A GED SEMESTER OF SUCCESS

In recent years, Oasis has built a highly successful GED program for women from many educational backgrounds. In the past two-and-a-half years, we have seen more than 30 students achieve their GED; in the last semester alone, nine women passed the exam.

We offer three levels of classes on the road to the GED: 1) an adult basic education class for those women whose education was minimal or who dropped out of school at an early age; 2) a pre-GED class for those who have some reading and writing skills; and 3) a GED class which prepares the most academically advanced women to take the test.

Instruction is both one-on-one and in groups, utilizing computers and providing multimedia education. The students, teachers and volunteers meet for three hours daily, focusing on the five subject areas which appear on the test - Reading, Writing, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematics. Additionally, students who are moms can register their preschool children in one of our two on-site day care centers, knowing that while they study, their youngsters are in a caring, educational environment.

Thanks to a generous grant from the Agnes Varis Trust, the GED program has purchased 16 laptop computers and hired full-time English and Mathematics teachers as well as a computer specialist. This assistance is especially important this year, as the 2014 GED is a computerized exam. Our 12 volunteer teachers support the professional staff, bringing their own extensive life experiences to the classroom.

One of the goals of education is employment, and a high school diploma is an enormous benefit when job hunting or interning. We have received great news on this front from many of our graduates, as ten have found permanent employment and two are currently serving as interns at Oasis. We also love hearing from former students as they continue to pursue educational opportunities. Three former students are attending college while one has already completed beauty school. We look forward to continued success in 2014!










THANKSGIVING AT OASIS
