Please note: The first number in parenthesis following a vocabulary word indicates the approximate grade level at which the student should know the definition of the word while the following number indicates the page on which the word was found. (Word grade placement is per *EDL Core Vocabularies in Reading, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies, 1989.*)

The page number of a vocabulary word or the range of page numbers may not correspond to the published text of the book you are using. If that is the case, you will find the vocabulary word and/or the basis for the comprehension questions and answers on pages that are approximately the same as those used in creating this study guide.

And the answers to the comprehension questions are not always written in complete sentences. The answers have sometimes been made in shortened phrases which make the answers easier to find as well as limiting the space needed to give the answers.

- 1. What sound did Evan hear that made him stop throwing and catching the baseball? Pp. 1-2 The sound of his mother dragging the old AC across the kitchen floor to probably get it out of their kitchen.
- 2. Why wouldn't Evan answer Jessie when she called from the top of the stairs to the basement? Pp. 3-4 He was trying to avoid her. She came down and said it was supposed to be hot until Labor Day.
- **3.** What was Jessie trying to get Evan to agree to? Pp. 5-6 She wanted to know what they could do together today. He squashed every suggestion she suggested.
- 4. Why was Evan being so mean to Jessie? Pp. 7-8 At this point in the story, we don't know, but he hates himself for being mean to her. But he was angry and humiliated.
- **5. What did Evan say to Jessie to hurt her? Pp. 9-10** "I hate you. You ruined everything this summer, and now you'll ruin school."

- **3. What other time did Even had act like he hated Jesse? Pp. 15-16** He acted like he hated Jesse when he couldn't understand his math homework. Jesse did the problems for him instead of showing him how to do them.
- 4. While Jesses was good at math, what was one of her weaknesses? Pp. 17-18 She didn't understand people's feelings. She would rather do math problems.

- 6. When Jessie offered to bankroll Evan's and Scott's enterprise, what was Evan's answer? Pp. 21-22 Scott's mom was doing the bankrolling.
- 7. What did Scott say about Jesse being in fourth grade this next school year? Pp. 23-24 It was freaky. She was going to miss one whole year of her life. She would miss all her third grade fieldtrips and would die a whole year earlier.
- 8. What did Jesse finally realize about 4th grade and Evan? Pp. 25-26 He didn't like the idea. He wouldn't hang around with her. She wouldn't be part of the crowd with his help.
- 9. How would you feel if your smart little brother or sister was suddenly thrust into your class at school to be a classmate of yours?
