

### What's the best part about working/living in **Bessemer?**




### Do you have a memorable Bessemer story you would like to share?

# Skipper Goodwin

Skipper Goodwin is the Chairman, Chief Executive Officer, and President of First Financial Bank located at 1630 4th Avenue N. He spent majority of his life living and working in the Bessemer area and continues to serve the Bessemer community

### Describe your affiliation with the city of Bessemer?

My family moved on Muscoda Hill in the Jonesboro community when I was nine years old. I first attended Muscoda Elementary School in the third grade and later moved to Jonesboro Elementary School, continuing my education through the Bessemer School System. I graduated in the last class from Bessemer High School in 1970. I left Bessemer to attend the University of Alabama, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting in 1974. I obtained my CPA designation while being employed with Arthur Andersen & Co. for ten years. I decided to return to Bessemer and First Federal Savings Bank in 1995. The name eventually changed to First Financial Bank, and I've been here since.

### What's the best part about working/living in Bessemer?

First Financial Bank has been a part of Bessemer since 1936 and is a staple in the community. I am very proud to be a part of the continuation of this institution and all that it represents. It is extremely rewarding to be a part of a bank that is closely integrated into the community and is well respected by its residents, especially having grown up in Bessemer. We have close relationships with the local people as they save money with us and use other available services. We work to understand their needs and find the best answers to fit their specific needs.

### How has Bessemer changed over the years?

I believe the most obvious change in Bessemer over the years has been the influx of new businesses into the city, with Amazon being the most recent commitment. Numerous businesses have located near the intersection of I-459 and Morgan Road. Also, there is a major shopping center at I-459 and Eastern Valley Road near McCalla. There are many more new businesses that are worthy of mention, in addition to our mainstays of Bright Star, Bob Sykes BBQ, Simmons Sporting Goods, and First Financial Bank, the only bank with headquarters in the western area. With these new businesses, as well as existing businesses, new leadership talent is being brought into the city. The challenge for the City is to keep this new talent and maintain an infrastructure to accommodate the needs of new residents. Entertainment has improved over the years; it includes the waterpark, blues festival, new community center, civic center, YMCA, autobahn indoor gocart racing, golf course, theater, and Chamber of Commerce events.

### What advice would you give someone looking to open a business in and/or relocate to the Bessemer area?

I would tell them that close and lasting relationships are established in the business and personal community. You get to know your customers and are able to help them make meaningful lifetime decisions. Becoming active in the community can have a true impact on its direction and solving its problems. You can make a real difference! Bessemer is located in a great position between Birmingham and Tuscaloosa and is poised for future success and growth.

### Provide details about your current or former profession/business.

I have been fortunate to work in professions that I enjoyed and were rewarding to me personally. After graduating from The University of Alabama, I worked as a CPA with an international accounting firm in Birmingham. I learned a great deal in those ten years; the experiences were valuable as it provided many options for my future career. I accepted a position with Secor Bank, a bank that was formed by the combination of 4 separate banks throughout Alabama - Birmingham, Huntsville, Tuscaloosa, and Mobile. Secor then acquired a large bank in New Orleans, with their total assets approximated \$3 billion. At age 35, I





was named President of Secor. Eventually, the bank was sold and merged into Regions Bank. I was hired by First Federal Savings Bank in 1995, which eventually changed its name to First Financial Bank. I currently serve as the Chairman, CEO and President of First Financial Bank. The bank expanded through the years by acquisition and new branches. I consider myself very fortunate to return to my hometown, conduct business, and have personal relationships with so many fine people.

### Do you have a memorable story you would like to share?

Unfortunately, a story that really hits home with me deals with the personal and financial hardships of someone I have known for a long period of time. Over the years, he had gained a lot of trusts, in my opinion. My friend visited me in my office, and he began to tell me his current personal situation with his family. Our discussion would become personal and emotional. He covered some family hardships and difficulties that he has endured. My friend could see no way out of the burdens he had and needed help with a financial plan, if possible. Together, we went through all relative information and more. I provided a plan to follow and gave my thoughts on personal steps that must be taken since I was asked. Then, we set up follow-up visits to stay on track. He eventually felt relief as he followed the plan to get back on

track. To this day, all is going well. These types of interactions

are what I will always treasure and never forget. •

# JUSTICE FOR ALL CHANGING THE PERSPECTIVE

The responsibility of a district attorney (DA) is to manage the prosecutor's office and to assist law enforcement in the investigation of matters of alleged crimes that occur within their jurisdiction. DA's issue

warrants and file criminal charges in cases where probable cause is determined or convene a grand jury to present evidence of criminal cases. The overall objective is to promote public safety and prosecute people that are in violation of the laws of the State of Alabama. Such violations are customarily presented to the DA's office by law enforcement. Additionally, those cases that are not initially processed by law enforcement for warrants are presented to a grand jury by a district attorney for them to determine whether enough evidence exists that would make it more probable that a crime has been committed by the named individual. The district attorney must work with other entities to support one another in their efforts of serving the community and making greater change.



The Jefferson County and Bessemer Cutoff District Attorneys' offices extended the role of a district attorney and framed it within the mission work closely with local police departments in the surrounding areas, along with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department to prosecute tain community trust, and empower youth for the future."

of offenders. Working closely with the different agencies serves as a message to offenders of the law that there is a unified effort to combat crime and improve the safety of our communities. It is the role of law enforcement to arrest individuals that violate the law, investigate said violations, and provide evidence for the DA's office to examine and use to prosecute offenders of crime. Both law enforcement and the DA's office share information and develop good synergy that is beneficial for the cases that are prosecuted, as well as build great relationships and support systems for one another. Historically, the success of a district attorney has been measured by the number of convictions that are procured during their term in office. However, District Attorney Lynneice O. Washington has



Lynneice O. Washington was elected in 2016 as Jefferson County District Attorney for the Bessemer Cutoff Division. "I've learned the value of partnering with other policing agencies during the time that I served as an assistant DA for the same office that I now serve as the elected District Attorney. As I've worked with law enforcement officers in gathering evidence and trial preparation, it was important to proceed as a unified team to effectively prosecute cases," says DA Washington. She is also mindful of the importance of forging and building upon relationships with law enforcement agencies, legislatives and Jefferson County authoritative bodies to build camaraderie and to be more effective for the people that she serves. One of the first collaborative projects that she spearheaded was creating the first DA-formed task force, compiled of a multitude of governmental agencies such as the U.S. Marshals, Gulf Coast Regional Fugitive Task Force, FBI, and Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA), just to name a few. As a collaborative unit, 126 arrests were made, and 212 outstanding warrants were cleared; more than 32 firearms and drugs with a street value of \$163,000 were seized over a 3-month period. In the short time that she has been in office, DA Washington has established a Cold Case Unit, a Victim Service Unit, and successfully proposed a bill to the Alabama State Legislature to add

two additional assistant DA slots within her office in an effort to meet the demand of an increased volume of cases. She implemented the Helping Families Initiative Program to address chronic absenteeism and behavior issues of students attending school in the Bessemer, Fairfield and Midfield districts. It is used as a crime prevention tool and a means to strengthen the retention of student school enrollment. Currently, she is working to begin the first Conviction Review Unit in the state of Alabama. Both Jefferson County District Attorneys' offices will be working together to review cases that have been prosecuted in their respective jurisdiction regarding individuals that may have been wrongfully convicted. "There have been many people exonerated from death sentences due to wrongful convictions. DNA Technology has advanced tremendously over the years and has been instrumental in the release of many who were wrongfully convicted. It is the duty of those in law enforcement to seek justice. If the wrong person is convicted, the guilty party remains free to possibly re-offend and destroy another family. True closure does not exist for victims until justice is served appropriately. The value of human life is too precious to ignore the demand for justice," says DA Washington.

As her administration began in 2017, she implemented measures to reduce crime and improve the safety of communities. She launched an in-



(Cairone & Mackrain, pg.107) The social environment (schedules, responsibilities, expectations, and routines) works in tandem with the physical environment (materials, displays, learning areas, furniture, and maintenance) to create a positive and supportive learning community.

### **Classroom Community**

A well-managed and inclusive classroom supports constructive and positive relationships, and discourages inappropriate behaviors. The goal is to help children develop self-regulation and autonomy. Creating this environment is a shared responsibility of the lead and auxiliary teacher, the director and all staff members (food service, custodial, special area teachers, volunteers, etc.) who work with the Pre-K child in the OSR classroom.

### **Discipline and Behavior Management** (Developmentally Appropriate Practice in Early Childhood Programs, pgs. 150-159)

"Teaching preschoolers is hard work and can quickly become overwhelming when children's behavioral concerns are a problem. There is no one solution or recipe that will ensure every day runs smoothly; however, there are steps teachers can take to help create a peaceful and inviting classroom, where both children and teachers feel safe and happy. Creating such places and implementing these practices ensures learning is happening at each and every moment, and children are gaining the social and emotional skills they need for a lifetime of success in and beyond the classroom." (Cairone & Mackrain, pg. 5)

### Planning, Teaching, Learning

Planning for instruction includes creating a daily schedule, daily lesson plans, short term lesson plans, (weekly/monthly themes and lessons), and long term lesson plans (themes or studies for the year). The interests, curiosity, and needs of the children should be taken into consideration when developing classroom plans. Developing lessons and free choice activities around themes or studies, maximizes learning in a meaningful context based on the NAEYC Developmentally Appropriate Practice

### **Gross Motor/Outdoor Play**

Daily activities should include many opportunities for young children to develop competence and confidence in their gross motor skills. While children develop many of their physical capabilities through play they also need planned movement activities with verbal and modeled instruction and structured physical skill development opportunities. The OSR Pre-K classroom schedule is required to include 60 minutes of gross motor activity. This 60 minutes may be broken into smaller segments of time within the day. •





Alabama STEM Education (ASE) is a 501(c) 3 organization whose mission is to empower the minds of underrepresented, underserved youth in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. It is also their desire to equip the students with the skills to impact the 21st century workforce. The visionary of this organization, Mrs. Juanita Graham, is the author of Mr. Stem, a children's introduction to STEM which is available at Barnes and Noble, Books a Million and Amazon.

Since its inception in 2014, ASE has been providing innovative, engaging, and interactive out of school time activities for more than 400 youth in Jefferson County yearly. ASE recognizes there is a persistent "opportunity gap" where STEM learning is more often available to youth attending high-performing schools and living in affluent and middle-class communities, while students who attend under-resourced schools, in poor communities, often lack exposure to math and science-rich environments and opportunities for STEM learning. ASE

is working to close that gap for children in the Bessemer, Birmingham and Jefferson County communities.

In 2015, Alabama STEM Education contracted out with UAB Engineering department to facilitate the Summer Enrichment program at Bessemer City Middle School. Since that program's collaboration, UAB, Auburn University, Lawson State Community College, Miles College, and University of Montevallo have all been engaged with ASE students to give them the best of STEM training. Today, ASE is recognized in Black Belt counties, Bessemer, Birmingham and beyond for being a highquality asset to children in their communities and schools. ASE's spirit of partnership and networking fosters a community of cooperation among parents, students, businesses, and other organizations to provide each program participant with a supportive learning environment.

Alabama STEM Education has been providing the community of Bessemer with economic growth since 2014. ASE has purchased more

than 17,000 sq. ft of property from the city. ASE has also provided more than 20 jobs since 2014. Bessemer is now more aware of the importance of STEM Education, leading to an increase in students' reading abilities, academic accomplishments and conflict resolution skills.

Alabama STEM Education provides hands-on quality STEM training to K-12 underrepresented, underserved low-income students in Bessemer and surrounding areas with the following programs:

- TAPE (Tutoring and Practical Exposure) introduces STEM-related fields and activities with homework assistance/school projects in an after-school setting. Students are picked up from school by the Alabama STEM Education and brought to their facilities to begin training. From 3-6 PM Monday – Friday, students will be engaged in very demanding hands-on activities. Students also have the opportunity to gain life skills through discussing issues at home or school and learning how to resolve them using critical thinking.
- "Raise the Bar" is a 10-week immersion program available on Saturdays only. Professors and senior STEM-related career students from collaborating universities such as UAB, Auburn University, Lawson State Community College, work alongside certified Alabama STEM Staffers to teach on subjects listed on the Alabama STEM Education's curriculum. Students receive breaks accompanied by a snack and light music for relaxation. At the end of the 10 weeks, students

participate in a certificate ceremony, which consists of presentations from students of what they learned during their time with ASE.

 Alabama STEM Early Childhood Learning Center (ECLC) is a state-licensed registered Child Care Resource facility that teaches children from 10 months to school age. Children are welcomed from 6:00 am to 6:30 pm, with breakfast, lunch, and dinner being provided for a tuition cost of \$140 week. At this time, ECLC

services are only available in the Birmingham area.

The STEM Summer Fun Camp is a two-month camp that exposes students to trips, activities, and engagement all centered around Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math! This program signs up 85 to 130 students per summer. STEM Camps are housed in different locations to accommodate the overwhelming response from parents. The cost is \$350 per child per month and includes all activities, trips, breakfast, lunch, and a different color tee shirt for every day of the week. Two universities per summer are chosen for exposure to college life.

Lawson State Community College now has the largest educational program focused on automotive technology in the State of Alabamageared towards preparing future automotive technicians for an everevolving, high demand field. The Lawson State Alabama Center for Automotive Excellence (ACAE), under the Career Technical educational division, that has a variety of courses centered around Auto Body Repair, Auto Mechanics, and Medium/Heavy Truck.

The expansion of the ACAE was designed to accommodate more students while continuing to house Lawson State's internationally rec-

ognized automotive partners Chrysler, General Motors, Ford Motor Company and Toyota North America.

In addition to these partners, Lawson State added the MercedesTech program following an official announcement with Mercedes-Benz U.S. International (MBUSI) in February of 2019. This new partnership and program allows students to receive a long-certificate in automotive technology with the potential to lead to full-time employment in the auto industry. Courses in the Mercedes Tech Program are centered in automotive technology–preparing students for possible careers as Mercedes repair technicians within the MBUSI production facility located in Vance, Alabama.

"This partnership really solidifies Lawson State Community College as a leader in training for the automotive industry," said Tommy Hobbs, assistant dean of Workforce Development at Lawson State Community College. The MercedesTech program officially welcomed students in Fall 2019 with over 30 enrolled in the first cohort. •




# Lawson State Creates a Lane in Coding

Lawson State Community College was one of the first community colleges in the state to offer Apple's Swift coding classes within its Business and Information Technologies division in the computer science program. Launched in January 2018, the col-

lege began its Swift Apps Certification Training for the iOS operating system deemed as one of the fastest growing jobs in the nation.

The program provides instruction and training on coding and designing fully- functioning apps. "This is a great time to get in on app development and learn the programming language correctly," said Dr. Alice Milton, associate dean for the Business and Information Technologies division. "Upon completion of the program, you will have the training needed to develop

With over two million apps in the Apple app store, app software developers are in high demand with the potential annual earnings of \$103,620, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.The coding boot camp returned for the second year in Summer 2019 with a week of free sessions the week of June 10, 2019 with students from area middle and high schools. Dr. Kesha James, director of Distance Education, and Mrs. Eula Todd, manager of Title III, again led the camps that consisted of interactive, hands-on labs, guided projects, introductions to terminology, and concepts to build a basic iOS app from scratch.

The curriculum designed by Apple operates on the premise that anyone can learn, write and teach code.



# LSCC Prepares Students for Growing Mechatronics Field

Lawson State Community College is a progressive institution constantly changing and developing programs and coursework based off what employers and businesses are searching for, and this practice is most evident in the college's Mechatronics program established in 2011.

According to CareerExplorer.com, Mechatronics is a multidisciplinary field of science that integrates the principals of mechanical engineering, electronics, computer engineering, telecommunications engineering, systems engineering and control engineering into a unified discipline, while keeping the core mechanical engineering education.

Mechatronics is a field of innovation that works to provide solutions to problems that could occur in engineering, and the U.S. Department of Labor has listed it as an emerging area for employment, which is projected to grow by 4% in the next eight years.

Lawson State is considered a leader in preparing students for this industry with a promise of personal attention and a student to faculty ratio of less than 20 to 1—considered to be especially desirable for individuals who want to have access to instructors, resources, and opportunities.

"Those interested in mechatronics will have the opportunity to perform in a lucrative career where there are many manufacturers in the area, and this industry is going to continue to have a high demand in the coming years," said Nancy Wilson, the director of Manufacturing and Engineering Technology at Lawson State. With the Bessemer campus being located close to the manufacturing hub of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, the college has been able to carve out a lane to train students with apprenticeships and paid internships for jobs available in surrounding regions.

Following the helm of the Alabama Workforce Council, which has set a goal of adding 500,000 high-skilled employees to Alabama's workforce by 2025, the college has worked diligently to be a bridge in connecting students with companies such as Brose, Flex-N-Gate, Gestamp, and Lehigh Hanson. •

# Zucchini Enchiladas (Yields 4 Servings)

### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 large onion, chopped	1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
2 cloves garlic, minced	4 large zucchinis, halved lengthwise
1 c. shredded cheddar	1 c. shredded Monterey jack
2 tsp. chili powder	3 c. shredded rotisserie chicken
2 tsp. ground cumin	1 1/3 c. red enchilada sauce, divided
To taste, Kosher salt	Sour cream, for drizzling, fresh cilantro, for garnish



### **DIRECTIONS:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion and cook, stirring until soft, 5 minutes.
- 2. Add garlic, cumin, and chili powder and season with salt., Cook until fragrant, about 1 minute.
- 3. Add chicken and 1 cup of enchilada sauce and stir until coated.
- 4. On a cutting board, use a Y-shaped vegetable peeler to peel thin slices of zucchini.
- 5. Lay out 3 slices, slightly overlapping, and top with a spoonful of chicken mixture.
- 6. Roll up and transfer to a baking dish. Repeat with remaining zucchini and chicken mixture.
- 7. Spoon remaining cup enchilada sauce over zucchini enchiladas and top with both cheeses.
- 8. Bake until cheese is melty and enchiladas are warmed through, 20 minutes.
- 9. Top with sour cream and cilantro before serving.

There is a general sense of optimism in Bessemer as 2020 approaches.

Several new developments this past decade have caused people around the state and southeast to take notice of the growth taking place in Bessemer, The Marvel City.

Amazon will open a 855,000 square foot Robotics Fulfillment Center off Powder Plant Road in 2020. The facility will employ at least 1,500 and has capacity for more than 3,000 employees. The \$325 million investment by Amazon is one of the largest in the city's history. The Fulfillment Center is the first in the state of Alabama.

In November 2019, Gov. Kay Ivey announced that Carvana, a leading e-comnerce platform for buying and selling used cars, is planning to build a \$40 million distribution center off Morgan Road in Bessemer. Carvana will employ more than 300 employees at the facility when it opens in two years.

- Officials with the city of Bessemer and the Bessemer Airport Authority broke ground in June 2019 on construction of a 14,220 square foot hangar project at the Bessemer Municipal Airport. The \$750,000 project will include 10 individual T-hangars with large opening doors to accommodate Cirrus aircraft.

Construction will start soon on an extension of the city's Multi-use Rail-Trail along 14th Street South. A pedestrian bridge across 14th Street will link

the Rail-Trail to the city's Recreation Center at Roosevelt Park. City leaders envision the trail leading into the downtown district.

There is renewed interest in Downtown Bessemer. The Downtown area, which includes the city's National Historic District, has been designated an Opportunity Zone by the U.S. Treasury. Such projects as the Lincoln Theater Renovation and an array of new business openings have brought a renewed sense of enthusiasm about the potential development of the down-

"Bessemer's best days are still ahead," said Mayor Kenneth Gulley. "New industry and jobs are

"It is just an exciting time to be here in the city. You get a sense of the excitement as you walk around and speak with people both in the city and outside of Bessemer. Announcements such as the investments from Amazon and Carvana have caused people to take a long hard look at Bessemer and what we have to offer," Mayor Gulley said.

What Bessemer has to offer is a mixture of amenities and opportunity unparalleled in the Central Alabama region. The government of the city is business-friendly, something that has not escaped business interest.









"The business climate in Bessemer is strong," Mayor Gulley said.

But city leaders are just as invested in strengthening Bessemer's residents and neighborhoods.

The city opened its new Recreation Center in 2016 to give residents of all ages a safe place to socialize and improve their lives. The Recreation Center currently boasts a membership of more than 10,000. There are youth athletic programs, such as football and basketball, programs for seniors, movies and health programs.

Debardeleben Park, located in the heart of downtown, continues to draw events ranging from the Bob Sykes BBQ and Blues Festival each April to new events such as the Central Alabama Caribbean Festival, which took place in June 2019.

New homes are currently being constructed in Bessemer, such as the houses in the Cedar Creek Subdivision off Fourth Avenue Southwest. The city's demolition program continues to remove blight and old dilapidated structures from throughout the city's older neighborhoods.

The city opened Bessemer's first-ever Storm Shelter at the Emergency Operations Center on Ninth Avenue in October 2019. The project was paid for with a combination of city and federal funds. City leaders said they will attempt to secure additional federal funding to build other shelters throughout the city.

The city is also working with the U.S. Corps of Engineers on efforts to alleviate flooding along Valley Creek in the Pipe Shop neighborhood.

Several major arteries in the city have been resurfaced through a combination of state and local funding. City leaders have also invested in infrastructure improvements in the Downtown corridor, such as recently completed streetscape improvements along Third Avenue North near the Jefferson County Courthouse.


One of the reasons for the city's success is Bessemer's sound financial management. The city budget has grown from \$38 million in 2010 to almost \$60 million in 2019. The financial management has allowed city officials to invest in new vehicles and equipment to better serve Bessemer residents.

"We have managed revenues responsibly and have been good stewards of taxpayer dollars," said Mayor Gulley. "We are a city that is not in the red, but in the black. Our annual audit has come back strong each year."

With business booming, strong financial management and an emphasis on improving the lives of its residents, Bessemer is certainly a city on the move. •
