Proposals must meet the following criteria:

- The project must have a definable goal that can be achieved in less than nine months (October 2019 to May 2020).
- · Proposed project may not include soliciting donations, including sponsorships, prizes, etc.
- The Request for Proposal must be formally approved by the applying organization's Board of Directors or Steering/ Guiding Committee as appropriate.
- The organization must have a single contact who will provide background, materials and support for team members.

If your organization would like to submit a request for a project team, please complete a Request for Project application, available online at FranklinCountyWorks.com/Leadership under the LFC Community section.

Applications must be submitted no later than July 25, 2019. The LFC Community Steering Committee will inform organizations by August 22, 2019 if their proposal will be forwarded to LFC students for consideration. If so, the contact person will be required to make a 10-minute presentation to the Class of 2020 on September 14, 2019 when project groups will make their selection. 


