

1- Fear of Saul, 2-actions speak louder than words, 3-my grape vines---Acts tells the story of the disciples fear of Saul who was a known advocate of hunting those who followed Christ. Saul, like the great ones, had a name change, needed advocates to say he was okay to be around, and to be taught the secret handshake of the icthus drawn in the sand. (one of the ways early followers knew it was safe to talk.) Words might inspire but they are empty without action. We all know it but lip service doesn't cut it. Action does. Love does in word and deed! My grape vines were frosted last week. John, the non-synoptic Gospel writer and Apostle, tells us Jesus reference to the vine and the branches. My vines are via my Dad who got them from Ft. de Chartres via France. I am not sure how many hundreds of years ago the cutting took place but they existed even before then. If Jesus is the Vine, and we are the branches, our actions as

Christians deserve a name change and we better look good on wood! Please pray for the Class of '21 who will head to DC this Sunday to overcome the fear that government cannot help the common good. You cannot legislate social justice. But you can come to believe that the idea of America is based upon providing opportunity for all and work does bring dignity. See you round the Table!
