## Merit Badges for OKPIK Winter Adventure Camp

All merit badges are listed as to whether they are a half day or full day course. The scout must choose which merit badges as well as any additional classes he would like to earn and sign up for the merit badges when doing online registration. The merit badge counselors are asking that Unit Leaders look at the merit badges that their scouts sign up for and if there are any requirements they may need to complete prior to the class or as a prerequisite. The counselors have also asked that the scout brings writing material as this helps keep the cost down. The merit badge worksheet will be provided. There is a counselor for each merit badge that we have to offer our scouts this year however, we may ask for help to control and assist in the instruction. We always encourage adult participation, involvement, and assistance.

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## What to Bring?

- Scouts should bring clothing that can get dirty or ruined while doing their merit badges.
- Scouts and leaders should bring at minimum the Part A & B Medical form. Please notify medical personnel of any medical concerns or necessary medications.
- Meals will be provided by Troops. Whatever it takes to feed your unit, you must bring. For example, if your unit wants 2 pieces of sausage for breakfast and you have 10 people to feed, you would need 20 pieces of sausage to feed your unit. **We also ask that you bring extra to feed 2 more people per unit.** Meals will be prepared by our kitchen staff and served. You must turn in all your food items at check-in before setting up your campsite (see below). You must also provide your own plates, utensils, cups, paper towels, napkins etc. for your unit.

- All units **MUST** bring the following items and turn in at check-in (again, enough for your unit plus 2 more people)
  - Jimmy Dean Fully Cooked Sausage Patties 24 count, eggs, frozen waffles, butter, syrup, hot chocolate, cold cuts, chips, loafs of bread, cookies, instant mashed potatoes, cans of sweet corn, muffins, juice. Also, please bring fruit and peanut butter for snacks during the day that will be available during the day and before meals. Please also bring Summer Sausage, Cheese and Crackers that you will share at the crackerbarrel.

## **Camp Safety**

Camp safety is everyone's responsibly however, the Camp Ranger will be the final authority on any safety issues.
