 2019.
- Michelle Kelly, MD, received a one-year, \$75,000 University of Wisconsin Institute for Clinical and
 Translational Research (UW ICTR) Clinical and Community Outcomes Research award for her project,
 "Sharing Doctors' Notes to Improve Parent Understanding of Their Hospitalized Child's Care Plan."
 Ryan Coller, MD, MPH; Daniel Sklansky, MD; and Shannon Dean, MD, also serve as project advisors.
- Medical student Lucia Covert (mentor: Kristin Shadman, MD) received a Shapiro Summer Research Award for the project, "Current Safe Sleep Education across Wisconsin Birth Hospitals."
- Residents in the University of Wisconsin Department of Family Medicine and Community Health's Madison residency program selected **Daniel Sklansky, MD,** as the 2018 recipient of its Clinical Teaching Award.
- **Nicole St Clair, MD**, was elected to a second term on the executive committee of the Section on International Child Health of the American Academy of Pediatrics.
 - Dr. St. Clair, along with **Sabrina Butteris, MD** led the development of "<u>Global Health in Pediatric Education: An Implementation Guide for Program Directors</u>," a national resource for educators developed on behalf of the American Board of Pediatrics Global Health Task Force.
- Sarah Webber, MD, and Natalie Guerrero, PhD, received a one-year, \$10,000 grant from the UW ICTR
 Medical Scientist Training Program (MSTP) Pilot Award Program for their project, "Community Health
 Worker Pilot Program for Latino Mothers and Infants." They will evaluate a targeted, evidence-based,
 linguistically and culturally relevant Community Wellness Worker-led postpartum support group
 program to improve maternal-child wellness in the Latino community.
 - Dr. Webber was also chosen from over 200 applicants as one of three American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) participants in the Women's Wellness through Equity and Leadership (WEL) cohort.
