# CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

This activity will provide an interdisciplinary educational forum in which to provide updates on state-of-the-art science, discuss real-world cases, curate interesting pedigrees, and prepare case summaries to disseminate new knowledge in translational genomics and evidence-based clinical management of high-risk patients and their family members.
