

REFLECTION & SCRIPTURE READINGS



As we continue in this Easter season, we want to invite you to reflect on the Sacraments you have been privileged to receive throughout your life. If you don't frequent the reflection of the Sacraments, specifically how you are asked to live out those graces, I urge you to begin breaking this open with Jesus and each other. Let's begin with Baptism.

Do you know when you were baptized? Try to find this date out, who was the celebrant? Are there any stories that folks who were there recall? The Sacraments use tangible signs to lead us to encounter the invisible they represent. Water, candle, oil, simple words—all point to the God of Love, our Creator! Receive from a fellow parishioner the impact this Sacrament has had on him.

ON LOAN FROM GOD

Some Reflections Centered Upon The Sacrament of Baptism

Contained within the vows exchanged during a sacramental marriage is the promise to raise any children in the 'practice of the faith.' While it is true that children, irrespective of their age, are to be cared for by their parents, I find myself frequently contemplating the wisdom shared by a mother of teenagers some decades ago when she reminded me that our children are, in reality, 'on loan to us from God.' The faithful receive their children as gifts from God, and parents, with the entire faith community, are to be faithful servants by dedicating love, time and resources to their upbringing, particularly regarding matters of the faith. The proper destiny of our children and ourselves, as well, since we are also 'on loan,' is to live in the embrace of the Blessed Trinity for all eternity. The first sacramental step which is absolutely necessary toward that end is Baptism. The Book of Genesis recounts Adam and Eve's misuse of their free wills, which resulted in a fall from grace, scarring the depth of the intimate covenant which God shared with them. God did not prevent their (or my own) frequent misuse of free will since an honest, loving covenant relationship cannot exist by any mandate of compliance. The fall from grace by Adam and Eve impaired for themselves, and as a consequence for all of us as their prodigy, the purity of their covenant relationship with God. Even so, our Heavenly Father already at that time was setting into motion his design by which all are offered the opportunity to begin anew a covenant relationship with Him as His adopted sons and daughters. That opportunity is the Sacrament of Baptism, which is sometimes referred to as the first of the three sacraments of initiation, the latter two being the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Confirmation.

One receives a special eternal 'mark' upon one's soul through this Sacrament, which is received only once. The wearing of a white garment during the Sacrament serves as an outward sign of the dignity received as one newly adopted by the Father. As a sinner, subsequent to my own Baptism, I have defiled the dignity of the 'white garment' of my adoption through my misuse of my free will. God continually refuses to abandon me for my offenses against his Goodness by offering me His

mercy through His Sacrament of Reconciliation. In gratitude for His mercy, I renew my resolution to handle the 'loans' in my care in a manner more pleasing to Him.

Considering a quote by Eleanor Powell in which she said, 'What we are is God's gift to us. What we become is our gift to God,' may we all give glory to our Heavenly Father as we strive to be more faithful stewards through the prayerful manner by which we love those He has entrusted as 'loans' to our care. May we trust that all things will work toward His glory if we seek to 'Meet Christ, Know Christ, Love Christ, and Serve Christ' and love our 'loans' as ourselves.

Grieving with Great HOPE


FIVE-WEEK GRIEF SUPPORT WORKSHOP AT ST. CHARLES
