Hello Kenny Families,

Spring is always exciting at Kenny School. We have celebrations, promotion ceremonies, and new student registration. We will try to maintain these activities and follow all Covid19 prevention protocols to keep our community safe. We should be able to share dates for these events next week.

This year is even more interesting as the district implements it Comprehensive District Design (CDD). New student registration is usually focused on Kindergarten but this year, we have 175 new children assigned to our school which includes 75 Kindergarteners. The staff and I have decided to use a format similar to how we did the fall open house. We will set up tables by grade and specialty areas around the outside of the building. Families will then be able to meet next year's grade level teachers and have a treat.

We are tentatively planning to have our promotion ceremony on the field with the majority of families sitting on the hill. We are still planning to have speeches as part of the program. If we are outside, the traditional slideshow will be sent to families.

We also want to celebrate the successes we have had the last two years and say goodbye to all of our outgoing children. You all know how challenging the last two years have been. You have truly been our educational partner during this time. The DL teaching was amazing, I am so proud of the staff! The children have learned far more than anything that can be assessed on a standardized test during this time, but our preliminary testing results are looking pretty good!

We are still having field day activities. Ms. Johnson and Mr. Polland will be having the children do those activities during their normal PE times. We will do certificates rather than ribbons but will still celebrate with treats. The teachers will let you know when the times your children will be participating.

We really enjoy working with your children. I need to point out the amazing work that our school secretary, Linda Halverson has done during this time. In addition to supporting two programs, DL and IP, she has had to pick up many responsibilities that go far beyond her job description. She has become sort of an IT specialist along the way, she distributes, and documents device check out, she helps people trouble shoot from home, and can program iPad and Chromebooks with all the software children need to use. I do not think she has had a lunch or break away from her desk since we went back to In-Person learning. She is amazing!

The Kenny families are amazing too. As always, thank you for making Kenny the amazing community school it is.


