(John 20:28)

Divine Mercy Sunday

In the year 2000 St. Pope John Paul II officially established the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. On that same date he canonized a humble polish nun named Faustina Kowalski. St. Faustina received revelations from Jesus that became the basis for the Divine Mercy devotion. After Pope John Paul canonized Sister Faustina, he said, "This is the happiest day of my life!"

The Divine Mercy, of course, is the unconditional love of God seen from the point of view of the sinner. It is the fidelity of the love of God. This is the Good News of the Gospel. Jesus said that he came not for the just but for the sinner. He ate and drank with sinners. He forgave sins and delegated that same power to his apostles. He taught the parables of the lost coin, the Good Shepherd, and the prodigal son, all of which tell us that the Divine Mercy is not "the pardon of a judge, but the embrace of a lover."

God is love. The unconditional love of God, the Divine Mercy is always available. The one unforgivable sin is to think that our sin is too great for the mercy of God. As we saw during Holy Week, this was the sin of Judas: not that he betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver but that he denied the Divine Mercy. He thought that his sin was too great to be forgiven. He could have been forgiven just as Simon Peter was forgiven.

My Lord, My God!

In today's Gospel reading we find a marvellous summary of the whole Christian experience, "My Lord and my God." Thomas was the last among the disciples to believe in the resurrection, but he was the first to proclaim the Divinity of Jesus "My Lord and my God". Jesus always is the first to take the initiative to bring us back to faith experience (Paul, Samaritan woman, Woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus and many others). We should respond in faith. Once he met Jesus, his doubt vanished, and his vision, expanded and he rushed to India on his evangelical mission. We know that the Lord is present in our midst, even though our eyes cannot see him. And with Thomas we say in the Eucharist: "My Lord and my God."

Easter Triduum

We had a good attendance during the sacred triduum of the Holy Week. There were around 2200 who attended our church on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter vigil and on Easter Sunday. I thank Fr. Brian Morgan, Fr. Wally Kevis, Fr. Pierangelo Repuyan, Fr. Anson and Deacon Michael Phillips for their presence and great support during these days. Our Choir deserves a special thanks for their dedication in preparing the hymns and music for the sacred triduum. They sang melodiously and helped us to lift up our hearts to the Risen Lord. Sr. Margaret Scharf's solo of the responsorial psalms with the rhythm of her guitar was absolutely super and melodious during the easter vigil. We had a good team working around the sanctuary and church for the days of sacred triduum. They were our acolytes, readers, communion ministers, welcoming ministers, head counters, money collectors, money counters, flower decorators and few volunteers who were helping to provide extra chairs near the entrance area of the

Church during Sunday 10.00 am mass. Special thanks to our liturgy team headed by Deacon Michael and Geraldine Williams who organised all the liturgical movements during the sacred triduum. May God bless them too.

Finally, I wanted to thank a team of men who were working more than three hours to set up the sepulchre of the Lord and resurrection scene which they arranged so beautifully and dramatically. They are Winston, Bob, John Jolly, Mark, Craig and Fr. Anson. I too thank the PPC and PFC members for their contribution. To all of them a big thanks. God bless our Parish now and forever!

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the

disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are

recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the

Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

Hi everyone!



Prayers & Reflection

Preparing to hear God's word.

Can you think of some things that you believe in, but cannot see?

You cannot 'see' the wind, but you know it is there if you watch the leaves moving in the trees.

You cannot 'see' love, but you know if somebody loves you by their words and actions. Can you think of any other examples?

Reflection on the Gospel

The importance of today's gospel story is shown by the fact that it led to the original conclusion of John's gospel. The story proper falls into two parts: the appearance of the risen Lord to the assembled disciples on the first Easter Day and his appearance before Thomas a week later.

John presents Jesus' resurrection, his giving of the Spirit and the commissioning of the disciples in a single unified sequence. By contrast, the gospel-writer Luke introduces a timespan of forty days before Jesus' ascension, and fifty days before the outpouring of the Spirit. Each is communicating the same profound truth within a different theological framework.

The text for today can be sub-divided into four parts. In part one, Jesus appears to the fear-filled disciples and greets them with peace. This twofold greeting should be given strong emphasis. Part two consists of Jesus' commissioning the disciples and breathing out his Spirit upon them. Part three relates the encounter between the risen Lord and the apostle Thomas, culminating in words that implicate us: "Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe". The reading comes to a climax with the final summary of the gospel's purpose: "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name". Each part should be heard by the congregation as a distinct unit. The reading as a whole is a wonderful invitation to renew our faith in Jesus and to live in the peace and joy of his Spirit.



How to pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a glorious way to enter into the abundant Mercy of God. It only takes a few minutes and can easily be prayed almost anywhere. Using a rosary, follow the guide below to offer this wonderful prayer. It is especially good to pray it at the three o'clock hour.

Using a rosary make the sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Optional Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You! (Repeat three times)

Introductory Prayers

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth, as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Prayed on large bead prior to each decade

"Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

Prayed on 10 small beads prior to each decade

"For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

Prayed after all 5 decades of Chaplet are complete

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world." (Repeat three times)

Optional Concluding Prayer

"Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion—inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself."


