## Reduced budget aids crucial areas

New budget to help county survive economy longer

BREVARD — Brevard County Manager Howard Tipton submitted a new budget for the 2013 fiscal year earlier this month that is a 22.3 percent reduction from last year's budget.

"The new budget is about \$62 million less than the current budget," Mr. Tipton said. "A lot of that comes from

reduction in capital projects. We are just not building anymore."

Along with a decline in capital projects, the new budget will eliminate 15 vacant positions within the county. From 2006 to 2013, the total number of positions cut stands at 452, now placing staffing at 2001 levels.

Mr. Tipton referred to the new budget as one that will help the county "hold on" a little longer through the current economic situation.

"In many ways, it's a 'let's hold on for one more year budget,'" he

said. "We are keeping tax rates the same, but we have a backlog on road projects that are approaching a half-billion dollars. We have facility needs that are \$10 million dollars that we can't get to."

However, despite the decline in capital projects, Mr. Tipton said the new budget leaves room for advancements in two crucial areas for Brevard County.

"We have an 800 MHz emergency system that is 25 years old. If you think about it, that radio system is built for the popula-

tion at that time. If you think about how we have grown since that time, we don't have coverage in certain areas."

Kimberly Prosser, director of Brevard County Emergency Management, agreed with the Mr. Tipton on the need for new radio equipment.

"Our current system has been in place for 25 years, during which the county's population has not only grown by about 180,000, but it has also expanded beyond its original footprints," Ms. Prosser said.

MELBOURNE — Like many others in Brevard County, Sandra Pelham is on a mission to save her community.

"There were times when you would see guys walk-

ing up and down the street, selling drugs from car to car," she said pointing toward Monroe Street in Melbourne. "Now, you don't see that as much as you used to."

Ms. Pelham said the decline of crime within her community can be attributed to the awareness spread by the Powell Subdivision Neighborhood Watch, a program

## Rising heat leads to more venomous snakes on the Space Coast

Local wildlife trapper captures three venomous snakes in one week

BREVARD — A local wildlife trapper said the rising heat is leading to more venomous snake sightings in Brevard County.

"This week, I have encountered three venomous snakes: two Eastern Diamondbacks and a Cottonmouth," said James Dean, owner of Melbourne-based AAA Wildlife Removal. "With all of the heat, the lakes are drying up, and it is displacing the snakes, just like it would alligators."

According to the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department Venom Response

Bureau, three venomous snakes inhabit Brevard County: Eastern Diamondback rattlesnakes, coral snakes and Cottonmouth/Water Moccasins.

Steven Walker, owner of Brevard's Discount Wildlife Removal, said his company handles primarily Water Moccasins, and the coral snake is something residents should specifically

avoid.

“Mostly, we deal with Water Moccasins. We find them around watery areas,” he said. “There is no anti-venom for coral snakes.”

Mr. Dean said residents, who have snakes in their homes, should remain calm and call for help immediately.

“Anytime I get a call on a snake, I automatically assume it’s a poisonous snake because you never know,” he said. “When I get a call to a home, I go throughout the house until I locate the snake, and, if I can’t, I put glue boards down at the last spot they were seen. Once the snakes are on the glue, the owner will call me back.”

Mr. Dean warned to never get close to a snake to avoid the danger of being bitten.

“Snakes have very poor eyesight. They are basically heat sensitive and (they notice) ground vibrations. That’s how they know where to strike,” he said. “If you do see a snake, go in the opposite direction. If it’s in your house, go ahead and call a trapper.”

While he has dealt with

poisonous snakes in the past, Mr. Walker said he primarily receives calls for non-poisonous snakes from residents.

“When we receive calls, people like to jump to the conclusion that they are venomous. This is usually not the case, but I would rather someone assume they are venomous than they’re not,” he said. “Most of the time, people don’t know what they are (dealing with), but it’s better to worry.”

Mr. Dean said he also handles mostly non-venomous snake situations, and that there are ways of preventing snakes from entering your home.

“A lot of times, some of the snakes that get into houses are non-venomous. Usually, it’s black snakes that get into your house,” he said. “What people can do to deter snakes from coming into their homes is to fix where the garage door seals up at the bottom. A lot of times, that seal goes bad, and the snakes crawl underneath it. At that point, they are able to get into the main entrance of the house by going underneath.”

After catching the snakes, Mr. Dean said what he does with them depends on whether or not the snakes

are native to the area.

“Once I capture the snakes, I take them out and release them back into the wild,” he said. “If they are not native, I have to destroy them by law.”

created by National Night Out, an annual crime-and-drug prevention event, scheduled for Tuesday, Aug. 7.

“It’s a nationwide event that’s held every year on the first Tuesday in August,” said Ms. Pelham, who is co-chairing the event, alongside James Bartell. “We are bringing all the neighbors together to pray about this community because there is a lot of violence here.”

Throughout Brevard County on Aug. 7, residents from Rockledge to Melbourne Beach will be celebrating National Night Out event with their own community-focused events.

“It’s a great time to get the neighbors together and bring awareness to crime prevention,” said Ilene Manzo, a Neighborhood Watch Officer with the Rockledge Police Department. “We are going to have a lot of free stuff for the kids, and a lot of great stuff for adults, too.”

Guest speaker for the Melbourne Beach event, Assistant State Attorney Phil Archer, said neighborhoods with an effective neighborhood watch program reduced crime.

“What we found in neighborhoods that have an aggressive approach to calling cops with suspicious reports usually stay crime free,” Mr. Archer said. “I always tell people when they see something to call it in. The cops don’t mind checking it out, but it’s hard sometimes to get people to do that.”

Neighborhoods through-

out the town of Melbourne Beach plan to participate in the 29th annual National Night Out event.

From 5-9 p.m. on Aug. 7, residents throughout the town will be encouraged to lock their doors and turn on their outside lights, said Detective Cpl. Melanie Griswold of the Melbourne Beach Police Department, which is co-sponsoring the event.

Also that evening, at Melbourne Beach’s Ryckman Park, will be games for children, prizes, food, music and a bounce house, as well as an opportunity to meet the town’s police officers, firefighters and members of the Melbourne Beach Rotary Club.

Rockledge Community Service Coordinator Michael Cadore said it is important to raise awareness to the community about ways they can help local law enforcement.

“We are letting our citizens know they should call the hotline no matter how small the problem is,” he said. “We have done a tremendous job of (spreading our cause) through social media and the Internet. We have an integrated email system that reaches 2,000 people to help get the word out. If you don’t have an email (address), we are meeting within your community. Everyone is on the same page, and everyone is working together. That is a huge blessing.”

Despite the large amount of community involvement, Ms. Pelham said she has encountered a few challenges over the years.

“I would like for the churches to get more involved. I feel if the church would get involved, more people will get involved,” she said. “Tuesday night is prayer night for the community. Prayer is very important. Prayer changes things, but I’m only asking for one night. If we don’t all come together, it’s not going to be successful.”

Mr. Bartell agreed that there are certain challenges the neighborhood watch group for Melbourne’s Powell Subdivision faces, but he is optimistic about the future.

“The greatest challenge we have is getting people to participate (in the National Night Out event). A lot of people in this neighborhood talk, but they don’t communicate,” he said. “This community has improved a lot. When we first started, we had very little participation with people in this area, but now we have had a great turnout.”

Ms. Manzo said she is impressed with the turnout her community has shown over the years, and she stressed the importance of community cooperation with its local police forces.

“Last year, we had 1,500 people who participated in the event. It’s a great way to spread awareness through the community,” she said. “We spend a lot of time at neighborhood watch meetings, and we always tell people to call us. They may think it may not be something to bother the police with, but we think no call is too small.”

## Today's jail: as different as night and day

In 2004, the Brevard County Jail was constantly in the news for being overcrowded and having an alarming number of jail suicides.

The jail exceeded its maximum capacity of 1,041 by hundreds of inmates. Making matters worse, jail infrastructure such as the kitchen, laundry and booking areas were originally designed to handle the facilities original capacity of 384 inmates and were struggling to keep up.

Concern for jail overcrowding by Brevard County Commissioners grew in proportion to the inmate population, and they attempted four jail expansion voting referendums to build the needed jail space, all of which failed.

The County Commission was once again preparing to make its case to the residents for a referendum. They commissioned a highly respected consulting firm to evaluate the jail situation and make suggestions. The consultant's report yielded a major two-phase expansion plan expecting to cost an estimated \$143 million.

While the expansion recommendations were comprehensive and well thought out, they were also very costly. Even the first

phase of the plan, at an estimated \$43 million, far-exceeded the county's available funds and would have required a voter's referendum. With four failed jail referendums in Brevard's recent history, it was not a stretch to believe a fifth referendum would meet the same fate. A fifth failure would have resulted in additional delays that would have further pushed any real corrective actions another two-to-three years down the road. The time for talking was over. We needed real improvements, and we needed them fast.

So after being sworn in as Sheriff in January 2005, our team made a recommendation to the Board to consider an alternative plan including the use of tents and inmate labor to reduce jail expansion costs to a fraction of the price. It worked. The Board approved our plan, directed work begin immediately and avoided the need for a fifth referendum.

Looking back on the past eight years, there have been outstanding improvements

to all aspects of the county jail operation, including:

- New hurricane-resistant tent facilities for 400 inmates
- A new 346-bed facility for inmates with special mental health and medical need
- A new infirmary
- A new 297-bed female jail – created by using inmates to renovate an old building
- A new kitchen
- Expanded booking, inmate receiving and releasing areas
- A new laundry facility
- New innovative inmate work programs

The completion of the recent booking room expansion marked the final phase of the jail expansion recommendations. As a result, today's jail, as compared to what the jail looked like in 2004, is as different as night and day.

I am personally very thankful to the County Commissioners and county staff who made the jail improvements a priority and continuously supported our requests. I could not be more proud of the corrections deputies and employees who, under the outstanding leadership of Jail Commander Susan Jeter, worked so hard to maintain the safety and security of the jail during

years of construction and operational challenges. I would also like to recognize the corrections staff, who was here in the days preceding the improvements, for maintaining order in a very overcrowded and challenging jail facility.

For most of us, the jail is out of sight and out of mind. Every year, there are an estimated 10,000 people who go to the Brevard County Jail and after their release they stay out of trouble. I believe a great deal of their success belongs to the corrections staff, who works tirelessly to set a strong example and get those who have broken the law back on the right track. There are more than 400 brave and dedicated corrections professionals, who leave the safety of their homes to be locked for hours on end behind the solid steel doors of the Brevard County Jail. They do this to protect our citizens from harm and to turn the inmates' lives around. They risk their lives, so they can make a real difference in our community... and they do.

I have been very honored and blessed to work with each and every one of them.

Even with Obamacare, millions, who remain uninsured, will still depend on overcrowded emergency rooms for routine care and they will be mandated to pay the tax, whether they use service or not. Have you read how the government is intimidating businesses, which follow Christian principals??? How can we allow this to happen?

Republican solution: give tax relief or direct assistance and provide portability for those who buy their own health care coverage, allowing individual Americans to take their insurance coverage from job to job or from state to state. (Now, we cannot even cross our state line to purchase insurance elsewhere!)

- Obamacare impacts families by providing millions per year for school-based health centers, with no requirement to reduce abortions.
- These federally funded projects deny parents any knowledge about services their children receive.
- Republican solution: rather than bureaucrats and lobbyists prescribing health care benefits and services, respect the role of families on moral decisions involving their health care.

# Native Garden Grows Learning

For Hometown News



Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy's high school students will be getting their hands dirty this fall. With the help of a "Seeds for Schools" grant from the Florida Wildflower Foundation, the field biology and ecology classes will be planting a native garden under the guidance of science teacher Wes Lovelace.

The 2,000-square-foot garden will be located behind the school's Pineda campus library, surrounding the butterfly garden. Lovelace anticipates that the garden will take about six class periods to prepare and plant, and another class period per month to perform regular maintenance such as weeding and removing dead plants.

In addition to beautifying the school, the garden will offer hands-on curriculum to students. They will learn to recognize native flowers (such as the Coreopsis, Florida's state wildflower) and different types of scientific classifications. Lab

work associated with the garden will include photosynthesis, pollination, weather, and respiration/transpiration.

According to Lisa Roberts, executive director of the Florida Wildflower Foundation, "These gardens are exposing kids all over the state to nature, native Florida by letting them experience its flora and fauna first-hand."

"First-hand" describes Lovelace's approach to teaching. In addition to the garden, students will be tagging, measuring and examining tree frogs captured in 100 traps on the campus' wetlands for the fifth year. The purpose of the tree frog study is to better understand how water quality affects the species in an ecosystem. For the purpose of studying air quality, Lovelace has a lichen study planned for the coming school year.

towers are needed on beaches in the areas of Cape Canaveral and Indian Har-

bour Beach," Ms. Prosser said. "Both the Mims and Barefoot Bay towers are currently receiver-only, and they need transmitter/receivers. It is critical that emergency responders be able to communicate with each other, no matter where they are in the county, whether inside a building or out in a remote area."

Ms. Prosser said the new radio systems will be a step

towards Project 25, the new standard for interoperability, allowing radios and components from various counties to work on the same system.

"When this enhancement occurs, agencies from outside the county will be able to assist with mutual aid in emergencies, since their radios will be able to talk to ours, and vice versa," she said.

The new budget will also

aid mosquito control with the purchase of a new helicopter.

"Brevard County was at one time known as "mosquito county," and we would quickly go back to that if we stopped spraying. We have a fleet of three helicopters. Our helicopters are 44, 23 and 12 years old," Mr. Tipton said. "The 44 and 23 years old ones are showing great signs of wear and tear. The 44

years-old one is actually grounded right now with metal fatigue."

Mr. Tipton said the purchase of a new helicopter is actually cheaper than making the necessary repairs, and the helicopters serve multiple purposes with aiding the county.

"We also use (the helicopters) for firefighting. When we have wildfires, they are used," he said. "There are actually dual

purposes they are useful for."

Mr. Tipton said that by keeping taxes the same, it allows the county to remain one of the cheapest places to live within the state.

"We are within the top ten in the state," he said. "We are providing a reasonable quality of life at a very minimal cost. But, it's not sustainable, and that is a challenge we have."

"The girls had an idea,

and they ran with it," said Jennifer Ottomaneli, Beatrice's mother and fundraising head for the program.

After months of research and preparation, the girls, who are all juniors, marketed the concept as a "community program" and approached the Future Problem Solving Association at Melbourne High School for support.

"Words cannot express the love and dedication these girls have for this program," said Pamela Bress, team coach for the Future Problem Solving Association. "The volunteer bud-

dies, who participate, deserve equal recognition. This truly is a unique group of selfless teenagers, who just want to make an impact on the athletes they serve and teach them that they are special and can play soccer like everybody else."

Operated through the Melbourne Beach Soccer Club, the program's activities and all activities are held at Flutie Fields, 2101 Oak St., Melbourne Beach.

It didn't take long for the program to expand, gaining more than 27 registered athletes and 50 young volunteers from throughout the area, who serve as "buddies" for the athletes.

The girls' recent success also caught the eye of Dale Burke, the executive director of the Florida Youth Soccer Association.

## Olympics-themed concerts close season

MELBOURNE — Aaron Collins, conductor and musical director of the Space Coast Symphony, always has something up his sleeve.

The orchestra will end its summer season with a concert called "Call of the Champions" on Aug. 11-12. It is a concert taken right from the headlines, saluting music written for and about the Olympics. In addition to music, the program will also feature archival film and news footage.

Mr. Collins thought the timing was right for this concert.

"There's so much wonderful music written for the Olympics," he said. "I thought it was an opportune time, at the end of the Olympics."

The program includes several pieces by composer John Williams: "Summon the Heroes," "The Olympic Spirit," "Call of the Champions," "Olympic Fanfare and Theme" and "A Prayer for Peace," from the film, "Munich." Other works are Vangelis' "Chariots of Fire," Albert Hammonds' "One Moment in Time," made famous by Whitney Houston; Samuel Barber's "Adagio for Strings;" Leo Arnaud's "Bugler's Dream;" and pieces by Dmitri Shostakovich and Josef Suk.

"John Williams seems to be the go-to composer for

the Olympics," Mr. Collins said. "All of the music in the concert is directly associated with the Olympics or used by the Olympic Committee to promote the games. It's a very in-your-face program, with a lot of fanfares and a few works that are moving and touching, like, the 'Prayer for Peace,' about the Munich Olympics."

The concert will be accompanied by film, most of it Olympic footage.

"The way we're programming it is to show some of the great stories," Mr. Collins said. "There will be five to seven stories, like 'The Miracle on Ice' in

1980 or Carl Lewis and Jesse Owens, that take place over the course of the concert."

"Each will have a soundtrack," he added. "We will also be using news footage. Each piece will be preceded by a sound bite. For Munich, Walter Cronkite's commentary and news footage will be interwoven with the actual piece."

Mr. Collins said that while some of the music is somber, the mood is upbeat.

"There will be surprises, fun and a comic element," he said. "The opening will be like the openings for an

Oscar show, with film and live action. The music is rousing and exciting. I know the audience will love the music and the concert."

# Brevard students head back to school

## Overview of the changes to expect for the 2012-13 school year

BREVARD — Summer break is nearing an end, which means students everywhere are gearing up to head back to the classroom.

Here is a list of some of this year's changes, as

reported by Brevard Public Schools, to keep you in the know for the upcoming school year.

- **Registration changes**  
For the 2012-13 school year, Brevard Public Schools parents and students must provide two proofs of residence at each school's registration to verify the home address is actually where the student is residing.
- **Acceptable proofs of residency** include current Homestead exemption cards, purchase contracts

that display closing dates within 90 days of the start-of-school-date, warranty deeds, lease and rental agreements, recent utility statements with a date not exceeding 45 days prior to the date of school registration and driver's licenses.

Families that are sharing housing must complete a Shared Tenancy Affidavit in order for the student to register.

Students who are temporarily residing with another family must fill out or update their In Loco

Parentis form to reflect a maximum of 30 days.

- **Riverview Elementary School becomes Riverview School in Titusville**  
Riverview Elementary School in Titusville is now Riverview School, exclusively a pre-kindergarten center run by the federally funded early childhood program, Head Start.

The school will offer two classes for 3-year-olds and two classes for 4-year-olds. Overall, more than 70 students will be enrolled at the school, said Teresa Wright, director of early childhood and Title I programs for Brevard Public Schools.

Riverview Elementary School closed because enrollment was declining, allowing for an opportunity to help another market, she said.

"The (Brevard County) School Board saw Riverview as an opportunity to benefit the children in that neighborhood," she said. "We knew there was a need in that community, and so we're using that space to fulfill that need."

- **Healthy food enforcement**  
Brevard Public Schools' division of Food and Nutrition Services has designed a variety of changes to implement healthier diets for local students.

Lunches are comprised of five components, including fruit, vegetable, grain, meat or a meat alternative, and low-fat or fat-free milk, and this year, students are required to take three of

HELP YOUR CHILDREN UNDERSTAND WHO AND WHEN TO CALL

The best time to prepare for an emergency is before it happens. During an emergency, it's easy to become dis-oriented or upset, so you need to have all the important phone numbers readily available ahead of time. Write each phone number clearly so that it will be easy to read. Use a pen with dark-colored ink; this is seen the best when you are in a hurry or the lights are dim. Make sure that babysitters and relative familiarize themselves with the list. Once you have filled in the appropriate numbers it is time to practice with your children.

**TEACHING YOUR CHILD HOW TO CALL FOR HELP**  
Have your child practice dialing and speaking into a telephone. Your child should know:

1 - How to dial 911

2 - His or her full name & full address

3 - How to give a short description of the emergency.

Prompt him or her with questions that an emergency operator would ask, such as **"What is your name?"**, **"Where are you calling from?"**, and **"What is the emergency?"**

Stress that the description should be short ("Mommy fell down") and that he or she should be calm and stay on the phone.

**Practice until your child feels comfortable.**

No one wants to think about an emergency happening at home, but it's better to face that possibility than to be caught unprepared. So keep emergency numbers close by. It's a small step that could have big consequences.
