





La Salette Reflections Fr. Rene Butler, M.S., and Wayne Vanasse



The Last Full Measure

(32nd Ordinary Sunday: 1 Kings 17:10-16; Hebrews 9:24-28; Mark 12:38-44)

"Here, my child, eat some bread while we still have it this year; because I don't know who will eat any next year if the wheat keeps up like that." When the Beautiful Lady reminded Maximin of these words spoken by his father, the boy admitted candidly, "Oh, yes, now I remember. Just then, I didn't remember it."

Mary appeared to a people who were down to their last measure of wheat, potatoes, grapes and nuts, staring famine in the face. But their faith was weak, and they didn't know where to turn.

Such was the situation of the widow in the first reading. But her trust in the prophet's promise inspired her to let him have her last measure of food. In the Gospel, too, another widow, of whose history we know nothing, gave her last measure of personal means to the temple. Jesus drew his disciples' attention to her, showing the value of true generosity animated by faith.

In the second reading the author writes of Christ: "Now once for all he has appeared at the end of the ages to take away sin by his sacrifice." This is Jesus as Mary shows him to us at La Salette: her Son, giving the last full measure of his love, the price of our redemption.


The crucifix calls us to do the same, to give not from our excess, but generously, of our resources, or time or talents. The more we recognize what we have received, the more we should be willing to share. In Luke 6:38, Jesus says, "The measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

It may be that we have none of those things to give. But we share in the priesthood of Christ, and in the Eucharist we offer what he offered.

There is always something we can do. Look at today's Psalm. Among God's merciful actions we find, "The Lord keeps faith forever... the Lord loves the just." We can foster attitudes of trust, praying for those who serve others. We can forgive, and accept forgiveness.

The full measure may not be required of us. However, Mary pleads with us to submit to her Son, and to trust in her promise of abundant harvest and abundant mercy. What is that worth to us?

November 7, 2021 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

On December 10, 1979, a very petite holy woman known as Mother Teresa of Calcutta spoke these words in her Nobel Peace Prize Acceptance Speech, "But I am sure in the families and many of our homes, maybe we are not hungry for a piece of bread, but maybe there is somebody there in the family who is unwanted, unloved, uncared, forgotten, there isn't love. Love begins at home. And love to be true has to hurt. I never forget a little child who taught me a very beautiful lesson. They heard in Calcutta, the children, that Mother Teresa had no sugar for her children, and this little one. Hindu boy four years old, he went home and he told his parents: I will not eat sugar for three days, I will give my sugar to Mother Teresa. How much a little child can give. After three days they brought into our house, and there was this little one who could scarcely pronounce my name, he loved with great love, he loved until it hurt. And this is what I bring before you, to love one another until it hurts, but don't forget that there are many children, many children, many men and women who haven't got what you have. And remember to love them until it hurts."

Living authentically and walking with holiness always involves sacrifice. It has to hurt. Only actions springing from true and deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even what is apparently a generous gesture can be nothing. It is no wonder that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus and the young child in our story above the interest of Mother Teresa. It is easy to make the houses of our lives look like they are in perfect order when in fact they are in shambles within. Religion can sometimes make this hypocritical masquerade easy to accomplish. We can find ourselves in all the right holy places, reciting all of the correct prayers, participating in community collections, and reciting the proper doctrines only to find ourselves empty, shallow, self-focused, and overly anxious about personal concerns.

The one who learns to discover their inner poverty, their spiritual poverty, is the only one who can truly place him or herself at the mercy of God. It is only when we allow ourselves to be empty that we realize Who we actually need to fill us. This is the real meaning of trust. Many of us are afraid to take the plunge. We allow ourselves to detach from only so much, always keeping a watchful eye on the protection of our securities. We understand the value of poverty, but we do not want to become too poor. As long as we are able to recognize this tension, our reluctance to let go and our struggle, we can continue our journey of humbly learning how to love so deeply that it hurts. God understands and waits.



Group meeting starting, Monday, November 8th - Morning Sessions from 9:30 – 11:00 am and Evening




Sessions from 7:00 – 8:30 pm in Room 114-115 and will meet for 4 Consecutive Weeks until December 6th.



Guidelines for 2022 **Scheduled Mass Intentions**

The 2022 book is now open. This calendar year, our Mass Intention book was full In July for the remainder of the year. To try and prevent this from happening during 2022, we have made several changes to the request for scheduled Mass Intention process and ask for your help in following these new procedures.

Each family has a limit of 12 Scheduled Mass Intentions per year. Any scheduled Mass Intentions that you request throughout the year, will be counted towards these 12. If you request 12 scheduled Mass Intentions on October 4th for 2022, you have met your limit for 2022. We will not be able to schedule anymore Mass Intentions for you during 2022. In addition, each family will only be able to schedule up to three Mass Intentions for any given Saturday/Sunday Mass for the year. For example, you may only schedule three Mass Intentions for the Sunday, 4:30 Mass for 2022. The remainder of your scheduled Mass Intentions should be for another Mass, either on a Saturday/Sunday or a weekday.

When filling out your scheduled Mass Intention form, please include the preferred date and an alternate date for each request. Please make a copy of your requested 2022 scheduled Mass Intentions, as you will only be contacted if one of your date(s) is not available. Calls or emails will not be made confirming your selection of Scheduled Masses, if there is no conflict.

You may submit your scheduled Mass Intention form electronically, the preferred method, in-person or through the mail. The Electronic Mass Intention Form may be found on the website at https://maryqueencatholicchurch.org/massintentions (home page, under Home on dropdown menu) and the form and stipend will be submitted electronically. You may also drop off your scheduled Mass Intention form with payment at the Reception Desk in the Parish Hall. Forms may be found on our website at the above address or you may request one from the Parish receptionist during business hours. Checks should be made out to Mary Queen Catholic Church. Cash is also accepted. The suggested Mass Intention stipend is \$5 per Mass for either a scheduled or unscheduled Mass Intention.

If you have used up all 12 of your Scheduled Mass Intentions during 2022, we have several options for a Mass Intention. You may request an unscheduled Mass Intention. which is not published in the bulletin or said aloud during Mass. This must be done in person, at the office, during business hours. Only cash is accepted for an unscheduled Mass Intention. Another option is to request a Mass through the La Salette Missionary Association. These Masses are offered by the Missionaries of La Salette around the world. Information and cards are available at the receptionist desk during business hours.

Vocation or Calling

Question: Can you explain what we mean by a vocation or calling? I have heard this term used in many different contexts and am not sure what it means. Does it apply to religious life?

Answer: A vocation or calling refers to a spiritual experience whereby a person senses within oneself the closeness of God and what he is asking in one's life. It is a realization of what one's part in God's plan could be. Vocation comes in all kinds of ways. Some are as dramatic as St. Paul's, being knocked off his horse, blinded, and hearing God's voice. Others are less dramatic, often occurring over time through little events and personal interests. Others happen in a hurry, accompanied by great spiritual insight or conversion. We often think that this applies to religious vocation, but in fact, every Christian has a vocation, a calling to serve others in and through the church. Whether married or single, religious or lay, we are all called to live out our baptismal commitment to preach and teach the Gospel message. Each of us has our role to play in God's plan, and we become coworkers with God in the work of redemption. With a little confidence, a willing spirit and God's grace, we can and will respond to his unique call.




