

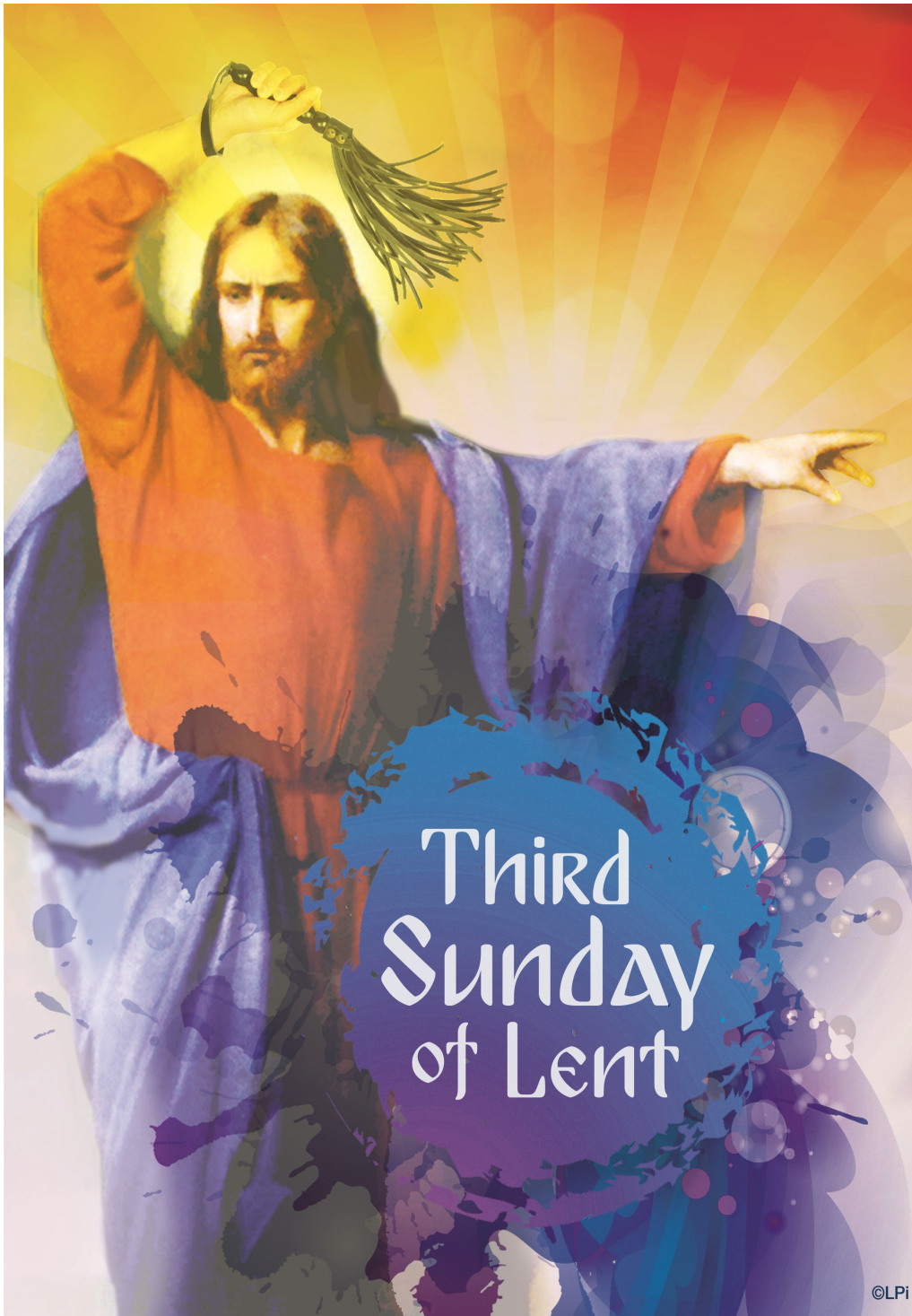

The Lenten Season: Reflection and Reconciliation Series Part 1 of 4

Lent is an intense moment of the Church's penitential practice. It is a time "particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works)." (Catechism of the Catholic Church no. 1438)

An important part of this season is reflecting to help align ourselves with Church teaching. While there are many pamphlets and apps to help you do this by examining your conscious, we would like to share an examination of conscious based on Catholic Social Teaching:



Over these next few weeks of Lent, we will highlight the different topics in this Examination. We start this week with this:

Questions to Examine Conscience in Light of Catholic Social Teaching

Call to Family, Community, and Participation

- Do I try to make positive contributions in my family and my community?
- Are my beliefs, attitudes, and choices such that they strengthen or undermine the institution of the family?
- Am I aware of problems facing my local community and involved in efforts to find solutions? Do I stay informed and make my voice heard when needed?
- Do I support the efforts of poor persons to work for change in their neighborhoods and communities?
- Do my attitudes and interactions empower or disempower others?

The Archdiocese and the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops is fostering a discussion of a Christian response to racism (<https://www.archspm.org/life-human-dignity/racism-response/>). Each week we will include a quote to help you reflect.

"The poverty experienced by many . . . communities has its roots in racist policies that continue to impede the ability of people to find affordable housing, meaningful work, adequate education, and social mobility." —Open Wide Our Hearts (from [Racism and Education](#), USCCB)

If you are interested in learning more about how Racial Healing connects with our Faith, the Social Justice council is planning another Faith and Racial Healing program in Summer 2021. Be on the lookout for more information.

3er Domingo de la Cuaresma

La lengua se pega al paladar a causa de la sed. Reflexione con esta frase en todas las generaciones de migrantes que han cruzado el desierto con poca agua. Algunos, incluso, han encontrado la muerte por falta de este precioso líquido. Buscan en medio del desierto un manantial para saciar la sed. Imagine el calor, el polvo y el sol que quema todo su cuerpo. Muchas de estas personas que cruzan la frontera tienen consuelo y esperanza en saber que el Señor Jesús sabe de esta sed abrazadora a causa del camino bajo el ardiente sol.



La Liturgia nos narra el encuentro de Jesús con la samaritana y describe acerca de la sed del Señor. Cansado por el camino y al bordo del pozo, se da este encuentro. "Dame de beber", le pide a la mujer (Juan 4:7). Jesús, también pide agua en la cruz, ya casi para morir. "Tengo sed" (Juan 19:28). Jesús, es el manantial de vida eterna. Pide de beber y él se da a sí mismo como fuente de vida. "Uno de los soldados le abrió el costado con la lanza, y al instante salió sangre y agua" (Juan 19:34). Jesús, desea darnos de beber a nosotros, en su infinita misericordia no quiere que tengamos sed. "Si conocieras el don de Dios, si supieras quién es el que te pide de beber, tú misma le pedirías agua viva y él te la daría" (Juan 4:10). Solo Dios puede saciar nuestra sed infinita. Todos los cristianos, por el bautismo, estamos comprometidos a dar de beber a nuestro prójimo por medio de actos de caridad y servicio. Al darnos a los demás alcanzaremos a beber del agua viva que es el Señor. Pronto los catecúmenos tomarán de esa agua viva que quita la sed para siempre. ©LP

Pastoral Care Ministry – Seeking Opportunities to Connect, Serve, and Support

The mission of the Pastoral Care Council (PCC) is to follow Christ who calls us to "serve those in need". A wide variety of ministries are under the PCC umbrella, including the BeFriends, Bereavement Ministry, Homebound/Offsite Communion, Dementia Friendly Parish, Marriage Preparation, Prayer Shawls, Prayer Line and volunteering at other charities such as Feed My Starving Children, Sharing and Caring Hands, Dorothy Day Center and The Family Service Center. Groups which typically met face-to-face, have adapted during COVID to virtual meetings. **If you are looking for a way to be involved in-person, volunteers are currently needed to help serve lunch at Sharing and Caring Hands on March 31st. This is an example of the type of opportunities to serve that the Pastoral Care ministry supports.**

The council coordinates collections or supports other parish groups in their collection of items in the bins located in the north entrance. Collections were suspended because of COVID during the spring and summer of 2020, but since fall, items have been collected for Union Gospel Mission, CCW's Appalachia Drive, Sharing and Caring Hands, Homeless Veterans, Bridging and Birthright of St. Paul (in lieu of CCW baby shower). In addition to our traditional Holy Thursday collection of soap and towels, the bins are available to collect these items throughout March.

The Pastoral Care ministry offers many ways to participate and make stewardship a way of life. Despite the pandemic, they have continued to live their mission.
