

## Thank you for all of your efforts!

- Goal \$6.9 million over 16 months
- Goal was reduced to 95% or \$6.555M
- Results not finalized until later in January, but >91% paid or about
   \$6M
- As of the end of November, >\$140K in "Parish in need" fund
- After December is closed, the final "Parish in Need" fund will be allocated to based on need
- Pastorates that are still below goal after any of these allocations will receive notice from the Finance Dept.

## CMA-22 Parish Goals

#### Parish Goal Formula

- More wanted individual parish goal based on each parishes'
   % of Regular Sunday Collections
  - 16 pastorates liked a formula based on Regular Church Collections
     Collections
  - 8 pastorates liked CMA formula
  - 2 pastorate had no opinion, but liked simplicity

### What you liked about Sunday Collections:

- Consistency from parish to parish even without common accounting system
- History past FH goals; other diocese
- Equity i.e., a proxy for ability to give in a region
- Simplicity to explain to parishioners if asked



# CMA-22 "Parish in need" Fund or Rebate

### What to do with gifts to CMA over pastorate goal?

- More wanted rebates, or at least the option for a rebate
  - 13 liked having a Rebate back to the parish or pastorate
  - 8 liked giving pastorate options for Rebate or Parish-in-need Fund or a split
  - 1 just wanted "Parish-in-need" Fund
  - 4 pastorates had no specific comment

## Changes for CMA-22

### Goals based on Regular Sunday Collections

- CMA-2022 parish goals are based on the parish's percentage of total Regular Church Collections, as provided from their Annual Report.
- Goal accountability at pastorate level (accountable for 100% of goal), meaning parishes within the pastorate can help other parishes in the pastorate

# Rebate to pastorate for any amount over pastorate goal up to 25% of CMA Goal

• Chancery review still needed for Pulpit Appeals or Capital Campaigns

### Annual appeal going forward

• Runs from January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup> each year

## What is the "case" for Catholic Ministries Appeal?

#### Diocesan Supported Ministries



Clergy Support: Supports clergy training, retreats, continuing education, advanced degree studies, individual counseling; as well as medical insurance, salaries and pensions for some retired, infirm and diocesan assigned priests.



College Ministries: Residence and ministry centers at non-Catholic universities. We have College Ministry Centers at Ball State University, Purdue University and Wabash College. They help to provide pastoral services and ministries to students in those communities.



Catholic Schools: Responsible for working in collaboration with school leadership, administrators and pastors to provide a systemic view of Catholic education by providing research, resources and support.



Saint Joseph Retreat Center: The diocesan destination for spirituality, hospitality and an encounter with Christ. Provides a sacred place and opportunities to love God and neighbor by continuing Christ's Mission through the guidance of the Holy Spirit.



Charities & Donations: Collections that the Bishop does not require the parishes to have special collections for. This also included an additional Holy Land Donation and a \$25,000 donation to pregnancy centers in our diocese.



**Vocations:** Provides funding to assist in promoting and developing vocations to the priesthood or consecrated life. Also supports the education, formation and living expenses of our seminarians during their six to eight years in seminary.



Hispanic Ministry: Supports parish efforts in welcoming, accompanying and integrating Hispanic communities in our Local Church through leadership and ministerial development programs for adults and youth.



Permanent Diaconate: Supports the formation, life and ministry of our permanent deacons. Staffing for the Permanent Diaconate is provided by deacons as their service to the diocese and without compensation.

#### Ministries to Parishes



Administration: Supports the efficient management of the diocese including the Bishop and Vicar General's office, planning, financial management, investments, budgeting, audits, cemeteries, architecture and building services.



Uniting in Heart: Includes all administration, training, support and direct costs associated with implementing the Uniting in Heart 2030 Pastoral Plan. This plan prepares parishes to more efficiently proclaim the Gospel.



Stewardship: All expenses related to the staff and functions of the Office of Stewardship and Development beyond those associated with Catholic Ministries Appeal and the Lafayette Diocesan Foundation, Inc.



Marriage Tribunal: Offers ministry to persons who apply requesting a determination by the church whether their marriage is a valid and binding union. The office is staffed by specially trained priests and lay persons.



Human Resources: Supports effective employment practices as well as promotes positive employee relations. This also includes employee and clergy wellness, good communications, high morale, teamwork, accountability and efficiency in a work environment.



Technology: Technology investments in hardware, software, network, internet, security and cloud services for the central office, parishes, schools and cemeteries.



Divine Worship: Assists in promoting the liturgical life of the diocese by coordinating all diocesan liturgies, supporting sacramental formation and providing resources for liturgical catechesis and the formation of liturgical ministers.



Communication: Responsible for diocesan publications, branding and marketing, social media and website services.








# 2020 Giving USA Overview

2020 contributions: \$471.44 billion by type of recipient organization\*







## 4. 2022 Catholic Ministries Appeal Goal

#### The 2022 Annual Catholic Ministries Appeal has a total goal of \$5.175 million

- Same total goal as 12-months of last CMA goal ... no increase
- Campaign runs from January 1<sup>st</sup> 2022 through December 31, 2022
- There is no Seminarian Fund Appeal going forward

#### **Pastorate Accountability**

- CMA goal accountability at pastorate level
- Pastorate accountable for 100% of the total goal for all parishes in the pastorate
- Parishes within pastorate can help each other








#### Pledges and payments collected at the parish

#### **Lock box company will:**



- Send electronic files to be downloaded into our system

#### **Parish responsibilities:**

- Send all pledge cards and payments (checks and cash) to Deluxe
- Do not open individual envelopes
- No reconciliation of pledges and/or payments at the parish

#### **Parish responsibilities:**

- Track parish progress
- Communicate with parishioners as needed to meet your goal
  - Reports on both pledges and payments will be provided monthly to the parish via email
  - Real-time, interactive Raisers Edge Dashboards will be made available to the parish



Suggested In-Pew Pledging Process Options

#### Option 1: INCORPORATE PLEDGING INTO THE LITURGY BEGINNING WITH THE HOMILY

Include the following information in your homily.

✓ You personally matter to God.

The Book of Genesis tells us that we are made in the image and likeness of God, who is good, true and beautiful. The Prophet Jeremiah reminds us that God knew us even before He formed us in our mother's womb. In the Gospel of John 14:1-6, Jesus tells us that He has prepared a place for us in his Father's house.

 He shows us His love daily in real ways through all of the graces He gives to us.

All that we have, including the breath in our lungs, are gifts from God. We are appointed stewards of every minute we have on this earth: the talents, skills and abilities God has given to us, and all of the treasures and resources whether given or earned.

✓ What God asks of us in return is that we love Him and that we love one another as He has loved us (Mark 12:30-31).

We can show our love to God through our prayer life, our service to those in need, and warm hospitality. Another way is by financially supporting the good works of the Local Church, which is made up of the parishes, schools and facilities of the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana, as well as our Chancery offices and staff in Lafayette.

✓ Thank your parishioners for the many contributions they have made of prayer, fath, their talents, time, and money to the parish as well as to the Local Church across our diocese.

It is now time for the 2022 Catholic Ministries Appeal. Just to clarify, this is the same appeal that had formerly been known as Fruitful Harvest. The reason for the name change is to focus on the many ministries that are supported through this appeal and to increase the transparency of how the funds raised from this appeal are utilized to support the works of Christ directly through the Chancery offices and staff in Lafayette, as well as through the ministries they provide to support our local parishes. Traditionally, Fruitful Harvest followed a two-year schedule, but the Catholic Ministries Appeal will be an annual appeal, running from January 1st to December 31st of each year.

You should have all received a letter from Bishop Doherty asking for your support. Let us take a few minutes to view the appeal video and learn more about some of the ministries the appeal supports. (SHOW VIDEO.)

I am asking those of you who have not yet made that commitment to do so today and help us reach our goal. You can send in your pledge using the pledge cards you received in the mail, or using the ones in the pew. You can also pledge electronically on the diocesan website.

#### Option A - Giving Online

- If you would like to complete your pledge online, you will find the website URL (www. DOL-IN.org/CMA) and a QR-code on the back of the pledge card.
- · When giving online, you can:
  - O Make a one-time gift.
  - Set up reoccuring monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual gift which will end December 31, 2022.
  - OR set up sustained monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual gift which will continue from year to year until you choose otherwise.

#### Option B - Utilizing the Pledge Card

- Explain how to fill in the card, starting with full name and contact information. Spouse's name when appropriate. (Presider: please fill out the contact section on your own card and when you are done move to the next step.)
- Now, let us look at the commitment part itself. As most of you know, Fruitful Harvest was somewhat flexible in its format. Catholic Ministries Appeal is the same in allowing you to spread your financial commitment through December 2022. The first reminder statement

would be mailed in March 2022, and the last payment in December of 2022. Regardless of how you want to submit your gift, the total amount of your pledge for all of 2022 should be written where it says "Total Pledge Amount."

- Finally, sign the pledge card and date it. Seal the pledge card and any payment into the envelope provided.
- Pastor: Explain when parishioners will turn in the envelope.

#### Choose one option:

- Please bring your sealed envelope forward to the altar and present it to the Lord by placing it in the basket in front of the altar.
- Please be prepared to turn in your completed pledge in the sealed envelope along with the regular collection during Mass today.
- Please place your sealed envelope into the basket(s) (name the locations) as you leave today.

#### Option 2: PLEDGING AT THE END OF MASS

The letter from Bishop Doherty also included a pre-printed pledge card and return envelope, and I hope many of you have already made your pledge and returned your pledge card via mail or online.

I am asking those of you who have not yet made that commitment to do so today and help us reach our goal. You can send in your pledge using the pledge cards you received in the mail, or using the ones in the pew. You can also pledge electronically on the diocesan website.

#### Option A - Giving Online:

- If you would like to complete your pledge online, you will find the website URL (www. DOL-IN.org/CMA) and a QR-code on the back of the pledge card.
- · When giving online, you can:
  - O Make a one-time gift.
  - Set up recurring monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual gift which will end December 31, 2022.
  - OR set up sustained monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual gift which will continue from year to year until you choose otherwise.

#### Option B - Utilizing the Pledge Card

- Explain how to fill in the card, starting with full name and contact information. Spouse's name when appropriate. (Presider: please fill out the contact section on your own card and when you are done move to the next step.)
- Now, let us look at the commitment part itself. As most of you know, Fruitful Harvest was somewhat flexible in its format. Catholic Ministries Appeal is the same in allowing you to spread your financial commitment through December 2022. The first reminder statement would be mailed in March 2022, and the last payment in December of 2022. Regardless of how you want to submit your gift, the total amount of your pledge for all of 2022 should be written where it says "Total Pledge Amount."
- Finally, sign the pledge card and date it. Seal the pledge card and any payment into the envelope provided.
- Pastor: Explain when parishioners will turn in the envelope.

#### Choose one option:

- Please bring your sealed envelope forward to the altar and present it to the Lord by placing it in the basket in front of the altar.
- Ushers will now pick up the sealed envelopes.
- Please place your sealed envelope into the basket(s) (name the locations) as you leave today.
