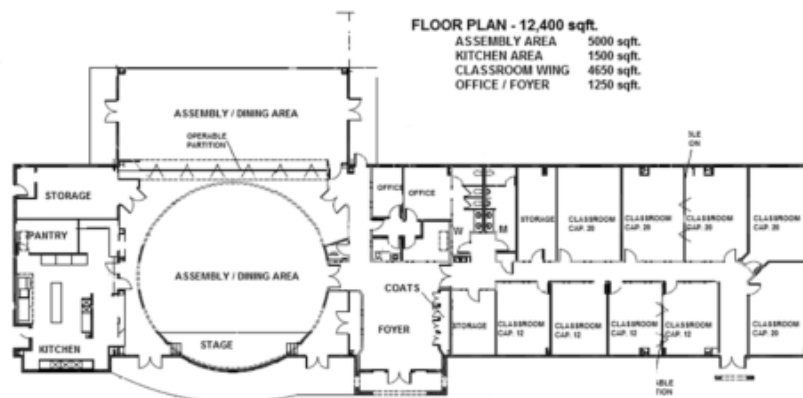

*From the Pastor's Pen:***CURSILLO**

This Sunday, September 28th 2014, Sts. Peter and Paul Cursillo group is hosting a picnic, for the Valley Cursillo, which is comprised of Cursillo members from the parishes of Palmyra, Staunton, Waynesboro, Harrisonburg, Charlottesville, Lexington, Elkton, Quinque, Lovingston, Scottsville, and Columbia. They will be joining us for the Sunday Mass.

Here at Sts. Peter and Paul and St. Joseph parishes, we have about 70 members (who have gone on Cursillo retreat) of whom only 30 are active. They meet in groups of 5-9 once a week to pray, study and share love on their Spiritual Journey.

Cursillos in Christianity (in Spanish: Cursillos de Cristiandad, meaning a short course in Christianity) is an apostolic movement of the Roman Catholic Church. It was founded in Majorca, Spain by a group of laymen on pilgrimage in 1944, where they were refining a technique to train pilgrimage Christian Leaders. A layman named Eduardo Bonnín participated in the early years of the "short courses" in Majorca and helped develop the Cursillo program to the point that it became an active renewal movement in the Catholic Church. In 1957, the movement had spread to North America, when the first American Cursillo was held in Waco, Texas. In 1959, the Cursillo spread throughout Texas and to Phoenix, Arizona. In August of that year the first national convention of spiritual directors was held. In 1960, the growth of the Cursillo quickened in the Southwest, and weekends were held for the first time in the East in New York City and Lorain, Ohio. The first Cursillo weekend in the Richmond Diocese was held in 1964, led by Msgr. Chet Michael. Our Diocese is one of the largest in the US with about 8000 Cursillistas.

Cursillo is the original three day movement that focuses on showing Christian lay people how to become effective Christian leaders over the course of a three-day weekend. The weekend includes fifteen talks, some given by priests and some by a team of lay people. There are 3 Days, 3 Encounters and 3 Friendships with Self, Christ and others. The major emphasis of the weekend, where Eucharist is the central focus, is to ask participants to take what they have learned back into the world where they live and work, on what is called the "Fourth Day". The method stresses ongoing personal spiritual development, accelerated by weekly group reunion to evangelize within their communities.

The Cursillo is supported by the Roman Catholic Church. It is joined to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops through an official liaison in the person of Eusebio Elizondo Almaguer, Auxiliary Bishop of Seattle, and through the Bishop's Secretariat for the Laity in Washington, D.C. The spiritual advisor for the USA national movement is Rev. Alex Waraksa from the Diocese of Knoxville, TN.

I have personally done a 3 day Cursillo retreat, and I would recommend that every parishioner take the time to do it. It is a great spiritual uplifting experience that I will always remember. This year there will be a men's weekend October 16-19, and women's weekend April, 2015. For those who would like to join, I will be happy to find you a sponsor.

St's Peter and Paul is blessed to have the **Lay Directors** of this National movement in the **entire** Richmond Diocese as members here: Ellie and Jeff Henrietta.

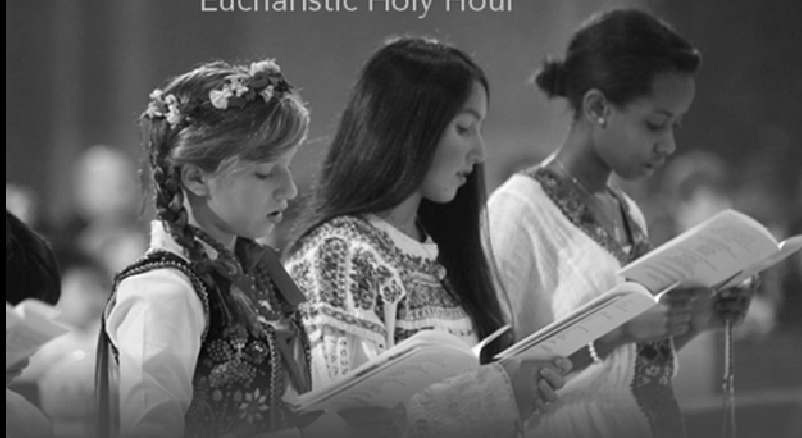

2nd Annual Catholic Women's Conference

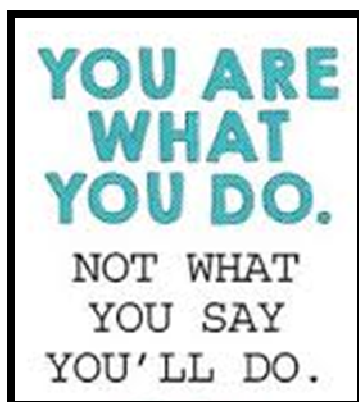

Happy Face Christmas Party

The Fluvanna Christian Service Society (FCSS) is a ministry of local Fluvanna churches including Sts. Peter and Paul. FCSS has sponsored the Happy Face Christmas Party since 1974 — 40 years! It takes place on the first Saturday of December every year. For the benefit of those who are new to the parish, here is a description of the activities:

10 Reasons to Pray a Public Square Rosary

“The Rosary will be a very powerful armor against hell; it will destroy vice, deliver from sin and dispel heresy.” —Our Lady to Saint Dominic

- 1. The Miracle of the Sun was public:** On October 13, 1917, Our Lady performed a miracle witnessed by 70,000 people, including atheists, communists and anti-Catholics. Some of them converted. The 2013 Public Square Rosary Rallies will remind the person on the street that conversion is possible.
- 2. Reach fallen away Catholics:** According to research, only 28% of Catholics attend Mass in America. The Public Square Rosary is a great way to reach the 72% of non-practicing Catholics, a total of 46 million people. If they see you praying in a public place, they may be moved to become better Catholics.
- 3. Public prayer gets results:** Pro-life Catholics have peacefully prayed the Rosary in front of abortion clinics for decades. The power of their prayer has blunted the advance of abortion. Their public prayers save lives. In fact, recent studies show that abortion clinics are closing at a rate of one per month.
- 4. Be a Fatima apostle:** Our Lord sent the apostles forth to teach all nations. Praying the Rosary in public is an excellent way to introduce others to the Catholic Faith and the Fatima message. “Now no man lighting a candle covereth it with a vessel, or putteth it under a bed; but setteth it upon a candlestick, that they who come in may see the light” (St. Luke 8:16).
- 5. Public sins require public reparation:** Our culture openly flaunts sin. You hear it on public airwaves, on primetime TV, on the Internet. Laws favor abortion and same-sex “marriage.” Your Rosary Rally will be a public act of reparation for these sins hurled against the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Your public Rosary will console God. At Fatima, Our Lady said to the children: “You saw hell, where the souls of poor sinners go. To save them, God wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart in the world.”
- 6. Will the media promote Fatima? Never! It’s up to us to promote devotion to Mary “outside the choir.”** To pray the Rosary in the public square is a powerful way to promote its recitation. Catholics must not be ashamed of their Faith. “Every one therefore that shall confess me before men, I will also confess him before my Father Who is in heaven” (St. Matthew 10:32). During public Rosary rallies already held, non-Catholics have stopped and asked for Rosaries, wanting to learn how to pray.
- 7. Public Rosaries in history:** At the end of World War II, Communist Soviet troops occupied Vienna, Austria. They refused to leave. Yet, after massive public Rosary processions led by Fr. Petrus Pavlicek, the Communist invaders packed up and left. Large-scale public Rosaries were likewise credited for foiling a Communist takeover in Brazil in 1964. If the Rosary saved these countries, it can save America.
- 8. Duty to honor God publicly:** Secularists have been attempting to drive religion and morality out of the public square. Children in public schools have been suspended, for example, when they pray grace before meals. That cannot continue! Catholics have the duty to oppose the secularist agenda. We openly honor God and respect His rights. The 2013 Public Square Rosary Crusade will make the point.
- 9. Preparing for Our Lady’s triumph:** The Immaculate Heart of Mary will triumph over evil. It is a great privilege to be among those who trust in her triumph and honor her in the public square. Imagine 7,000 Public Square Rosary Rallies. This historic campaign will hasten God’s victory, attract blessings on America, and surely strengthen every Rosary Captain and every rally participant.
- 10. Public prayer is powerful:** In his monumental work, *The Secret of the Rosary*, Saint Louis Marie de Montfort states: “Public prayer is far more powerful than private prayer to appease the anger of God and call down His mercy, and Holy Mother Church, guided by the Holy Ghost, has always advocated public prayer in times of public tragedy and suffering.”
