

Please Keep In Your Prayers

In today's first reading we meet Elijah, who is the first prophet named in the Old Testament. Elijah "worked" in the northern kingdom trying to get that population to return to the teachings of Moses and be faithful to God. This was during the reign of the evil king Ahab. He is hungry and lives on charity, so he asked the widow he met for water and bread. She was starving as indicated by her prediction of death. But because Elijah was a holy man, she honored his request and shared her food, and in return was able to eat for year while waiting for the next harvest to come.

In the Letter to the Hebrews, we learn that Jesus is the eternal "high priest" before God, THE ransom for all mankind. Being eternal, his offering to God is eternal, not like man's. So when he returns he will not need to offer another sacrifice but rather bring salvation to the faithful.

In the Gospel, Jesus points out (probably in ear shot of the Scribes) that the Scribes, official interpreters of the Law, exaggerated their position and power, particularly over the poor and widows. This is just the opposite of Elijah in the First Reading. He says they will receive a "severe condemnation" for doing so. Pride can be a dangerous thing.

So what do today's reading boil down to? Humility and service, especially to the poor. As the Lord appears before the Father on our behalf, we can appear to the poor on behalf of the Lord.

Our parish and school are very generous in supporting both Regina Coeli Charities and Feed Your Neighbor. And at Thanksgiving Day Mass there is always and abundance of grocery bags brought forth to feed the less fortunate. And Angel Tree kicks off next weekend, another avenue to support those in our community in need. With the holidays fast approaching there are many asks of all sorts from all places. One person cannot help every need.

This week I invite you to prayerfully consider how you are of service to the poor. Is it out of humility or pride? We do not need to look too far into our backyard to see the need, sometimes in our own families. May your service, whatever form it takes, abound in feeding you spiritually year round.

→ Did You Know? →

Did Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. St. John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes were consecrated until the popes returned from Avignon in the 14th century to find the church and the adjoining palace in ruins.

Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. One of Rome's most imposing churches, the Lateran's towering facade is crowned with 15 colossal statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist and 12 doctors of the Church. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds St. Peter himself celebrated Mass.


