HIRING CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS

- The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) begins a new academy of Correctional Officers (CO) every six weeks.
- The current rate of attrition is approximately 1,700 annually, mostly due to retirement.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- **<u>21 years of age</u>** (20 at time of application)
- U.S. high school diploma/GED or equivalent
- U.S. citizen or applied for U.S. citizenship
- **No** felony convictions
- Legally eligible to possess/own a firearm

- 1. Written Test
- 2. Physical Fitness Test (PFT)
- 3. Personal History Statement (PHS), Computerized Voice Stress Analysis (CVSA) Exam, and Background Investigation
- 4. Written Psychological Exam (POPE) and Psychological Exam (Oral Psych.)
- 5. Pre-Employment Medical (PEM)
- 6. Appointment Certification (CERT) and Academy and Institution Assignment

CDCR'S BASIC CORRECTIONAL OFFICER ACADEMY (BCOA)


Assigned to a paid academy before reporting to institution
Located in Galt, CA (24 miles south of Sacramento)

CDCR'S BASIC CORRECTIONAL OFFICER ACADEMY (BCOA)

The BCOA offers cadets who reside over 30 miles (one way) from the Correctional Training Center (CTC), the option of living on-grounds, as well as off-grounds at the cadet's own expense.

• 13-week training courses in laws of arrest, search and seizure, firearms, chemical agents, and more.

• Each successful graduate from the academy will participate in a two-year apprenticeship program.

CORRECTIONAL OFFICER SALARY

- Academy pay: \$21.85 hourly
- Upon completion of academy pay: \$4,660 monthly
- 5% merit salary increase every six months for the first two years, once a year thereafter.
- Top Base Pay: \$7,782 monthly
 *Up to \$93,384 annually





INCENTIVE PAY

Physical Fitness pay (added to base pay): **\$130 monthly**

Educational Incentive pay: **\$100 - \$163 monthly** for 60 semester units (or the equivalent quarter units) from an accredited college or university

Bilingual Certification pay (when departmental need is identified): **\$100 monthly**

- Uniform Allowance: **\$546 to \$1,000** annually
- Weekend/Night Shift Differential pay: **\$.65 -\$.80** increase per hour
- Senior Peace Officer (Longevity) pay: **2%** -**9%** monthly salary increase after 17 years




