According to the Lily Foundation Clergy Renewal program, "Renewal periods are not vacations, but times for intentional exploration and reflection, for drinking again from God's life giving waters, for regaining enthusiasm and creativity for ministry. The renewal period is a time to engage in significant reflection, through reading, writing, and prayer, in order that the minister can understand his or her own vocation through renewed eyes."

In our commitment to Rev. Tatham as our minister, we have covenanted together to plan and implement a "renewal period" called Sabbatical. This summer Rev. Tatham will take Sabbatical from Friday, July 1 through Saturday, October 1.

Studies have shown that the Sabbatical experience is good for both pastor and congregation alike. Besides offering exciting venues and encounters with new experiences, a Sabbatical can provide both the congregation and the pastor a time for in-depth, refreshing reflection on all that makes us "church." Without the pressures of regular responsibilities, as well as phone, email, administrative and emergency duties, your pastor is freed to ponder deeply the words of poet E.A. Robinson: 'The world is... a kind of spiritual kindergarten where millions of bewildered infants are trying to spell God with the wrong blocks.' Over the past several years, NC4 has been pursuing its call to transformation, with the understanding that the world in which we live is evolving faster than any of us can keep up with. The technology we're called to use, the mission that's now right at our doorstep, the realization that the message we have to share is competing with a world-wide web of information and misinformation, all challenge us to think and to act in new ways.

During her Sabbatical, Rev. Tatham will be making visits to churches that have moved through the transformation process in order to explore the challenges and achievements experienced by others. She will also continue her research and exploration of how the arts can continue to enhance and enliven worship through the development of an artist-in-residence program. Also included in the Sabbatical time away will be visits to family and other travel opportunities.

The Sabbatical Committee comprised of Wilsonia Cherry, Sally Coberly, Yvonne McGee and Board Chair Nancy Longo have been working with Rev. Tatham to plan the Sabbatical, as well as engaging in the process of interviewing and selecting an Interim Sabbatical Minister. Following the March 1 Board Meeting, you will be introduced to the person selected to fill that role for the 3-month period.

We as a congregation, along with Rev. Tatham can experience this time of separation as a growing time, a time of mutual learning, reflection, increased creativity, and renewal. This time allows us to learn to listen together for God's new call to us. Where will we go next? What will our dreams be? How will we realize them? Who will help us move ahead? How can we be both truthful and hopeful about the future?

As we continue to plan toward and anticipate this time of renewal, we ask you to be in prayer for our congregation, for Rev. Tatham, and for that one who comes to be with us in the interim. Should you have an questions or concerns about the Sabbatical, please feel free to speak to one of the Sabbatical Committee Members or to Rev. Tatham.

Thursday, March 24, Noon & 7:30 p.m. Memorial Chapel & Sanctuary

On **Thursday, March 24, at both noon and 7:30 p.m.,** our Elders will host a Maundy Thursday service.

The journey into Holy Week is one in which the Church opens itself up to reflecting on a full range of emotions – from the rowdy celebration of Palm Sunday through the disappointment of Christ praying in Gethsemane, the trauma and grimness of Good Friday and into the incredulous joy, fear, and amazement of meeting a risen Jesus on Easter Sunday.

The **NOON service** will take place in our Memorial Chapel, an intimate setting for a contemplative service of meditation and communion, remembering the Last Supper Jesus had with his disciples.

The **7:30pm evening Maundy Thursday service** is designed to take a journey back into Lent and then on to Good Friday. You will have a chance to move through six stations for moments of reflection and meditation. You may move through the stations in any order. Once everyone has had the opportunity to share in the stations, we will together reflect on the art and the readings, and the service will culminate with communion.

We hope that you will make this meaningful service a part of your Lenten observance this year.
