Welcome 2021! I hope this year is a great one! Thank you to all those who have kept happy spirits throughout the pandemic and adjusted to precautions and limited events.

The community amenities are open but remain restricted to residents only. This means

guests are not allowed at the amenities regardless of their age, how far they traveled from, how long they are here, whether you accompany them, or whether anyone else is using the amenity. The guest restriction will remain throughout this season, and until further notice.

The annual assessment for the master association was due Jan. 1. Payments received after Jan. 15 are late. If your payment is not received by the 15th, you will receive a late notification statement (with an accompanying charge of \$30) and a late fee (of \$15). Please reach out to the Association Office if you still need a copy of your assessment statement, or to process a check payment through the office.

Each year a community directory is provided for the members of the Association. The directory is opt-in, meaning you will not automatically be added to the directory, but must instead submit a 'green sheet' Directory Form indicating you want to be included. New requests and changes need to be submitted to the Association Office no later than Jan. 29 to be included in this year's printing. Your 'green sheet' Directory Form will stay on file until you either move or submit a new form that will completely supersede the old green sheet.

There will be two open positions for the Board of Directors this year, each to serve a three-year term. Mid-January the candidates will be announced. We will be using electronic voting for the election, with paper ballots available in the Association Office. Ballots are limited to one per household. The results will be announced at the Annual Meeting of the Members on Feb. 23, 2021. The primary property owner's email address will receive the voting email.

Restrictions, Rules, and Regulations

As I near the end of my first year working here in the community, I would like to express how impressed I am with the residents who live in Sunland Springs Village, as well as the team from FirstService

Residential I get to work with. I am very fortunate to be here. It is important for each and everyone involved with the community, to act with empathy during this pandemic, and be aware of ourselves and our neighbors. The COVID numbers in the state continue to rise and it looks as though that may not change for a while. We ask that everyone do their part to reduce the spread of coronavirus, including following the posted precautions at the amenities. While we may not always agree with certain rules/regulations, they are put in place to protect us and provide peace and harmony for everyone in the community.

Guest Use Restricted: All amenities, whether indoor or outdoor, are currently restricted to Sunland Springs Village residents ONLY. Regardless of the age of your guests, how long they are here, or where they are coming from, at this time they may not utilize the amenities. The guest restriction applies 24/7, whether others are present or not. Please wear your community name tag when using the amenities.

Rentals: We acknowledge that due to the pandemic, a larger than usual number of residences are being rented out this year. Please know per your community documents, homeowners must submit a rental form to the HOA office prior to the lease beginning, the minimum lease length is 30 days, and all age restriction guidelines must be met. Golf Carts: It is illegal for children to operate a golf cart in Arizona. Arizona recognizes golf carts as motor vehicles, requires all drivers to have a valid driver's license, and limits the use of golf carts to roads with a speed of less than 35 miles per hour. If you choose to drive along any public roads, rather than simply crossing them from one golf area to another, all rules of the road apply, including insurance. You would not let an underage grandchild drive down the road in your car, so kindly refrain from letting them drive your golf cart.
