OVERVIEW

The Reading Program is a cherished United Methodist Women tradition that brings together members in mission as they explore, share and discuss the books.

To participate, select one of the four plans on page 6—and start reading! From captivating novels and heartfelt biographies to urgent messages about issues such as climate change and mass incarceration, there's something for everyone.

Reading Program books are divided into one of five categories (Bonus Books count for two categories each): Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth. Books are available for people of all ages and reading levels. As you read, track your progress using the Reporting Form on page 28. When you submit Report of Completion Requirements, you will be recognized with a Certificate of Recognition [see pg. 30] (more on that under "New for 2020" on next page).

Earning your Certificate of Recognition is just one way to show what you've gained from the Reading Program. The Reading Program is not meant to be completed alone or in a vacuum. As you read, consider taking one or more of the following actions:

Track Your Progress

- Share the program with United Methodist Women members and members of the community.
- **Help people attain books**. Distribute this guide.
- Connect with local and district groups.
 Start a book club, download books onto an e-reader to pass around and share, present book reviews at group meetings.
- Display a progress chart in your church for all who wish to participate, and post displays to encourage book sales.
- Pray. Books often raise concerns about people, countries and issues. Bring these concerns to God during your prayer time at home and at group meetings.
- Advocate for tangible change. Many
 Reading Program books address issues
 such as climate change, mass incarceration, immigration and racism. Organize a
 task force to address these issues in your
 community.

Where to Find Books

You might notice that books in this publication are not listed with stock numbers; nor will you find the usual order form and shipping information. For the first time, this year United Methodist Women members will obtain Reading Program books exclusively through third parties—libraries, local bookstores and online. Think of this resource not as a catalog, as in past years, but as a guide.

By no longer offering books directly, United Methodist Women will make more efficient use of program resources. If you obtain materials locally, this change will also be good for the environment and will help you to become more connected with your community. Although Amazon is always a convenient option, please consider obtaining Reading Program books through:

- School and public libraries
- Local independent bookstores
- Franchises of larger bookstore chains

As always, most Reading Program books can also be found for reading electronically on your Kindle, tablet or other devices. For ebooks free of charge, check your local library, Google eBookstore, Project Gutenberg or Open Library. Searching for titles on Google might yield even more results.

If you do order books through Amazon, please remember to visit smile.amazon.com, Amazon's charitable giving page, and select "**United Methodist Women**" as your charitable organization. For all eligible purchases made on **smile.amazon.com**, Amazon will donate 0.5% to United Methodist Women.


Bonus Books

READING PROGRAM PLANS

Choose and follow one of the four plans. When you have read the required number of books and magazine issues, report your completion to your local member in charge of program resources. Titles read from the 2015 list will be credited through December 31, 2020.

PLAN I: 5 books a year

- One book from each category: Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth.
- Selections can be from the 2015–2020 reading lists if not included in previous reports (including children and youth titles).
- Regular reading of **response** magazine

PLAN II: 10 books a year

- Two books from each category: Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth.
- Selections can be from the 2015–2020 reading lists if not included in previous reports (including children and youth titles).
- Regular reading of response magazine.

PLAN III: 15 books a year

- Two books from each category: Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth.
- Plus five additional books from any category.
- Selections can be from the 2015–2020 reading lists if not included in previous reports (including children and youth titles).
- Regular reading of response magazine.

PLAN IV: 20 books a year

- Two books from each category: Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth.
- Plus ten additional books from any category.
- Selections can be from the 2015–2020 reading lists if not included in previous reports (including children and youth titles).
- Regular reading of **response** magazine.






THE PILGRIM JOURNEY: A HISTORY OF PILGRIMAGE IN THE WESTERN WORLD






TEACHING OUTSIDE THE BOX: FIVE APPROACHES TO OPENING THE BIBLE WITH YOUTH




THE LIFE AND MINISTRY OF MARY WEBSTER




OWEN AND ELEANOR MOVE IN


TILLY AND THE CRAZY EIGHTS






A CAGE WITHOUT BARS




HOLDING UP YOUR CORNER: TALKING ABOUT RACE IN YOUR COMMUNITY




MIDNIGHT TEACHER: LILLY ANN GRANDERSON AND HER SECRET SCHOOL



But this did not stop Lilly Ann Granderson, an enslaved person who started a midnight school and taught hundreds of her peers to do so. Many shared their knowledge and others forged passes to escape to freedom. Based on a true story, *MidnightTeacher* is an inspiring testament to a little-known pioneer in education.

SIX BY TEN: STORIES FROM SOLITARY TAYLOR PENDERGRASS AND MATEO KOKE, EDITORS HAYMARKET BOOKS (2018)

An estimated 80,000 Americans are held in solitary confinement across the country, often in cells no bigger than six by ten feet, with 24 hours per day of little or no meaningful human contact. This book shares first-person narratives of prisoners, family members, and corrections officers and explores the mental, physical and spiritual impacts of America's widespread embrace of this punishment.




STORMING THE WALL: CLIMATE CHANGE, MIGRATION AND HOMELAND SECURITY


THEY WILL INHERIT THE EARTH: PEACE AND NONVIOLENCE IN A TIME OF CLIMATE CHANGE

These personal stories of John Dear's life and work invite us to return to nonviolence as a way of life and a living solidarity with earth and its creatures.





THE WATER WALKER

An Ojibwe grandmother (nokomis) loves nibi (water). Nokomis walks to raise awareness of our need to protect nibi for future generations and for all life on the planet. She and others have walked around all the Great Lakes from the four salt waters, or oceans, to Lake Superior. The walks are full of challenges, and by her example she challenges us to take responsibility for protecting our water and to protect our planet for all generations.




WE KISS THEM WITH RAIN

Life wasn't always this hard for 14-year-old Mvelo. There were good times living with her mother and her mother's boyfriend. Now her mother is dying of AIDS, and what happened to Mvelo is the elephant in the room. In this modern-day Shake-speare-style comedy set in a squatter camp outside Durban, South Africa, appearances are a façade and the things that are revealed provide Mvelo with a golden opportunity to change her fate.

This slim, profound novel illuminates the plight of those living under the Islamic State as well as the spirit of the Yazidi people—similar to how *The Kite Runner* and *The Swallows of Kabuldid* shed light on the Taliban regime. It tells the story of Yazidi women Nazo and Soz as they fight to survive.






WHERE WILL I LIVE?





- A blessing to take with you through the day.




GOD UNBOUND: WISDOM FROM GALATIANS FOR THE ANXIOUS CHURCH
