

From Your Pastor:

One of the most epic scenes in the Bible is the crossing of the Red Sea in the Exodus story. If you were to ask the average person on the street to name a story from the Bible, this would probably be one of the most frequently mentioned. There is something so satisfying about the story of a persecuted people, slaves to an imperial power, who are able to make a miraculous escape to freedom. The Israelites escape through the power of God and meanwhile Pharaoh and his chariots are drowned in the Red Sea. I would invite you to reread this story if it's been a while, you can find it in Exodus 14. This moment of the escape from Egypt becomes an identity-making event for the People of Israel. As you read through the rest of the Old Testament, Israel knows itself as God's chosen people because of this moment when God liberated them from slavery and led them to the Promised Land. Even as Israel is consistently unfaithful to God, they are constantly reminded that God is faithful as they look back and remember the moment of the crossing of the Red Sea.

Every single Christian has experienced their own crossing of the Red Sea. Do you remember when yours was? Mine was August 25th, 1991. This was the day I escaped slavery and was set free by the power of God. I'm referring, of course, to the day of my baptism. Through baptism, Christians "pass through the waters" from slavery to liberation. Every single human person comes into the world a slave of sin. This is not an exaggeration. Rather, it is simply an acknowledgement of the reality of original sin that is our common inheritance as members of the human family, caught up by the fall of our first parents, Adam and Eve. Every person is conceived in this state of original sin and we are completely incapable of fixing this situation. In other words, we cannot "get out" of sin by ourselves, we are enslaved to it.

This is where the good news of Jesus comes in. Jesus is the new Moses who leads his people out of slavery into freedom. This was accomplished in the death and resurrection of Jesus when he defeated sin and death, robbing them of their power. The salvation of Jesus still needs to be given to each individual human person who comes into the world. This is where the sacrament of baptism comes in. In baptism, we are forgiven of our original sin, and we are adopted as sons and daughters of God. So not only are we set free from slavery to sin, but we become an heir to the Kingdom of God. There is no greater moment in our lives, then the moment of our baptism. As we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus this weekend, let's take a moment to give thanks for our liberation. Jesus has led us through the Red Sea into the Promised Land!

Baptismal Bib

Question:

At my grandson's Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. Why is this done? Is it something new?

Answer:

When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.



Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like and fit over the baby's head. Others are simply placed on the baby's chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all: "See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers, and this is symbolized by the white garment.





St. Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop and Doctor of the Church

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 - c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought

with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.

Registration for this summer's D-Camp is now open! If you're a high school or junior high student who's looking for a camp filled




