FR. PAUL'S WEEKLY LETTER

Dear Friend of Carmel Mission,

This Sunday we celebrate "Sunday of the Word of God." This celebration is a gift to us from our Holy Father, Pope Francis, who in his Apostolic letter "Aperuit Illis" instituted the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time to be the Sunday of the Word of God. In Pope Francis' own words from this letter, "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of His word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." Jesus demonstrated that the Word of God is spiritual nourishment when He appeared to His assembled disciples after His Resurrection, broke bread with them and "opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures." (Luke 24:45)

One of the practices we developed at Carmel Mission through our video prayer messages during this time of the COVID pandemic is Lectio Divina. This very ancient form of studying and praying the Scriptures came into new prominence with the Second Vatican Council. The practice of Lectio Divina allows us to immerse ourselves in the Word of God, using all our senses to enter into the Scriptures in a visceral way, and opening our hearts and minds to the power of the Holy Spirit. If you are interested in learning more, and perhaps in practicing Lectio Divina with me, I invite you to view the Lectio Divina Prayer Messages on our website or our YouTube Channel.

As I reflect on the Gospel in the light of this focus on God's word I am struck by Jesus' words in Gospel, "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men." This invitation to Simon, Andrew, James and John, is the same that is offered to each of us. Being a follower of Jesus Christ requires us to cast the net of God's great mercy with patience, with perseverance, and with untiring love. Thank you for participating in this crucial work at Carmel Mission. Thank you for making the Word of God alive and active in your life.

Scripture Message

Today we hear in Mark's Gospel another story of how Jesus called His first disciples, different than we heard last week from John. In Mark's telling Jesus sees Simon and Andrew, and subsequently James and John, at work at their usual profession of fishing. He calls them to join him, and fish for people with the net of God's love. Many of the traits that had made them successful fishermen, patience, persistence, diligence, will translate well to the new work ahead of them of turning people towards God. Jesus says, "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel." The Greek word for repentance, metanoia, implies more than sadness for or awareness of sins. It means a turning of one's whole being towards God. This is the repentance that Jesus seeks. In the first reading, Jonah is successful in his action to save the people of Nineveh, an ancient enemy of Israel, turning them towards God. When God sees the people repenting, God's immediate response is mercy. Jonah himself was no stranger to God's mercy. When he first heard God's call he tried to flee, was swallowed by a whale and spat back out. He was an even more credible messenger as he had personally experienced God's mercy and redemption. Jonah shows us that it is never too late to repent, to turn towards God. Whatever has come before, God constantly shows us the way and invites us to follow where He leads.

LET THE MISSION BELLS RING FOR HIM



William (Knox) Mellon, Jr. October 20, 1925 - January 10, 2021

Throughout the State of California our historic Mission parish communities have been deeply saddened to hear of the passing of William (Knox) Mellon, Jr., a once in a generation leader and advocate for historic preservation of the California Missions.

Knox was an Army Veteran serving in the Pacific during WWII with the 32nd Division, he earned Ph.D. in History and taught in his field at Immaculate Heart College. He was a board member for the Carmel Bach Festival, the Sam and Alfreda Maloof Foundation for Arts and Crafts, and he was a Trustees of the California Historical Society.

He served as the first California State Historic Preservation Officer and was appointed to this office twice, first by Governor Jerry Brown and again by Governor Gray Davis who also appointed him as State Director of the Office of Historic Preservation. Knox served most recently as the California Missions Foundation's Executive Director from 2004 – 2012. He relocated the foundation to the Carmel in 2010.

Through the efforts of Knox and his wife Carlotta, and their relentless advocacy for the preservation of the California Missions, four Missions were awarded significant resources from the US Interior Department's Save America's Treasures' Grant. This included our own Carmel Mission and Missions San Miguel also in the Diocese of Monterey.

Carlotta continues to be a devoted parishioner at Carmel Mission, as she was with her beloved Knox for many years. Before Covid-19 Carlotta faithfully served the community as a lector and extraordinary minister of Holy Communion at the 11am Mass on Sundays. We look forward to her return when it is safe to do so.

Our thoughts and prayers are with Carlotta and the entire Mellon family, and we mourn and celebrate with them a remarkable life of service.

The Covid Pandemic Special Edition

The Statue of St. Charles Borroméo

When they picked a patron saint for the Carmel Mission, they could not have made a better choice. The statue of St. Charles Borroméo sits high on top of the Reredos of the main altar.

He was the son of the Count of Arona and Margarita de' Medici and was born in northern Italy in 1538. When he was about 12 years old, his uncle resigned as the Abbot of Sts. Gratinian and Felinus Abbey and Carlo became the new Abbot. Later, he studied civil and canon law at Pavia and obtained his doctoral degree.

A year later another uncle, Cardinal Angelo de' Medici, was raised to the pontificate as Pius IV. Borroméo became, at the age of 22, practically the leading statesman of the papal court as the Secretary of State and was designated a Cardinal. Soon after, he became the Archbishop of Milan.

He was a very skillful papal diplomat and politician. He was instrumental in completing the final deliberations of the Council of Trent which determined Church doctrines in response to the Protestant reformation. He was ordained a priest in 1563 at the age of 25.



After some additional service in Rome, he devoted himself to reforming the Milan diocese which had not had the Archbishop in residence in 80 years. He proved to be a great reformer of the local church and was instrumental in guiding the Milanese people through the great plagues in 1576. He established seminaries, colleges and communities for the education of the clergy. He died in 1584 at age 46.

The Borroméo family is still well known in Milan and St. Charles is buried in the crypt of the Milan Cathedral. He became a Cardinal, then a Bishop and then, finally, a priest. Usually, you ascend the hierarchy of the Church in the opposite order!

This insight into the Mission history was provided by the Carmel Mission Docent Association.
